Communal Anointing of the Sick During Mass March 11 & 12

During his ministry on earth, Jesus had a particular concern for sick people; he healed them not just with a word of power, but also with a human and compassionate touch.

The Anointing of the Sick, like all sacraments, is one way that the church continues the ministry of Jesus. Through it, Christ continues to touch, heal, and comfort. The Letter of James attests that this practice has always been part of ministry: "Is anyone among you sick? He should summon the presbyters of the church, and they should pray over him and anoint [him] with oil in the name of the church" (5:14).

While the sacrament is often administered individually, the church encourages celebrating it within Mass. Many parishes celebrate it on one or more Sundays each year. The sacrament may be received by a baptized person who "begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age," according to the Catechism of the Catholic Church (1514)—seriously ill, but not necessarily near death—so it may not be apparent that someone receiving the sacrament is ill. The communal celebration reminds us that suffering is part of our human condition and may move us to look on each other with the compassion of Christ the healer. Celebrating this sacrament during Mass also helps us unite our sufferings with Christ's as we recall his body broken and his blood poured out for us.

ESA has passed! See if All Saints is the Best Fit for Your Child!

Over the next few weeks and months, we will learn more about the details of how the ESA program will be implemented. Being new legislation, there are certainly things we do not know right now. We ask for grace as we learn, implement, and communicate about this opportunity for families. We will continue to communicate with you as more information becomes available. Until then, please review the information below to learn more about how ESAs will impact your family and invite others to consider our school for their family.



How will the ESA work?

Parents who choose to enroll their children in an accredited nonpublic school will receive \$7,598, the amount of per pupil funds allocated annually by the state, to use for tuition, fees, and other qualified expenses.

ESA Eligibility:

ESAs will be available based on the following eligibility:

Year 1: School Year 2023-24

- All entering kindergarten students
- All students enrolled in a public school

A student enrolled in a private school with a household income at or below 300% of the 2023 Federal Poverty Guidelines, \$90,000 for a family of four

Year 2: School Year 2024-25

- All entering kindergarten students
- All students enrolled in a public school

A student enrolled in a private school with a household income at or below 400% of the 2024 Federal Poverty Guidelines that will be updated January 2024

Year 3: School Year 2025-26

All K-12 students in Iowa regardless of income

You are Cordially Invited...



This week all three of the readings focus on the theme of mission. Recall from last week that we talked about how Jesus may have retreated to the mountains, not just for some rest, but to get the disciples away from the adoration and fawning of the crowd so that he could remind the disciples what the true mission was and how they were supposed to be.

If we stop to think about it, the weekend liturgy is our time to retreat to the mountains. It is our time to get away from the hustle, bustle and cares of our world. It is our time to be nourished and recharged so that God can send us back out into the world. This is all well and good, but to do what? Just go through the same motions week after week like the movie *Groundhogs Day*? No, we are sent forth or dismissed each week at the end of the liturgy to carry out God's mission of making the world more like God would want it to be like (...*thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven...*) in what is known as the Sending or Concluding Rite. Some of us don't even make it that far; we miss an important part of the liturgy because we leave right after communion. So, what is the Sending Rite and why is the Dismissal such an important part of it?

Gregory Augustine Pierce in his book, *The Mass is Never Ended*, asks us to consider the following: "Looking through the lens of the Dismissal, Catholics would never *go* to Mass or *come* to Mass or *attend* Mass. Except for the very first time...we *come back* to Mass. We are coming back from being *sent forth [and dismissed]* from the previous Mass we attended."

He goes on to say, "Because our mission is so important and because we know that the Mass is directly related to helping us carry it out, most of us would be on time most of the time. Having been in the 'mission fields' [our work in the world] for a while, we would know the importance of a liturgy designed to celebrate our (few) victories and lick the wounds of our (many) failures. We would also know that we were going to be sent forth in an hour or so to carry out exactly the same mission we have been on all week, so we need all the help we can get before we go."

One might ask, well then, why bother? I would suggest that we go back to the movie *Groundhogs Day* for our answer. The main character in the movie did not get it "right" the next day or the next. Little by little he made small changes. And sometimes those changes actually set him back in his journey to be a kinder, gentler person who contributed to the good in the world. But he did not give up and ultimately, all those little changes and perseverance resulted in a brand new day. The same is true for our journey. There are successes and there are failures, but if we return to Mass on a regular basis, I believe that we do make a difference in our world, even though we may not see it. Who does see it? God does. And when we continue to share our bread with the hungry, shelter the oppressed and the homeless, clothe the naked and make peace with our brothers and sisters, one day, we, too, will wake up to a new day.

And so, I invite you to attend Mass this weekend (and then the next and the next...) If you know someone who has been absent or who is seeking God to come into their life, invite them to join you! Together, let us joyously be dismissed each week, forgiven, nourished and fortified to share God's message "not with persuasive words of wisdom, but with a demonstration of Spirit and power, so that our faith might rest not on human wisdom, but on the power of God."

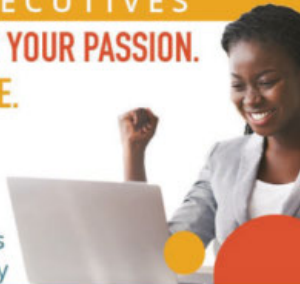
