Everyday Metanoia



Today is the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time. I have been absent from the bulletin for a couple of weeks. I am very human, so the weather, my personal life and some burn out after the holidays all played into the need to recharge and to regroup. We all go through this, but as a culture in the United States and even many other countries, we value people not so much as relational partners, but as cogs in the great wheel of production. Which makes Jesus' invitation to Simon and Andrew such a great opportunity for reflection and prayer this week, "Come after me and I will make you fishers of men."

In the times of Jesus, it would have been next to impossible for persons of the poor, working class to be seen as leaders; individuals who would have the power and authority to gather others around and exert power over them. And yet Jesus, a poor working class person, was calling others of the same class or even lower, and telling them that they would become influential in the lives of others. While we are more familiar with the "rags to riches" story than at the time of Jesus, it is still a very fantastical idea in our world and culture today. In fact, it is so fantastical that we have built a whole marketing theme around it which invites and encourages individuals to be a slave to work and production and call it the "American Dream."

This is not what Jesus was talking about at all. He wasn't calling the apostles to positions of power, he was calling them to positions of relationships. Jesus broke into our world to restore the human value and dignity of relationships, beginning with and foremost with God, the Father.

As we draw ever closer to the Season of Lent, I invite all of us to take a few minutes each day to ponder the word "relationship" and to pray over it. Ask questions of yourself in communication with God that require more than yes or no answers. For example, instead of "do I have a relationship with God?"; ask "what is my relationship with God?" or "what does my journey look like?" Explore the various relationships in your life. What qualities of those relationships lead you to "value" some more than others? How does this color or influence the relationship we have with God?

Many factors have played into the transition of our culture from personal to impersonal: the industrial revolution; the wars; the explosion of technology, and even, the very recent pandemic. In today's reading, what does it mean for each of us when Jesus says, "Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men." What qualities do we have that Jesus has identified that leads Him to make that invitation to us? Now is not the time to be overly egotistical nor to be so self deprecating that you deny the very real gifts that God has given. Prayer is the key to this one.

Beginning next weekend, we will celebrate Catholic Schools Week. The students have chosen a theme and a hope for the week: Be Kind. Adults may think this is just a cutesy catch phrase for the week, but I assure you that the students are very serious about their invitation to all of us: Be Kind. Isn't this where relationships begin, what feeds them and what nurtures them? Could it be that simple? In our culture today, I feel that being kind is anything but simple. Jesus calls us; he called his apostles to be fishers of men; to care more about the person than what they can do for us. And isn't that all built on the foundation of love and kindness?

And so, I invite you to attend Mass this weekend (and then the next and the next...) If you know someone who has been absent, invite them to join you! Praying with you always.

Family Ministry

January 21, 2024 • 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time • Mark 1:14-20

Fishers of Men

Jesus encounters Andrew and Peter by the sea, fishing for their livelihood. He invites them to become his first apostles. As Jesus travels further on the beach, he sees James and John, the sons of Zebedee, and invites them to drop their nets and join him.

Before Jesus begins his public ministry he gathers a group of men to walk with him. He understands that he will need support and even encouragement if he is to accomplish his mission. Jesus realizes how big the job was going to be, and he knew he would need help if he wanted his message to reach as many people as possible.

It was the disciples who seemed to do most of the negotiating for the everyday necessities (a place to stay, food for the crowds, etc.). There is a great lesson in this Gospel for all of us. If even Jesus needed people to nurture and encourage him, consider how important the support of a loving community is for us, and our children. Staying committed to Christian values is not always easy in today's society. This is why it is essential to surround your children and yourself with people who share your values.

Christians are not theists. We do not believe in a "me and God" approach to religion. We are Christians; we find God all around us, especially in other people. A faith community is essential for Christians. Become involved in your church, get to know people socially so your children have other role models to look up to.

Our children also need to see that Mom or Dad sometimes needs help. Parents make mistakes and messes that have to be fixed or cleaned up too. Children need to see that even their parents, on occasion, need their help. All of this is part of teaching our children to be interdependent, a crucial learning if they are going to understand what it means to be a Christian.

FAMILY RESPONSE

Discuss who the people are who support and nurture your family. Decide on a way to thank them.

PERSONAL RESPONSE

Outside of your immediate family, what group of people is your greatest support? How can they help you? What do you want to remember from last week? What are you looking forward to next week? What are your concerns?
