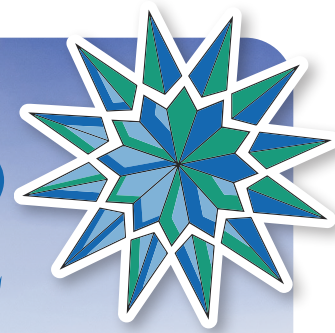

The annual "Remembrance Service for our Beloved Dead" will be held on Sunday, November 5th, 2023 at 1:00 PM in the church.

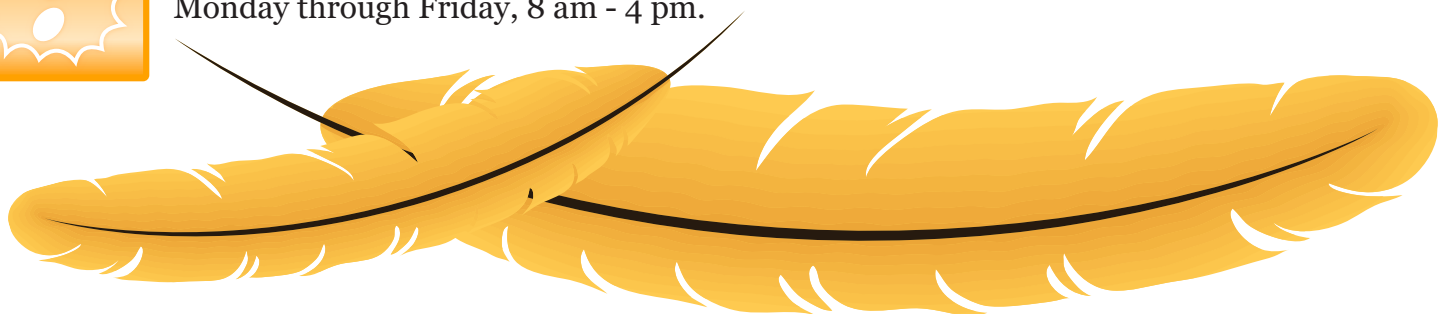

Service to Others *Metro Catholic Outreach*



Hard to believe when it was 86 on Monday but it will be fall weather soon and MCO is in need of blankets, gloves, and coats for our friends without housing. We are blessed with many, many thank yous from them when we have these items to share. I will probably ask often as there are a lot of people in need in our community. We started the homeless/snack bag program for those without access to kitchens back in May 2019. Since May 2019 to September 30, 2023, MCO has distributed 6891 bags to our community. Today (Monday, October 2), we distributed 45 bags as of 2:30.

Per the Gazette, “Cedar Rapids homeless count continues to rise. Since July 2017, the number of people living outdoors has more than quadrupled. Last year, the number reached 107 — the first time in recent memory it has eclipsed 100. This year, the total reached 123 — a 15 percent increase over July 2022” Our front desk volunteers see the need every day and we try to assist in the ways we can including being a friend, and offering some socks, a blanket, and kind words.

That volunteer may be the only person who has offered a smile and kind word to them all day. These people are wonderful human beings who have had life throw many, many curve balls at them. When someone finds a new apartment, we celebrate with them. When someone gets a job, we celebrate, and when one finds a group to help keep them safe on the long nights, we celebrate that win too.

You might get a little tired of hearing us (me) ask for blankets, socks, gloves, and coats but the need is great and even one of you donating makes a huge difference for people in our community. - from Kate

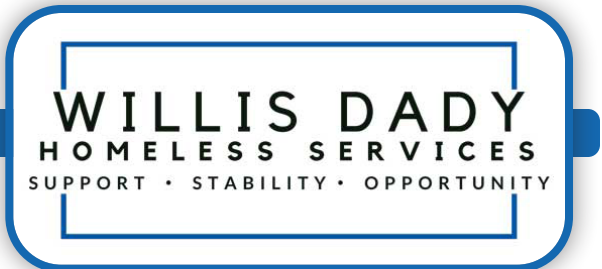

Communal Anointing of the Sick



Communal Anointing of the Sick is scheduled for October 28 & 29 during Mass

During his ministry on earth, Jesus had a particular concern for sick people; he healed them not just with a word of power, but also with a human and compassionate touch.

The Anointing of the Sick, like all sacraments, is one way that the church continues the ministry of Jesus. Through it, Christ continues to touch, heal, and comfort. The Letter of James attests that this practice has always been part of ministry: “Is anyone among you sick? He should summon the presbyters of the church, and they should pray over him and anoint [him] with oil in the name of the church” (5:14).

While the sacrament is often administered individually, the church encourages celebrating it within Mass. Many parishes celebrate it on one or more Sundays each year. The sacrament may be received by a baptized person who “begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age,” according to the Catechism of the Catholic Church (1514)—seriously ill, but not necessarily near death—so it may not be apparent that someone receiving the sacrament is ill. The communal celebration reminds us that suffering is part of our human condition and may move us to look on each other with the compassion of Christ the healer. Celebrating this sacrament during Mass also helps us unite our sufferings with Christ’s as we recall his body broken and his blood poured out for us.

You Are Cordially Invited...



Welcome to the Twenty-eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time. There are various ways to say no and in the Gospel reading for this week Jesus gives an example of each way that we defy, ignore and reject God.

There are many layers to this parable, which has always muddled the waters for me in terms of more fully understanding it. The following commentary by Curtis Mitch and Edward Sri in their book, *The Gospel of Matthew* brings much clarity to the reading: “The parable of the wedding feast is about our response to God’s call. It cautions us first of the dangers of indifference. When the Father invites us into a relationship with his Son, we can choose to respond or we can quietly decline the invitation and go back to our personal pursuits as though nothing has changed and no new demands have been placed on our lives. Another danger brought to our attention is indignation. Many people fight the idea that we are all sinners in need of salvation. In such cases, the good news and its call for repentance can seem like a threat to our happiness and our deepest desires for fulfillment in life. This can put us on the defensive and even provoke a hostile response toward those who challenge us with the claims of Christ. Finally, the parable warns us against incomplete conversion. The man without the wedding garment had neither ignored nor refused the invitation to the feast. But his yes to the call of God was not carried through to his life. He wanted the good things of the kingdom, but not enough to break with his sinful ways and live as a committed disciple.” As I read each of these sentences, I felt God was talking directly to me. Let’s break each one down a little more.

Indifference. Especially in today’s world of constant information, I sometimes shut myself off to the pain of the world that seems to constantly bombard us. In so doing, though, my outer shell of indifference to many things has hardened. I need to remember that God isn’t calling me to action on everything; some things, yes, but on others, my priority should be through prayer. Prayer softens the shell of indifference and guides us to right action. Prayer says “yes” to God, but listens and allows for His will to be done, not ours.

Declining the invitation. This one can be the most dangerous, because the evil one is so crafty and cunning in diverting our attention and love away from God through: outright refusal; saying yes but not following through; shifting our awareness to false idols or simply ignoring the hand being extended to us. If you have never read the book, *The Screwtape Letters* by C. S. Lewis, I highly recommend it. Each chapter opened my eyes to the artful deceit of the evil one and at the same time had me seeking the Lord’s forgiveness for how easily I had been duped at times and had let myself be swayed. Good habits, like daily prayer and attending Mass on the weekend help to strengthen us so that we are more aware of the many ways that we unintentionally decline God’s invitations.

Indignation. I have called myself out recently on some of the entitled behavior I have noticed in my life. A lot of social media feeds this thought process and can quickly turn a small acorn into a mighty oak of a diva. Humility and adopting the mantle of a steward are the healthy pruning shears that turns a diva into a willing servant of God.

Incomplete conversion. This one should convict almost all of us. I stated this recently and I will repeat it again - All Saints is just a building without her parishioners stepping up to the plate and volunteering their time, talent and treasures. There are a lot of building blocks in place, but only with the cornerstone of Christ and the mortar of all of us can All Saints become and stay a vibrant parish and school ready to form and serve God’s disciples both now and in the future. Even if we are the most faithful Mass attendees, if we do not live God’s word in the world and serve our brothers and sisters, then we are living this incomplete conversion.

And so, I invite you to Mass (and then the next and the next...) If you know someone who has been absent or who is seeking God to come into their life, invite them to join you! If you have been absent for a while, come back - we need you and love you! Please get involved with the life of the parish and our community. **Love God - Serve Others - Form Disciples.** Praying and hoping with you always.

October 15, 2023 • 28th Sunday in Ordinary Time • Matthew 22:1-14

More Than Showing Up

This Gospel is like last week's reading. It reminds us that God's invitation demands some response, some action on our part. Jesus tells a story about a wedding feast, warning the priests and elders that it takes more than just showing up at the table to be allowed to enjoy the feast.

As always, Jesus' parable has a message for us today. Consider the Eucharist as the wedding feast. The Eucharist is, after all, a banquet. In the Eucharist we are invited to become one with Jesus who forgives our sins, offers us new life and calls us to a closer communion with all of creation. It is a glorious celebration of Jesus' love and his sacrifice on the cross.

At the offertory we are invited to offer our own lives with Jesus' so that "through him, with him, in him through the power of the Holy Spirit" we can give glory to God. When we say or sing the great "Amen," we are saying yes to God, and yes to all that the Eucharist entails.

Sometimes we forget that attending Sunday liturgy requires more than just showing up at church. We need to actively respond to God's invitation by participating in the Mass. Even on those days when we don't have the energy to say the prayers or sing the songs, we can make an effort. We can at least lift up our weary hearts in silent prayer and offer our busy, over-extended lives in sacrifice.

Teach your children some of the prayers and simple responses we say at Mass. Say them together before meals. Say a prayer together on the way to church and suggest family members take some time to say "yes" to God's invitation. Consciously choose to put on the right disposition to participate in the great feast to which we have been invited.

FAMILY RESPONSE

Have some quiet prayer time before you leave for Sunday Mass, or ask for a minute of silence in the car on the way to church. Ask everyone to remember what a special gift it is to pray together with your parish family.

PERSONAL RESPONSE

At the end of the Mass, the priest asks you to go out and share the peace of God with others. How can you do that this week? What do you want to remember from last week? What are you looking forward to next week? What are your concerns?
