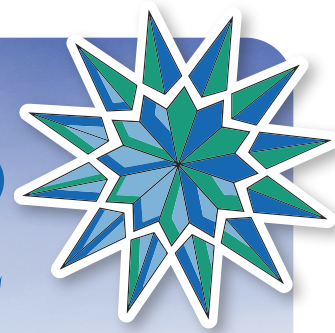

Relics of St. Jude, known as the Apostle of the Impossible, coming to West Des Moines

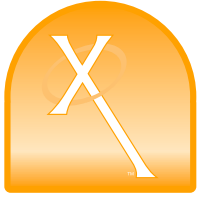

Congratulations All Saints Parish!

Last fall the Xavier Foundation partnered with All Saints Parish to raise funds for the Xavier Impact Fund. Together with the 10 parishes that make up the Cedar Rapids-metro Catholic community, we raised an amazing \$557,021 to support Catholic education at Xavier High School. Thanks to your hard work and generosity, All Saints surpassed the parish goal of \$72,000. Congratulations!

As promised, all monies received over this goal were given directly back to the parish to use as the parish wishes. We are happy to announce that on September 15, a check for \$10,990 was presented back to the parish from the Xavier Foundation.

All Saints Parish went above and beyond! Thanks to the generosity of your parishioners, our PK-12 Xavier Catholic School teachers will benefit from a six percent salary increase.

Next weekend is the next push for the 2023-24 Parish Appeal. We look forward to raising \$1 million for teacher salaries.



Many have asked about Education Savings Accounts (ESA's) and the STO



Will Education Savings Accounts Affect the STO?

With the establishment of Educational Savings Accounts (ESA), many have asked if this signals the end of Student Tuition Organizations (STO's) and Iowa's 75% tax credits?

The answer is “NO”, and in fact, the STO has a huge role to play in the future of Catholic education.

- 1) Our Faith STO served **more students** in the current 2023-24 school year than in any other year, even with the ESA's.
- 2) \$5.6 million in tuition assistance helped 3133 students attend the school of their choice this year. This represents more than 36% of the enrollment at our Archdiocesan schools and St. Paul's in Waverly.
- 3) When we hit our fundraising goal this year, \$6.38 million in tuition assistance will be available for the 2024-25 school term.

Did You Know Our Faith STO Accepts Grain Gifts?

You Are Cordially Invited...



Welcome to the Twenty-fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time. The Gospel reading for this week challenges our human understanding of justice and fairness versus God's bountiful gifts of the same.

One of the many reasons that I love Jesus' parables is that they function on many levels. I feel that most can take away a "lesson" no matter where they are at on the faith journey. What shines through in this Gospel is that God's mercy revealed through His blessings and gifts are so much larger than our human understanding can comprehend. If you have worked for an hourly rate in your life, the understanding was that you are paid for the amount of time you work. The landowner in the parable (God) is totally different. Not only does he pay those who worked the least first, but he pays them the same as those who had worked all day. The workers who were there all day remind me of the older son in the parable of the prodigal son - grumbling because they thought they deserved more and upset by the generosity of another.

We hurt ourselves, each other and God the moment our mind slides from appreciation and gratitude to entitlement. Stewardship reminds us that we own nothing; everything we have is due to God's grace and mercy. Entitlement hardens the heart, deafens the ears, narrow the vision and shrinks the mind. Thanking God and each other with gratitude softens the heart, opens the ears, widens the vision and enlarges the mind. Pope Francis reminds us, "Above all, let us not forget to thank: if we are bearers of gratitude, the world itself will become better, even if only a little bit, but that is enough to transmit a bit of hope. The world needs hope. And with gratitude, with this habit of saying thank you, we transmit a bit of hope. Everything is united and everything is connected, and everyone needs to do his or her part wherever we are." It goes beyond gratitude, though. God's way is for us to celebrate His gifts of mercy whether we think they benefit us or someone else. For when we do this, we start to see the many blessings in our own lives that were not visible to us before. Recently a person shared with me, that after many years, they had come to the realization that the more they gave away; the more they blessed others, then the more they received. A very good thought to take to prayer this week.

And so, I invite you to Mass (and then the next and the next...) If you know someone who has been absent or who is seeking God to come into their life, invite them to join you! ***Love God - Serve Others - Form Disciples.*** Praying and hoping with you always.

Announcing Archbishop-elect Zinkula



Dubuque, Iowa – Pope Francis has appointed Most Reverend Thomas R. Zinkula, Bishop of Davenport, as Archbishop of Dubuque. Archbishop-elect Zinkula is scheduled to be installed as the archdiocese's eleventh archbishop on Wednesday, October 18.

Archbishop-elect Zinkula reflected upon his appointment to Dubuque in a statement, saying, "Although I will be sad to leave the Diocese of Davenport in a couple of months, where the diocesan community taught me how to be a bishop and we walked together on our common faith journey, I am humbled and overjoyed to receive the appointment to return to my home diocese to serve as the eleventh archbishop of the Archdiocese of Dubuque."

Generosity

Jesus balances last week's parable about the justice of God with this week's story about God's generosity. The parable is about a landowner who goes out to hire workers for his fields. Some people are hired early in the day; others are hired to work only the last hour. At the end of the day, all are paid the same. Those who worked the whole day are upset.

In all honesty, this Gospel story always caused me concern. I found myself on the side of the workers who had labored all day. When I listened to my inner voice, I sounded like a four-year-old, "That's not fair!" Then one Sunday a priest told a story in his homily that helped me understand the parable a little better. I'll share it with you.

A middle-aged husband and wife both die, and find themselves surrounded by a large crowd standing in front of the pearly gates. An angel behind the gates tells the crowd that the gates to heaven will be opened at any moment, and eternal judgment will begin.

The husband gets more and more agitated as time passes and as he looks around at the crowd. "Good grief," he tells his wife, "there's George Walton, one of the biggest frauds in the state. What is he doing here in front of heaven's gates? Does he honestly think he has a chance of making it in?" "Oh no," he continues, "there's the assassin Oswald. And is that Adolph Hitler in the corner there waiting to be let in? This is ludicrous," he continues, "Those three should be sweltering in hell. What is God thinking of letting them even near the gates to heaven and close to good folks like us?"

At that moment, the man hears the booming voice of God telling him he has just passed judgment on himself, and he has failed. In questioning God's love and generosity, he has shown his own lack of both. He was refused entrance through the pearly gates.

Jesus is clear in the parable of the landowner that God's love and generosity is not to be questioned. We are all on the receiving end of what was promised. God's generosity is something to celebrate, even if we are not the ones on the receiving end at that particular moment.
