



You Are Cordially Invited...



Welcome to the Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time. This is our last Sunday in Ordinary time for the 2023 calendar year. Next Sunday, we celebrate the end of our liturgical year with Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. Two Sundays from now we start the new liturgical year with the 1st Sunday in Advent. There is a lot that happens during the next two months. Today's Gospel reading is a good one to keep in our back pocket as we enter into the holidays. It can help us respond to rather than react to the demands of our time, talents and financial resources, as well as some of the family

challenges that arise.

This passage has many interpretations as to what the talents symbolize. Some interpret it more literally as money, others as gifts and abilities from the Lord and still others as revealed knowledge from God. The most eye opening interpretation that I read is the one that found a solid resting place in my heart and mind. It was given in a Labor Day weekend homily by Fr. Robert Schoenstene, an Old Testament professor at Mundelein University. After acknowledging the common interpretations, he shares, "What the contemporary reader will likely miss, and what the ancient Jewish reader would have caught immediately, is the connection to heaviness: a talent was weighty, and five talents was massively heavy. Heaviness would have brought to mind the heaviest weight of all, which was the kabod of Yahweh. That term was rendered in Greek as doxa and in Latin as gloria, both of which carry the connotation of luminosity, but the basic sense of the Hebrew word is heaviness, gravitas. And this kabod Yahweh was to be found in the Jerusalem Temple, resting upon the mercy seat within the Holy of Holies. Therefore, what was heaviest (most glorious) of all was the mercy of God, which abided in infinite, inexhaustible abundance in the Holy Temple. In light of these clarifications, we can read Jesus' parable with fresh eyes. The talents given to the three servants are not so much monetary gifts or personal capacities; they are a share in the mercy of God, a participation in the weightiness of the divine love. But since mercy is always directed to the other, these "talents" are designed to be shared. In point of fact, they will increase precisely in the measure that they are given away. The problem with the timid servant who buried his talent is not that he was an ineffective venture capitalist but that he fundamentally misunderstood the nature of what he had been given. The divine mercy—received as a pure gift—is meant to be given to others as a pure gift. Buried in the ground, that is to say, hugged tightly to oneself as one's own possession, such a talent necessarily evanesces. And this is why the master's seemingly harsh words should not be read as the punishment of an angry God but as an expression of spiritual physics: the divine mercy will grow in you only inasmuch as you give it to others. To "have" the kabod Yahweh is precisely not to have it in the ordinary sense of the term."

While all of the interpretations speak to a heightened awareness of our call to love, worship and serve God through the development and generous use of our blessings from God (time, talent and treasure), to know God's mercy and multiply this magnanimous gift by sharing it freely with others calls for an sense of humility and service that the others do not. It can be easier to share our time, talent and treasures, because our culture lauds the giver which can increase the ego and crowd out God. Our culture does not celebrate mercy and forgiveness to the same degree. Those who grow God's mercy and freely share it are often ridiculed and labeled as weak and foolish. We have all sinned. This Advent, come and receive God's all-powerful and life changing mercy through the sacrament of Reconciliation. And then, I invite all of us to grow this love in our hearts by foolishly, freely and lavishly giving it away. The beauty of doing so is that it never leaves you, but miraculously grows the more it is shared.

And so, I invite you to Mass (and then the next and the next...) If you know someone who has been absent or who is seeking God to come into their life, invite them to join you! If you have been absent for a while, come back - we need you and love you. *Love God - Serve Others - Form Disciples*. Praying and hoping with you always.

Living Up to Your Potential

Jesus teaches through another story. A man entrusts his servants with his possessions while he is on a journey. The first servant receives five talents; he trades them and ends up with ten. The second received two and also doubles his master's money. The third servant receives one talent, and out of fear, buries it. When the man returned, he punished the third servant for doing nothing with what he was given. He praises the other servants.

Well done, good and trustworthy servant. Aren't those the words we would all like to hear when we face the Lord for our final judgment? I have my own theory about what we have to do to hear those words. I don't think God is going to judge us on what we have done, but on who we have become.

We were each created to be absolutely unique. No two people are made the same. God created each of us with our own set of talents, abilities, and limitations. I think when we face God on the last day, God will say to us, "Have you become the person I created you to be?" When you become the person God created you to be, you are at your best. You become the best parent you can be, the best friend, the best teacher, lawyer, doctor, scientist, writer, designer, assistant, firefighter, or painter.

Think of the world as a giant jigsaw puzzle. Each person represents one piece of the puzzle, and when all the pieces are put together you find the Kingdom of God. But suppose a few pieces decided they didn't like their particular shape and wanted to look like the shapes next to them. Or what if some puzzle pieces decided they wouldn't show up because they weren't sure where they would fit in? It would be forever before you would get to see the Kingdom of God.

In the parable of the talents, the servant buries the treasure because he is afraid of losing it. He gives into his fear and it ends up costing him everything. Fear that is rooted in an uncertainty of our own worth can be like that. Fear of failure or rejection, or even the fear of being laughed at, can paralyze a person. Don't let that happen to you.

Discover who God created you to be and be that person. Develop your gifts and when it comes time to face your creator you are bound to hear, "Well done."


