You Are Cordially Invited...



Welcome to the Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time. There is much to unpack from today's readings! The Old Testament reading from 1 Kings helps me to recenter every time I read it. There are so many voices in our world today. Most of the time, it is the loudest and flashiest ones to which we give our rapt attention: the news, emails, Facebook, TikTok, Instagram, and many more - they all clamor for our attention, our time, our money, our soul. Many have allowed these to become gods and relinquished the power to discern through prayer to the unending

stream of information, opinions, and incitements to action of these sites. Some of what is proclaimed can be for good. The challenge is when we allow the tiny whispering sound of God to be overpowered by the strong, heavy winds and the earthquakes of other communication. This is a time of much activity in the Church and in our church, All Saints. The synodal process continues worldwide under the prayerful guidance and encouragement of Pope Francis. There is another assembly scheduled for October. As Pope Francis has stated many times, these are not learning sessions nor are they sessions meant to formulate further doctrine - they are listening sessions. A time to sit down with companions and strangers alike and to listen for the whispering voice of God in the conversation. This Fall, the leadership bodies of All Saints will be listening to various committees as we determine if our local Catholic schools would better serve our students and parents if we became a system. These same leadership bodies will be sharing the Parish Vitality results that came from many sessions of listening to the hopes, dreams and concerns of our parish. God has to remind me at times that I cannot be a good listener when I am doing most of the talking (LOL!) In the Gospels, Jesus was frequently heard to say, "Those who have ears should listen." With that in mind, I invite all of us to allow silence and listening to be a more focused part of these dialogues. What tiny whispering sound might we hear if instead of interjecting, we listen?

The Old Testament reading is about silence and the Gospel addresses trust and fear. How do these themes go together? About 5-10 years ago in the business world, the word "synergistic" was the talk of the town. According to Webster, synergy is "the interaction of elements that when combined produce a total effect that is greater than the sum of the individual elements." An example would be that rather than moving a product down the pipeline through research and development to manufacturing to marketing and then to sales, a company would create a team with players from all those areas. What happened many times is that products often came out better and faster with the team able to address challenges or provide constructive criticism throughout the process as it happened rather than the one step forward, two steps backwards that often resulted from the pipeline or assembly line model from before. The total effect of the individuals working together in real time was more impactful on the life of the business than when they worked independently of one another. So it is for me with the themes of fear, silence and trust. When these three are present in my life independently of one another, my life becomes chaotic, turbulent like crashing waves, and noisy. I call out to God for help, but I keep looking at everything else other than God and I begin to sink. Even when I am caught up in high drama worthy of a Hollywood movie or Broadway play, if I am silent and listen for the whisper, I can feel myself relax and with trust, take the step onto the water. Rather than denying the fear or running from it, I allow God to enter into the midst of it through prayer and silence and am blessed with much as I move and respond in trust.

And so, I invite you to Mass (and then the next and the next...) If you know someone who has been absent or who is seeking God to come into their life, invite them to join you! One small act this week - listen more than we talk. I invite you to share some of your insights from this. Love God - Serve Others - Form Disciples. Praying and hoping with you always.

Dubuque, Iowa – Pope Francis has appointed Most Reverend Thomas R. Zinkula, Bishop of Davenport, as Archbishop of Dubuque. Archbishop-elect Zinkula is scheduled to be installed as the archdiocese's eleventh archbishop on Wednesday, October 18.

Archbishop-electZinkula reflected upon his appointment to Dubuque in a statement, saying, "Although I will be sad to leave the Diocese of Davenport in a couple of months, where the diocesan community taught me how to be a bishop and we walked together on our common faith journey, I am humbled and overjoyed to receive the appointment to return to my home diocese to serve as the eleventh archbishop of the Archdiocese of Dubuque."

Be Not Afraid

Jesus retires to a quiet spot to pray. His disciples return to the boat and set out on a very rough sea. At the fourth watch of the night, the disciples see Jesus approaching the boat, walking on the water. They are terrified, thinking they are seeing a ghost. Peter wants to show Jesus his great faith. He starts to walk on the water himself, but he begins to sink.

Peter hears Jesus telling him and his friends to have faith and not to be afraid. It is a message Jesus has delivered over and over. What a wonderful gift to give your children: faith that can overcome any fear! Unfortunately, you can't gift wrap it or let them swallow it like a vitamin. What you can hand on to your children, though, is the story of faith, giving them a glorious sense of power and worth by making sure they understand their part in that story. If I had to tell this story in a hundred words or less, this is what I would say:

When God made the world he had a plan— everything and everyone together in peace and harmony. Right from the beginning, we messed up, but God stayed with us. He sent prophets to call us back. Finally, God sent his own son, Jesus, who lived the plan with every breath he took. Jesus shared his life with everyone he touched. He died and rose again to share that life with us. We are God's children, and God will give us whatever we need so that we can work together to make the plan of God happen.

That's who we are. We have God with us and in us. We've got important things to do. We have to take the love and life Jesus shares with us to everyone we meet. We are part of God's plan. Sometimes it can be scary to step out, but when we remember who we are, we won't let fear stop us.

FAMILY RESPONSE

Read the hundred-word story about God's plan for your children. Ask them to help you describe what the world would be like if you lived the plan of God. Have everyone mention one way he or she can make the plan of God happen.

PERSONAL RESPONSE

How can you make your home environment look more closely like the plan of God? What do you want to remember from last week? What are you looking forward to next week? What are your concerns?
