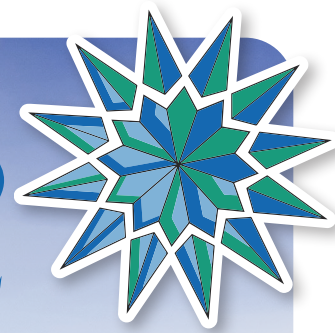
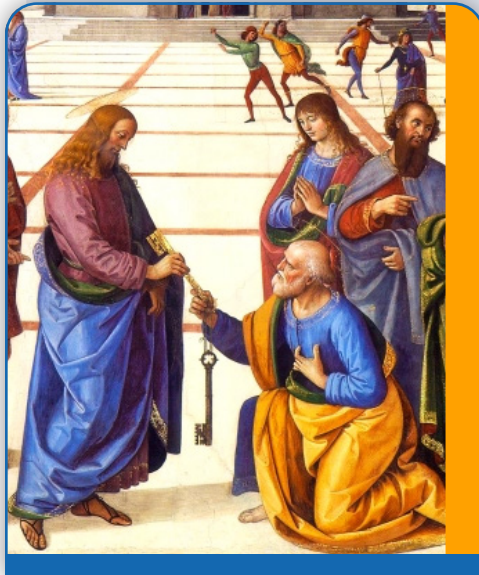

Cedar Rapids Metro Area Divorce Ministry

You Are Cordially Invited...



Welcome to the Twenty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time. Having named Simon Peter last week as the rock upon which the foundation of the church will be built, Jesus now turns to the final leg of the journey of which our salvation will be born. Oh what a turn of the tide as Matthew marks the end of Jesus' ministry in Galilee to the beginning of his march to Jerusalem. Simon Peter experiences his own turn of the tide as we are witnesses to his shift from being on top of the world to the bottom as he humanly responds to the distressing news that Jesus shares. How many times have we all gone through this cycle (or as I like to call it - the roller coaster of life!) One minute, people like us, we feel God's favor and perhaps act like we can do no wrong. And in the tick of the second hand, it all comes crashing down around us.

As we ponder today's reading, let's put ourselves into Peter's shoes. It is not clear if Peter's statement of denial is coming from a place of love for Jesus or a place of self-centeredness. Do we hear the words, "No Jesus - this can't happen to you. I can't bear to think of this happening to you" or do we hear the words, "No Jesus - this can't happen to you, what will happen to me?" Perhaps a little of both. When a loved one shares distressing news with us, do we deny what is happening out of love because we don't want to see them suffer or do we think in the back of our mind, "How will this impact my life?" Probably a little of both. In acknowledging this, it helps us to understand Peter a little better. Our Catholic faith tradition mirrors this. It is not either/or; it is both/and. It celebrates and unites themes that seemingly do not fit together: grace and nature; faith and reason; Scripture and tradition; body and soul. These opposing energies should tear each other apart and yet in our Catholic faith tradition, the tension within the contradictions is exactly what binds them together.

Jesus' discussion with the disciples further highlights this dance of contradictions, "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross and follow me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will find it." Bernard Tickerhoof, in his book *Paradox: The Spiritual Path to Transformation*, examines the mystery of paradox through many lenses. It is paradox itself that a poem by St. Bonaventure and an examination of theories in modern science could co-exist in the same book and propose a similar conclusion. "In a poetic passage from *The Soul's Journey into God*, Bonaventure proclaims: For if an image is an expressed likeness, when our mind contemplates in Christ the Son of God, who is the image of the invisible God by nature, our humanity so wonderfully exalted, so ineffably united, when at the same time it sees united the first and the last, the highest and the lowest, the circumference and the center, the Alpha and Omega, the caused and the cause, the Creator and the creature, that is, the book written within and without, it now reaches something perfect." Fast forward to modern day science and Tickerhoof says, "Chaos theory has presented us with a formidable paradox. In the Bible, order and disorder are the first things dealt with in creation, and in a simplistic theological framework it is generally felt that one is good and one is bad. But in science, and in the complexities of pastoral experience, order and disorder take on dynamic tension...Linear thinking demands we see things as separate states: one needs to be normal, the other exceptional. Yet there is a way to see this ballet of chaos and order, of change and stability, as two complementary aspects of the process of growth, neither of which is primary." Not either/or but rather, both/and. As Peter and the disciples continue to grow in their faith and understanding of Jesus' mission here on earth, Jesus does not view them as either clueless or profound. He knows that there will be both steps forward and steps backwards. And so it is as we continue to form ourselves as disciples of Christ. There will be both times of great growth and understanding and there will also be times of stagnancy and even stepping away. It is all part of the paradox of trying to build and live God's kingdom here on earth.

And so, I invite you to Mass (and then the next and the next...) If you know someone who has been absent or who is seeking God to come into their life, invite them to join you! **Love God - Serve Others - Form Disciples.** Praying and hoping with you always.

Announcing Archbishop-elect Zinkula



Dubuque, Iowa – Pope Francis has appointed Most Reverend Thomas R. Zinkula, Bishop of Davenport, as Archbishop of Dubuque. Archbishop-elect Zinkula is scheduled to be installed as the archdiocese's eleventh archbishop on Wednesday, October 18.

Archbishop-elect Zinkula reflected upon his appointment to Dubuque in a statement, saying, "Although I will be sad to leave the Diocese of Davenport in a couple of months, where the diocesan community taught me how to be a bishop and we walked together on our common faith journey, I am humbled and overjoyed to receive the appointment to return to my home diocese to serve as the eleventh archbishop of the Archdiocese of Dubuque."

Setting Your Mind on God

Jesus tells his disciples he will have to go to Jerusalem to suffer and die. Peter takes Jesus aside and tells him he doesn't have to go through with it. Jesus rebukes him.

God's ways are not always the accepted way of the culture in which we live. Probably our most difficult job as Catholic parents is to instill in our children a value system based on the Gospels rather than the society that surrounds them.

Our children are bombarded constantly with the values of a secular society that prizes possessions and position over just about everything else. The commercial world of social media, magazines, and Amazon teaches them to want more and more, while the competitive worlds of academics and athletic teach them the importance of being number one. We adults can get trapped on this treadmill ourselves wanting a bigger and better car or home, the newest technological gadgets, or pushing ourselves to be the top salesperson or youngest VP in the company.

Jesus tells us to think as God thinks and to see things from God's perspective, not our own. God sees things outside of time. He sees that the treadmill of wanting more and more only gets us to the nowhere of never having enough. God sees globally: for every winner there are thousands of losers, for every rich person there are millions of poor.

We have to help our children trust in God's promise to provide all that they need. We have to help them see that God has a vested interest in each of them becoming their own personal best, not "better than" anyone else. This is definitely one of those lessons our children need to see us witness. It can't become just another sermon. We lose all credibility if we preach it without living it ourselves.

FAMILY RESPONSE

As a family, decide in what areas you have plenty. Choose a charity that can benefit from your bounty.

PERSONAL RESPONSE

Are there areas in your life where you are trapped on the treadmill of having to have more and more? How can you begin to change the situation? What do you want to remember from last week? What are you looking forward to next week? What are your concerns?
