

## You Are Cordially Invited...



Welcome to the Third Sunday of Easter. Although we are now two weeks past Easter on the calendar, the Gospel reading has us still on Easter Sunday. Humanly, we might be anxious to "move on", but if we spend some time in prayer with this reading, there are important parallels between our lives today and the lives of the two disciples on the road to Emmaus.

Chronologically, today's reading from Luke takes place before last week's Gospel reading. We pick up the story at a very interesting juncture. The two disciples know about the women going to the tomb and the group that followed and verified that it was empty, but their conversation with Jesus reveals that they do not know that Mary encountered Christ in the garden. So...what are two disciples doing? Getting out of Dodge (aka Jerusalem)? Going to Emmaus for some purpose? Or just trying to figure out what's next? Hard to tell. God's description of us as a "stiff-necked" people with easily "hardened hearts" from the Old Testament still seems pretty accurate. The two disciples describe for Jesus how the women who first went to the tomb "astounded" the others by describing the scene and reporting "that they had indeed seen a vision of angels who announced that he was alive." But then in the same narrative, the two disciples cast much doubt on this: "we were hoping that he would be the one to redeem Israel [but] it is now the third day since all this took place (the crucifixion.)" This scenario reminds me of a person from my past - no matter how much I tried to prove how worthy and trustworthy I was, this person would never make the leap to "belief." After walking with, learning from and seeing Jesus perform healing miracles, there was still no concrete belief. No wonder that Jesus responds to their report and assessment with "Oh, how foolish you are!"

# **Family Ministry**

#### April 23, 2023 • Third Sunday of Easter Luke 24:13-35

#### Jesus in Our Midst

The story of disciples who encounter Jesus on their walk to Emmaus is found only in Luke, but it offers us an important insight into what the Eucharist is about. The story takes place three days after Jesus was crucified. Two of his followers are returning home, feeling dejected. Jesus joins them, but they don't recognize him until he sits down with them at table and breaks bread with them.

The walk to Emmaus is one of my favorite Gospel stories. Two ordinary folks, disciples of Jesus, are walking home. They are sad and discouraged. Everything has gone wrong: All they had hoped for was gone. Jesus joins them, but they don't recognize him. They begin to share what had happened back in Jerusalem and Jesus reminds them of the Scripture readings that foresaw such happenings. During the walk, they do not recognize Jesus. It is at table, in the breaking of the bread, that their eyes are opened.

I think one of the reasons I like this story is that it is such a clear reminder that Christ is in our midst. It is easy to talk about the Jesus we find in Scripture, or the glorified Christ who sits at the right hand of the Father. It is often easier to believe in the miracle worker and King of Kings than to see Christ in the face of a stranger or beggar. It is sometimes even more difficult to see Jesus in the people we walk with every day—the people in our own homes.

Here's my updated replay of the walk to Emmaus. A woman (or man) comes home from work tired and discouraged. After a half hour of breathing space (we all need time to disengage), she sits down and shares her day with her husband or offspring. The listener becomes the storyteller as he shares his day. Each person is gently affirmed. Finally, they all sit down together at table, and as they tear into a pizza they smile at each other as they recognize the look of Christ in the face across from them.

#### **FAMILY RESPONSE**

Ask each family member to name one quality of Jesus they see in each of the other family members.

## PERSONAL RESPONSE

Experts tell us we all need at least 20–30 minutes of quiet time to let go of tensions when we come home from work or school. Do you think this is a good idea for your household? How can you arrange it? What do you want to remember from last week? What are you looking forward to next week? What are your concerns?

## A Note From Father Jack



Dear All,

As we have celebrated Holy Week and entered the joy that only Easter can afford us, I wanted to bring you news regarding several events which will impact our Catholic Schools throughout Iowa and, more specifically, in the CR Metro. The Winter months were filled with many meetings exploring what the future of Catholic education might look like in the days to come.

First, we were all surprised that the Students First Act education savings account (ESA) was signed into law on January 24 and would take effect at the beginning of the school year in August. (Please check with our Principal, Lynn Holverson, to learn more about this program which will most certainly impact many students in Iowa, perhaps your student!)

Second, a committee has been meeting to determine whether or not a single system would be a benefit to our Metro Catholic schools. Can we exist as individual parish schools, bearing the burden and costs of standing alone, or would we be better served by forming a system where we might lean on each other and combine our resources?

And third, the Regis Middle School Board has concluded that the current Regis building must be replaced in the very near future. A committee has been researching options and has already taken their findings to the East-Side parishes, whom Regis serves.

I invite you to read the latest minutes from these two Metro committees which you may find below. And please know that I would be happy to chat with you regarding the two committees and about the ESA program. These are busy and exciting times for our schools, and I ask for your prayers and support as we strive to best educate our students. Fr. Jack



## March 27th Middle School Exploratory Committee Meeting



Metro Area Governance Task Force Xavier High School, Novak Room March 1, 2023 6:30 p.m. – 8:00 p.m. MINUTES

Opening prayer was led by Jeff Henderson.

The February 1, 2023 meeting were reviewed and approved.

Amy Conlon updated the process for **Education Savings Accounts (ESA)**. Cathy Walz, Supt, has continued to develop videos and documents for pastors, administrators, school boards and pastoral councils to use in bringing ESAs onboard. Tuition, salaries and subsidies are all a part of this work. Cathy has created a nine-step process for schools that includes deadlines to work toward during this first year.

The current goal is to determine the per pupil cost to educate. Many schools have already set tuition rates, but they now need to revisit the process and establish a new tuition rate. Cathy has supplied formulas for schools to use in determining a range where tuition can be set. Schools and parishes will look at historical data in order to modify tuition for 2023-24 and to make projections. By year three, tuition rates should be closer to the cost to educate.

Amy then gave a brief overview on the Middle School Exploratory Committee. This committee is progressing in steps very similar to this task force. They have met once and will continue into May. Each meeting will be held at each of the middle schools currently in place. Any recommendation the Middle School Exploratory Committee makes will first go to the school boards in conjunction with the pastors. (Note: this task force will make a recommendation to the pastors and administrators first, followed by pastoral councils, school boards and the Xavier Foundation.)

## Metro Area Catholic Schools Governance Task Force Meeting Summary from March 29, 2023

**Essential Question the Task Force is charged to answer.** Is it in the long term best interest of parishes and Catholic education in the metro area for Catholic schools to remain independent?

The Metro Area Catholic Schools Governance Task Force met on Wednesday, March 29, 2023 from 6:30pm–8:00pm in the Novak Conference Room at Xavier High School. This was their ninth meeting.

The task force approved the minutes from the March 1, 2023 meeting.

Beth Globokar (Task Force member and Chair of the Middle School Exploratory Study Committee) updated the task force on the work to date of the Middle School Exploratory Study Committee.

Jeff Henderson reviewed the model system budget projections that includes a possible Central Office. He presented the various assumptions used to build the budget. Those assumptions are conservative so as to be realistic. The proposed model system budget does include adding a system office while not adding any increased financial burden to parishes or families and maintaining at the very least a balanced budget. The group then reviewed and discussed the budget and financial projections through 2029-30.

The group discussed the Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ's) that came as a result of the small group work at the March 1 meeting. These and others will be used as part of the overall final recommendation report that has yet to be created.

Small group discussions followed with conversation focusing largely on a possible central office structure. The input will be used to revise the staffing responsibilities and levels for future task force consideration.

The next steps for the task force will be to:

- Finalize a proposed central office staff for consideration
- Ensure all task force questions are answered
- Prepare a recommendation and final report to answer the essential question listed above

The goal is to present a report including any recommendation(s), with rationale, that answers the essential question, to pastors, pastoral councils, school boards, and the Xavier Foundation board for their consideration and possible action in late spring/early summer 2023. This report <u>could</u> include a recommendation to leave school governance as is, a recommendation to systemize all preK-12 grade Catholic education or something in between.

The next meeting has been scheduled for Tuesday, May 2nd at 6:30PM. We thank you for your continued prayers as this group discerns the essential question, seeking to understand what is best for Catholic education in the Cedar Rapids metro area for many years to come.

This change will be made and reflected in the minutes sent to the Xavier Catholic community with this meeting's summary.

Beth referenced the facilities study document that was shared at last month's meeting. This document can be used as a reference for the tour of the LaSalle Middle School building. It also provides information as it relates to specific facility components.

A brief history and information about the LaSalle community was shared prior to the tour. An important note was shared about the facility's future, should any changes be made. If LaSalle Middle School ever did not exist as such, LaSalle Elementary would move to occupy the current LaSalle Middle School space. Then a determination would need to be made as to what could/would occupy the current LaSalle Elementary space. Currently, LaSalle Middle School is owned by the consolidation agreement; however, LaSalle Elementary School is owned by St. Jude parish.

## Is it in the long term best interest for the metro Catholic middle schools to remain independent or become consolidated?

Greetings,

The Middle School Exploratory Study Committee met on Monday, March 27, 2023 at St. Joseph Catholic School. This was their third meeting. Below you will find a summary of the key aspects discussed during this time together.

- The exploratory study committee approved the minutes from March 20, 2023 as provided.
- A tour of the St. Joseph Catholic School space was provided by Mr. Casey Kettmann, highlighting the facilities, as well sharing important components as it relates to the current structures at St. Joseph, specifically drawing attention to recent updates throughout the building. Upon completion of the tour, questions were asked of the group.
- Beth Globokar, Facilitator and former Xavier Catholic Schools administrator, elicited the following discussion:
  - > Research
    - It was noted by multiple members that the amount of research and data available on a middle school consolidation is very limited and oftentimes, when information is found, it relates to rural and public school districts.
    - Additionally, conflicting information was found in a number of articles.
    - Identity was at the forefront of much of the research data; school identity would reference the individuality of each Catholic school in the Cedar Rapids metro area and parish identity was an area identified that needed to be at the forefront of any decision from this group, just as the Cedar Rapids metro task force is considering the same.
    - One research article described "ele-middle schools" as schools that hold K-8 students in the same building but operate as K-5 with a middle school concept. St. Joseph in Marion would be described as an "ele-middle school."
  - System Synopsis
    - Information from five midwest system consolidations was provided to the group for review, including a similar format for the current Catholic school structure in the Cedar Rapids metro area.
    - Most similar to our current Catholic community would be St. Francis Xavier Educational System in Appleton, WI and Bishop O'Gorman Educational System in Sioux Falls, SD. Additional time was spent discussing these schools and their current structures.
  - > Transportation
    - Transportation materials were provided with limited dialogue due to time constraints. This topic will lead the next meeting agenda. A very high level finding from the data would indicate the regionality of the current Catholic schools, having students from all across the city attending each of the schools; the geographical boundaries are very unclear.
  - > The study committee was provided t-charts with key categories to begin the work of a SWOT analysis for the current structure and consolidation. The recommendation was to bring these documents completed to the next meeting so a group discussion could begin.
