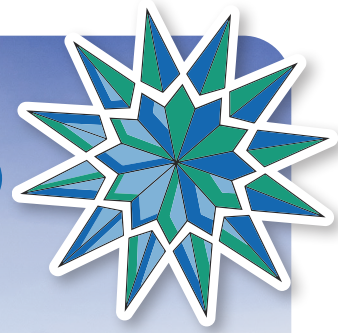

# You Are Cordially Invited...



Welcome to the Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time. Of all that I learn from Jesus' interactions with people in the Gospel accounts, the ones that impact me the most are his interactions with women. Even though women were considered property in the time of Jesus, I firmly believe Mary planted some seeds as Jesus was growing up that challenged this viewpoint. Like the Canaanite woman in today's reading, many of the women we encounter in the Gospel expanded Jesus' lens of the world and his mission on Earth. The results were often life changing.

Mary starts in all off when she invites her son to perform the first miracle - turning water into wine. Jesus pushes back, but Mary gently perseveres (as only a mother can!) Instead of arguing, she simply tells the servants to do whatever Jesus tells them to do. Then there is the conversation Jesus has at the well with a Samaritan woman. They challenge each other during the exchange, but as she allows Jesus into the story of her life, she finds acceptance and agape love that heals and gives her hope and joy. In today's Gospel, we hear the story of how a Canaanite woman's faith in Jesus continued to open the door wider for God's salvation to be inclusive of others outside of the Jewish faith.

As we have no written account of Jesus' life between ages 12 and 30ish , we don't know if God's revelation to Jesus was gradual or instantaneous. Or perhaps the knowledge was all there from the beginning, but Jesus' humanity gradually came to understand his Divine nature and mission. Either way, the themes of love and acceptance shine through in all of the stories with Jesus and women. Each of these women is bold enough to bring her story to Jesus. And the gift they receive in exchange is life changing. Do we follow these Gospel examples? Do we boldly bring our stories to the Lord? Do we allow Him to bring life changing love, acceptance and healing to our lives? Do we boldly share that gift with our brothers and sisters, no matter what their faith tradition or even if they have no faith?

Pope Francis encourages us to humbly, yet fully, share our lives with the Lord: "Each one of us has our own story, a story that is often difficult, filled with pain, misfortunes, and sins. What do I do with my story? Do I hide it? No, we must bring it to the Lord with the prayer, 'Lord, if You will it, You can heal me.' This is what this woman teaches us, this wonderful mother: the courage to bring our own painful story before God, before Jesus, to touch God's tenderness, Jesus's tenderness. This Gospel episode also helps us to understand that we all need to grow in faith and fortify our trust in Jesus. He can help us to find our way, when we have lost the compass of our journey; when the road no longer seems flat but rough and arduous; when it is hard to be faithful to our commitments. It is important to nourish our faith every day, by carefully listening to the Word of God, with the celebration of the Sacraments, with personal prayer as a "cry" to him - 'Lord, help me!' - and with concrete acts of charity toward our neighbor."

And so, I invite you to Mass (and then the next and the next...) If you know someone who has been absent or who is seeking God to come into their life, invite them to join you! One small act this week - even if you don't feel that you need it, ask for help with something. As God often said of the Israelites - we are a stiff-necked people. Let one feather of pride float away this week and at Mass, bring our story to the Lord. **Love God - Serve Others - Form Disciples.** Praying and hoping with you always.

## Announcing Archbishop-elect Zinkula



Dubuque, Iowa – Pope Francis has appointed Most Reverend Thomas R. Zinkula, Bishop of Davenport, as Archbishop of Dubuque. Archbishop-elect Zinkula is scheduled to be installed as the archdiocese's eleventh archbishop on Wednesday, October 18.

Archbishop-elect Zinkula reflected upon his appointment to Dubuque in a statement, saying, "Although I will be sad to leave the Diocese of Davenport in a couple of months, where the diocesan community taught me how to be a bishop and we walked together on our common faith journey, I am humbled and overjoyed to receive the appointment to return to my home diocese to serve as the eleventh archbishop of the Archdiocese of Dubuque."

## Taking A Stand

*A Canaanite woman seeks Jesus out and asks him to cure her daughter. Jesus tells her he has come to serve only the house of David, but she persists in asking for help. Finally, Jesus relents and the daughter is healed.*

I love the story of the Canaanite woman. She is feisty and determined. She doesn't take no for an answer, even from Jesus, the miracle worker. I wonder if she would have been that demanding if she was asking for herself and not her daughter? I have spent almost a lifetime watching friends become lionesses in defense of loved ones, and lambs when they are the victims. I have seen them, metaphorically speaking, leap tall buildings in a single bound for a child, and take only baby steps on their own behalf. I remember a friend who still couldn't get angry with her husband even two years after he left her, become livid with rage when her son-in-law left her daughter.

I think there is a simple reason for this discrepancy. We don't hold ourselves in the same esteem we hold those we cherish. We don't see ourselves as worthy of love, honor, respect, and attention as our children. In other words, we don't see ourselves as God sees us. We've certainly been told often enough that we are God's much-loved child. We just don't believe it.

Perhaps if we took the words of the great commandment, "love your neighbor as yourself," and changed them a bit it might sink in. If we were to say, "Love yourself as you love your daughter or son," we might begin to have an inkling of God's love for us. We might even realize that we are as precious to God as our own children are to us.

## FAMILY RESPONSE

Ask each person in the family to talk about a time he or she stood up for him- or herself or wished he or she had.

## PERSONAL RESPONSE

Has there ever a time when you did not stand up for yourself as much as you would for a loved one? What could you have done? What do you want to remember from last week? What are you looking forward to next week? What are your concerns?
