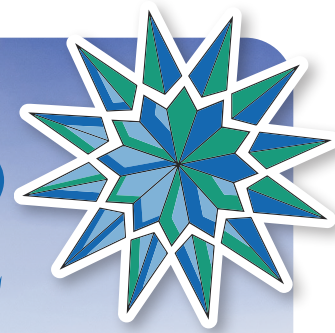

Metro Catholic Outreach



In addition to our food pantry, MCO has been providing financial assistance for rent and utilities to our Metro area for over eleven years. In the last four years, we have been blessed to assist **1,227** families!

The funding provided by you, our parishes, and private donors has been essential in allowing us to assist with over **\$530,120** towards people avoiding homelessness in *just the last four years!*

These clients each have their own story as to why they needed help -- unexpected medical bills, job loss, illness, family tragedies, vehicle issues, deaths, and domestic violence, to name just a few.

The vast majority of our clients are working, but sometimes just need a little more help to make ends meet. Just this week, our volunteer who met with five different clients over the course of a single afternoon was overwhelmed by the situations and stories they shared. We all needed to process with each other and pray for them after what we heard.

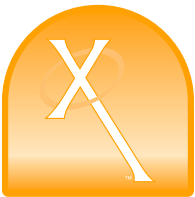

You Are Cordially Invited...



Welcome to the Twenty-sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time. The readings for this week continue the discussion on our human understanding of what is “fair” and God’s bountiful gift of mercy .

As I reflect on the Old Testament reading, I have to wonder at the strength of God. He must frequently feel that we do not rise much above the level of preschool behavior. Recently, I have had to set a boundary between social media and myself. Much of what I was reading in the news and from a variety of other sources was the same as our reading from Ezekial: that’s not fair; they are cheating; I am entitled to have my own way. Like Ezekial, I thought I was looking at these with a healthy, skeptical eye, “Is it my way that is unfair, or rather, are not your ways unfair?” I discovered, though, that despite this effort, an unhealthy amount of an entitled attitude crept into my heart and I found myself donning the glasses of the victim. God held up a mirror to my heart and I didn’t like what I was seeing. Paul comes to the rescue with a cure for this, “Do nothing out of selfishness or out of vainglory; rather, humbly regard others as more important than yourselves, each looking out not for his own interests, but also for those of others.” Jesus is the example of humility that Paul exhorts us to follow.

As we enter into the month of October, I would like to challenge each of us to come to a new understanding of true humility. In a morning homily, Pope Francis shared these thoughts, “Humility is becoming a lost virtue in the modern world. Our digital technology seems to make us think about ourselves all the time. But C.S. Lewis reminds us: “True humility is not thinking less of yourself; it is thinking of yourself less.” Humility disappears because we are so focused on ourselves that we forget to think about others. We forget that we are as imperfect as everyone around us. Each of us makes mistakes, some hurtful, some which only embarrass us. But we have forgotten the beauty that issues from reacting with sincere contrition or simple laughter rather than self-righteous offense. More, we have lost the joy that comes from caring genuinely about others more than about ourselves.”

All Saints is just an empty shell of a building without her parishioners. We need each and everyone of us to attend Mass on the weekends (daily if you are able), contribute in whatever way possible to the financial health of our parish and get involved in the various ministries and committees that support All Saints and help us to live out our mission statement to Love God - Serve Others - Form Disciples. Did you know that we have a Parish Life Committee that humbly serves us to create fun community-based activities? Did you know that the Young at Heart noon luncheons have resumed? Did you know that we need more liturgical ministers (hospitality, cantors, Eucharist ministers, sacristans, lectors and Altar servers) to support our weekend Masses? Did you know that we have a Funeral Luncheon committee that graciously assists families after the funeral liturgy? Did you know that our Stewardship, Liturgy, Social Justice, Haiti, Faith Formation and Parish Plant committees are all seeking additional members to assist in making our parish strong and vibrant? These are just a sample of the many opportunities to lend your God given gifts to All Saints. Opportunities are also available in our community.

Many of us hold back because we feel unworthy. God understands this. He has created us in His image, though, and the Holy Spirit is always available for strength. This week, rather than just saying, yes to God, but then never getting around to it like the second son in the Gospel, let’s be more like the first son, who initially said no, but then went to do the work. Jesus is not focused on the initial response or the reason for it, he is focused on the outcome. God, too, is not focused on our initial response to Love God - Serve Others - Form Disciples. Our triune God is cheering us on every time we step away from our selfishness and focus on others through love and service. Routinely doing so forms us as disciples of Christ.

And so, I invite you to Mass (and then the next and the next...) If you know someone who has been absent or who is seeking God to come into their life, invite them to join you! This is the week; this is the month! How can all of us say yes to God by serving others in our parish and in our community? I would love to hear from you! If you have been absent for a while, come back - we need you and love you! Thank you to all who are already serving our brothers and sisters through your gifts of time, talent and treasure. You are a blessing and we are grateful! **Love God - Serve Others - Form Disciples.** Praying and hoping with you always.

Announcing Archbishop-elect Zinkula



Dubuque, Iowa – Pope Francis has appointed Most Reverend Thomas R. Zinkula, Bishop of Davenport, as Archbishop of Dubuque. Archbishop-elect Zinkula is scheduled to be installed as the archdiocese's eleventh archbishop on Wednesday, October 18.

Archbishop-elect Zinkula reflected upon his appointment to Dubuque in a statement, saying, "Although I will be sad to leave the Diocese of Davenport in a couple of months, where the diocesan community taught me how to be a bishop and we walked together on our common faith journey, I am humbled and overjoyed to receive the appointment to return to my home diocese to serve as the eleventh archbishop of the Archdiocese of Dubuque."

Part of Who We Are

The parable Jesus tells about the father who asks his two sons for help may sound familiar to those of us who have more than one child. The father in the story asks his first son to work in the vineyard. The son refuses, but later goes to work in the fields. The father approaches the second son with the same request. This son tells his father he will go, but he doesn't.

In this parable Jesus tells us God doesn't want just lip service. God wants us to be who we say we are. For example, I like to garden, but I am not a gardener. I write short reflections like this one, but I am not a writer. I know the difference because I have a friend who is a gardener, and a husband who is a writer. I garden because I want to have a summer garden. I began writing these reflections as part of my job. If I could afford to hire a gardener or to not work, I just might not do either.

My friend Nympha, the gardener, doesn't just enjoy her summer garden. She spends all of fall, winter, and spring planning and going through seed catalogs. Her garden reflects who she is. My husband isn't paid to write; yet he writes almost daily, putting into short stories or vignettes snapshots of human experiences. His writing reflects who he is. My friend gardens and my husband writes because what they do is part of who they are. She has to garden; he has to write.

This is what God ultimately wants from us. Not just obeying the rules because we want to enjoy God's kingdom or because it's part of the job of being a Christian. God wants us to obey the rules because it's a part of who we are.

I'm not a gardener or writer, but I am a mother. My children are a part of who I am. Their needs are my needs. I think being a Christian means feeling that way about everyone, friend and foe. Taking care of others' needs as deftly as we take care of our children's or our own should be a natural response, and not done just because it is the rule. When that happens, we are not just followers of Christ; we are Christ.

FAMILY RESPONSE

Look through a newspaper or watch a local news program together. Decide on something you can do to help someone who is in need. (Sometimes offering a prayer is the only practical or possible response.)

PERSONAL RESPONSE

What is something you love to do—something that is a part of who you are? What do you want to remember from last week? What are you looking forward to next week? What are your concerns?
