

Everyday Metanoia



Today's Gospel reading builds upon and echoes last week's message on how we are to love and support one another.

In 1 John we read, "Children, let us love not in word or speech but in deed and truth...And his commandment is this: we should believe in the name of his Son, Jesus Christ, and love one another just as he commanded us. Those who keep his commandments remain in him, and he the way we know that he remains in us is from the Spirit he gave us."

Through the resource, James, First, Second and Third John by Kelly Anderson and Daniel Keating we learn that the author of 1 John is writing to a community in crisis that has resulted due to a "division in the church. And [its members] are in need of an encouragement that both clarified the truth and fortified the heart." Anderson and Keating identify four points of importance within 1 John directed to the remaining Christian community: 1) that Christ is fully God and fully human (those who departed were denying his humanity); 2) that even as Christ died for our sins to restore our salvation with God, we are still human and we remain sinners (those who departed claimed they could no longer sin); 3) that we, as sinners, need to obey God's commandments as they provide the foundation for Christian living and the strength for resisting sin (those who departed failed to keep God's commandments); and 4) that Jesus is all about loving and supporting each other (those who departed might have been saying the words, but their deeds and actions did not support that love of neighbor as one self.)

What really got my attention as I continued to read from this resource is the emphasis the authors credited to the author of 1 John on the importance of love. As it was in the time period of the early church, we can imagine that there were many voices as the church tried to understand and "define" Jesus and what his life, death and resurrection meant for a Christian life of faith in God. One could easily understand that the primary importance may have been placed on the theological teachings that were being debated and formed. But, as important as that was, what is proclaimed most important in 1 John is love in word and deed, through loving your neighbor as you would want to be loved. As Father Jack would say, this is a good place to focus your time in prayer for the week.

And with that radical thought in mind, I invite you to attend Mass this weekend (and then the next and the next...) Call upon the power of the Holy Spirit that we may all reorient our hearts not to rules and regulations, but to love of oneself and love of neighbor through both words and deeds.

The Vine and Branches

Jesus uses another image in this Gospel to explain his relationship to us. He is the vine and we are its branches. Just as a branch can not survive apart from the vine, we have no life apart from God. Jesus is the vine that provides that life to us.

This reading gives us a clear picture of who we are as Christians and what is expected of us. When Jesus tells us, "I am the vine, you are the branches," he offers us a strong metaphor regarding our relationship to him. Indeed, we will know how strong that relationship is by the fruit we bear.

And what fruit do we look for in a Christian's life? Certainly not the same rewards and benefits offered in the secular world. We don't count money, possessions or position as fruit on Jesus' vine. The blossoms and fruit on Jesus' vine reflect the life force that feeds it. The product of Jesus' vine is the reproduction of his lifegiving love in kind acts, healing actions and our own loving relationships.

This is an important message to hand on to our children. Christians have a different gauge to judge success. It is not how much we have that marks us as a winner; it is how much we love. We are the branches and Jesus is the vine, and as long as we stay connected to Jesus, his courage, his strength, his love will flow through us.

Like all healthy fruit, our actions and relationships will bear their own seeds and new vines will grow and the branches will multiply. Jesus wants us to know that he is our life force, and with him we are strong enough to overcome anything and accomplish everything.
