

You Are Cordially Invited...

Welcome to the First Sunday of Advent. The Faith Formation Commission has generously purchased Advent reflection booklets for you and I hope you take the time to get one, to say thank you, and to find a way to incorporate these daily messages into preparing your heart for the birth of our Savior.

God has a great sense of timing and humor. If you do not believe me - this was from last year's article on the 1st Sunday of Advent: "Life is messy at the moment and I am humanly desiring the peace and tranquility of the baby Jesus already." Well guess what? Life is messier than ever with no end in sight. When I read the passage from Isaiah for this Sunday, I could feel the same lament and longing expressed by the author with every fiber of my being.

"Why do you let us wander, O LORD, from your ways, and harden our hearts so that we fear you not?" I truly love God with my whole heart, but very humanly, I find myself making choices that are far from what God would like me to do. I find myself lamenting just like the author of this passage. "Return for the sake of your servants, the tribes of your heritage. Oh, that you would rend the heavens and come down, with the mountains quaking before you, while you wrought awesome deeds we could not hope for, such as they had not heard of from of old." Life would be so much easier if God just took over my life and clearly showed me the path. But that is not God's way. He loves us so much that he gave us the gift of free will and has never taken it back, Love isn't true if it is forced or coerced and yes, God loves us that much.

So this Advent I invited us all to be more purposeful and more prayerful in our thoughts, our decisions and our actions. "Would that you might meet us doing right, that we were mindful of you in our ways!" December is typically a very busy month. We make an extra effort to gather with family and friends to celebrate. But what are we celebrating and how? That question should cause most of us to really pause and reflect. God loves it when we come together and celebrate and support one another, but shouldn't we invite God into the celebration, also? Perhaps a good place to begin is to make attendance at the Sunday liturgy a focal point in our week in the midst of all the other activities of this Advent Season. "Yet, O LORD, you are our father; we are the clay and you the potter: we are all the work of your hands." When we gather as a prayerful community at the Sunday liturgy, God, the potter, offers much: the Word and the Eucharist. Both can beautifully mold us to become true People of God. It is not an easy life to which we are called - to be the Body of Christ. It takes work, prayer and perseverance in the face of many temptations and struggles. Humanly, we often fail and fall. But God does not abandon us: He invites us to always come and be fortified so we can be purposeful and nourished in our work on earth.

And so, I invite you to attend Mass this weekend (and then the next and the next...) If you know someone who has been absent, invite them to join you! Make the purposeful choice to attend weekend Mass (and daily if your schedule allows.) Let's give each other and the world the gift of prayer for Advent . Come, Lord Jesus! Praying with you always.

Keep Awake

Jesus tells his disciples a story about a gatekeeper who was told to watch carefully for his master's return. The gatekeeper is warned that the time or day of the man's return is unknown, and so he must be watchful. He is cautioned to stay alert and not be caught sleeping.

This Gospel from Mark is read on the First Sunday of Advent, the season we prepare to celebrate Christmas. And Mark certainly isn't subtle in telling us how to get ready. His Gospel almost shouts, "Keep awake, pay attention." Fortunately, being on guard and staying alert is something parents know all about.

With five children under ten (three under three at one point), I was on guard at all times. When they were infants, my eyes were always alert for open basement doors, sharp or breakable items and choking hazards. The teen years required even more vigilance. We needed to be alert for subtler hazards. Some questions became standard: Where are you going? Who will you be with? When will you be home?

In the weeks ahead, consider staying alert in other ways. Discover where God is in your everyday life. On Christmas we celebrate more than Jesus' birth. It is a celebration of Jesus alive today, all around us in all of creation and especially in his people. And it is a celebration that Jesus, in all his glory, will come again.

Look carefully. Be alert to where Jesus can be found in your life. Recognize him in the faces of your children, friends, coworkers, and be especially vigilant in finding Jesus in the faces of those you would rather ignore. Whenever possible, help your children understand that Jesus is all around them, especially in the people he loves.

Find Jesus in your own heart, and be vigilant for opportunities to share his love with your family and the people you encounter in your everyday life. Stay alert!
