


Who Can Pick Up a Food Box?

Did you know that anyone who requests a food box can pick up groceries on our distribution days? Anyone in need can call our office and get on the Tuesday, Wednesday, or Thursday schedule. All we ask is their name, household size, and phone number. No IDs, no income qualifiers, no other details needed. They only need to call ahead to reserve a box.

We continue to add many new families each month, and we now have about 8,000 households in our registry! While many of our clients come somewhat regularly, less than 23% pick up a food box more than once per month. For many, MCO is the first place that is called for assistance.

The items in our food boxes of non-perishable items and toiletries add up to about \$70 per box. In addition, fresh items are added to each box at distribution - milk, meat, produce, bread, sometimes eggs. The photos show the typical groceries included for a household of 1-4 family members.

Our clients come from every neighborhood, social class, income bracket, ethnicity. Every person has a story of need at some point in their lives, and thanks to our parishes and caring parishioners, those experiencing food insecurity can receive immediate assistance from MCO. We also make numerous referrals each week to other local organizations for further resources.

A Perfect Pairing - Haiti & Iowa: Education

Our fall fundraiser to support our sister parish, Notre Dame de Lourdes, has begun. You will once again see teacher and student pictures up on our walls, and we'll be sharing reflections in the All Saints bulletin and on Facebook.

This year's theme is "A Perfect Pairing," which is reflective of the 23-year partnership between our Iowa parishes – All Saints, St. John Mt. Vernon and Heart of Mary Cluster Vinton – and Notre Dame de Lourdes. We have been blessed by our relationships with one another and share many of the same values - education, health care and agriculture. This writing will highlight our primary mission, education.

For 23 years we have dedicated most of our support to the education of the children and teachers of our sister parish. Each chapel in Notre Dame de Lourdes has a small school and like our Iowa parishes, each of these schools teaches the Catholic faith and brings the gospel to the children. Who could have expected that our small parishes could help sustain a parish in Haiti with 24 chapels and their schools! God uses ordinary people to do the unexpected!

When we visit Haiti we worship together, study together and break bread together. When our sister parish pastor, Fr. Viller, recently visited Iowa he did the same with us. God has a wonderful way of putting us in each others' paths. We may not know it at the time, but as we live our lives loving each other, we begin to see how God works his wonderous deeds through a perfect pairing of compassion.

Again this year, as we offer our support for Notre Dame de Lourdes, we are taking action to ease their very real challenges and help children stay in school. Despite our distance and inability to travel there due to current instability in their country, we share their experiences and be present with them from a distance.

A letter to the parents who keep bringing their disruptive kids to Mass, week after week

Dear exhausted, discouraged parents,

So your kids are just terrible in Mass. Chaotic, disobedient, and disruptive, week after week. It's like a big old spotlight is shining on you the whole time, you and your apparently sub-par parenting.

I'm right there with you. I've started to dread Sundays. I mean, we've tried everything. Going to the early Mass, going to the evening Mass, Mass books, whispered explanations, whispered threats, sitting in the front, sitting in the back, marching straight to the cry room ... and maybe a few of the tricks have helped, but the bottom line is that we're not getting out of that building without somebody screaming, making a mad dash for the altar, or God knows what.

But in spite of it all, every week, I and my loud, chaotic family are going to be there (in the back!) wiggling around and distracting everyone, and subjecting ourselves to the judgment of a large number of people who might not understand how hard it actually is to teach a toddler to sit quietly for 45 minutes. It looks insane. Still, we button up our wrinkled Sunday clothes anyway, and get our bodies under that roof, just like Mother Church asks us to.

I want you to know that if this is you too, that's okay. It's better than okay. Christ had something pretty important to say about people like us:

When [Jesus] looked up he saw some wealthy people putting their offerings into the treasury and he noticed a poor widow putting in two small coins. He said, "I tell you truly, this poor widow put in more than all the rest; for those others have all made offerings from their surplus wealth, but she, from her poverty, has offered her whole livelihood." (Luke 21:1-4)

Isn't this exactly what we are doing? We are giving it literally all we've got, in obeying the Church's request to make it to Sunday Mass. (Sheer embarrassment, unfortunately, isn't a good enough reason to stay home.) To the outside world, it looks like we've done the bare minimum. We've gotten into the building, sure, but are we concentrating? Are we having a spiritual experience? Did we even hear a word of the Gospel, for heaven's sake? It doesn't look like much. We are the only ones who know how much we are really giving. But Christ knows, too.

Just like the woman's two small coins into the collection box look like nothing in comparison with the rich man's gigantic bag of gold, our contribution looks so small a person might wonder why we even bother. Why even come to Mass, if you're just going to spend the whole time doing toddler damage control? But Christ is there to remind us that he doesn't see what the rest of the world sees.

Pretty often, I leave Mass feeling like the whole thing was a bust. I didn't even manage to follow along, and I left so fast I forgot to genuflect. What kind of a Catholic am I? If that's how you feel too, don't forget — having little kids, or kids with special needs, or whatever situation you're in that makes it impossible to kneel quietly and listen carefully, this is a unique kind of poverty. And we, in our poverty, really do give all we have, just by doing our best. Even if our best is just showing up.

So don't stop. And please don't worry too much about how your family looks. Even if it never gets easier, keep doing what you are doing, and know that even when the world doesn't, God sees how valuable your sacrifice is.

Communal Anointing of the Sick

Communal Anointing of the Sick is scheduled for October 28 & 29 during Mass

During his ministry on earth, Jesus had a particular concern for sick people; he healed them not just with a word of power, but also with a human and compassionate touch.

The Anointing of the Sick, like all sacraments, is one way that the church continues the ministry of Jesus. Through it, Christ continues to touch, heal, and comfort. The Letter of James attests that this practice has always been part of ministry: "Is anyone among you sick? He should summon the presbyters of the church, and they should pray over him and anoint [him] with oil in the name of the church" (5:14).

While the sacrament is often administered individually, the church encourages celebrating it within Mass. Many parishes celebrate it on one or more Sundays each year. The sacrament may be received by a baptized person who "begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age," according to the Catechism of the Catholic Church (1514)—seriously ill, but not necessarily near death—so it may not be apparent that someone receiving the sacrament is ill. The communal celebration reminds us that suffering is part of our human condition and may move us to look on each other with the compassion of Christ the healer. Celebrating this sacrament during Mass also helps us unite our sufferings with Christ's as we recall his body broken and his blood poured out for us.



You Are Cordially Invited...

Welcome to the Twenty-ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time. The Old Testament and Gospel reading remind us that only God is God.

The first of the commandments states: I am the LORD your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of bondage. You shall have no other gods before me. You shall not make for yourself a graven image, or any likeness of anything that is in heaven above, or that is in the earth beneath, or that is in the water under the earth; you shall not bow down to them or serve them. It is written: "You shall worship the Lord your God and him only shall you serve."

Let's unpack this a little. Like most of us, I was not familiar with the full version of the first commandment; only the short one. After reading it in full, I was curious as to why it was important for God to identify as the one "who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of bondage". Wonderfully, Fr. Mike Schmitz and the Catechism in a Year came to my rescue. Side note: I have to admit, I get behind on listening to the daily Catechism podcasts. Life happens! I used to beat myself up about it, but lately I have come to believe that God has a hand in the timing of my listening. On several occasions, I have listened to an episode at the exact time I needed to hear the message. If I would have been listening on a daily basis, my life and the message would not have been in sync. Back to our reflection. Fr. Mike emphasized how important it was to link the bondage the Israelites experienced under the Egyptians to the next sentence "you shall have no other gods before me." When we worship other gods (with a little 'g'), they subject us to the same bondage that God freed us from. Pope Francis in a homily added further insight, "Worship means concentrating on what is essential. In worship, we learn to reject what should not be worshiped: the god of money, the god of consumerism, the god of pleasure, the god of success, the god of self. Worship means bending low before the Most High and to discover in his presence that life's greatness does not consist in having, but in loving."

I was beginning to understand the first commandment in a whole new light. Out of pure love, God freed us from slavery and in love we will only remain free if we keep our attention and desires focused on God's will and not our own. But why is that so important? What's the harm of having a few gods in our life? Pope Francis explains, "Once we lose the sense of worship, we lose our direction in the Christian life, which is a journey towards the Lord, not towards ourselves. This is a grave risk. We use God instead of serving him ... How many times have we confused God's power, which is for serving others, with power of this world, which is for serving ourselves? Worship allows one to realize that faith is not simply a set of doctrines, but a relationship with a living person, Jesus Christ."

And so, I invite you to Mass (and then the next and the next...) If you know someone who has been absent or who is seeking God to come into their life, invite them to join you! If you have been absent for a while, come back - we need you and love you! Together let's weed the little gods out of our lives so that together we can *Love God - Serve Others - Form Disciples*. Praying and hoping with you always.

Giving God What Is God's

As Jesus' followers grow in number, so do his enemies. The Pharisees, for example, are afraid the people will begin to question their power and authority. They try very hard to trip Jesus up. They want to find something to hold him accountable for to the Romans. They bring him a coin and ask him to whom it belongs.

Money and God: how do they relate? We need money to take care of our temporal needs—things like housing, food, clothes, electricity. It occurred to me that the more we advance technologically as a society, the more expensive it is to raise a family. I remember looking at the back-to-school ads last September and marveling at the cost of the bare necessities for today's students. Perhaps that's the relationship of money to God—we need money for the necessities, and we need God to help us figure out just what those necessities are.

There is so much out there to spend money on. Things we want, but could really do without. Every year there are new products or updated versions of older products to entice our youngsters. Part of being a responsible Christian parent is teaching your children to learn to live without, to share what they have, and give from their bounty. We do this to help them discover what the real necessities of life are.

Help your children come up with a list of what they think they need. Have them pare the list down until they have what they consider are absolute necessities. Remind your children that they are a part of God's family, and some of their brothers and sisters do not even have food or shelter.

Find a particular agency or cause to support. Occasionally, when we are tempted to buy something we don't absolutely need, we give the money instead to "our family cause." Encourage children to give away a comparable item they already own for every new toy they receive. Consider doing the same for every new article of clothing you buy.

FAMILY RESPONSE

Have some quiet prayer time before you leave for Sunday Mass, or ask for a minute of silence in the car on the way to church. Ask everyone to remember what a special gift it is to pray together with your parish family.

PERSONAL RESPONSE

At the end of the Mass, the priest asks you to go out and share the peace of God with others. How can you do that this week? What do you want to remember from last week? What are you looking forward to next week? What are your concerns?
