

Communal Anointing of the Sick During Mass March 11 & 12

During his ministry on earth, Jesus had a particular concern for sick people; he healed them not just with a word of power, but also with a human and compassionate touch.

The Anointing of the Sick, like all sacraments, is one way that the church continues the ministry of Jesus. Through it, Christ continues to touch, heal, and comfort. The Letter of James attests that this practice has always been part of ministry: "Is

anyone among you sick? He should summon the presbyters of the church, and they should pray over him and anoint [him] with oil in the name of the church" (5:14).

While the sacrament is often administered individually, the church encourages celebrating it within Mass. Many parishes celebrate it on one or more Sundays each year. The sacrament may be received by a baptized person who "begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age," according to the Catechism of the Catholic Church (1514)—seriously ill, but not necessarily near death—so it may not be apparent that someone receiving the sacrament is ill. The communal celebration reminds us that suffering is part of our human condition and may move us to look on each other with the compassion of Christ the healer. Celebrating this sacrament during Mass also helps us unite our sufferings with Christ's as we recall his body broken and his blood poured out for us.



ESA has passed! See if All Saints is the Best Fit for Your Child!



ALL SAINTS Over the next few weeks and months, we will learn more about the details of how the ESA program will be implemented. Being new legislation, there are certainly things we do not know right now. We

ask for grace as we learn, implement, and communicate about this opportunity for families. We will continue to communicate with you as more information becomes available. Until then, please review the information below to learn more about how ESAs will impact your family and invite others to consider our school for their family. How will the ESA work?

Parents who choose to enroll their children in an accredited nonpublic school will receive \$7,598, the amount of per pupil funds allocated annually by the state, to use for tuition, fees, and other qualified expenses.

ESA Eligibility:

ESAs will be available based on the following eligibility:

Year 1: School Year 2023-24

- All entering kindergarten students
- All students enrolled in a public school •

A student enrolled in a private school with a household income at or below 300% of the 2023 Federal Poverty Guidelines, \$90,000 for a family of four

Year 2: School Year 2024-25

- All entering kindergarten students
- All students enrolled in a public school .
- A student enrolled in a private school with a household income at or below 400% • of the 2024 Federal Poverty Guidelines that will be updated January 2024

Year 3: School Year 2025-26

All K-12 students in Iowa regardless of income

LEARNING WITH A HIGHER PURPOSE

Family Ministry

February 12, 2023 • Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time Matthew 5: 17-37 Beyond the Law

Jesus begins by telling us he has not come to abolish the Law but to fulfill it. The Ten Commandments are still the backbone of our faith. Indeed "...whoever does them and teaches them will be called great in the kingdom of heaven." But in this Gospel, Jesus begins to put some flesh on those bones. It is not enough to follow the letter of the Law. Jesus' followers are called to do more.

In the first part of this reading Jesus seems to offer parents a freeway to the kingdom. It would seem the kingdom is ours if we live by the Ten Commandments and teach our children to do the same. However, as the reading goes on, Jesus tells us that his followers are challenged to do even more. To be Jesus' followers, we are to live beyond the letter of the law. For example, it is not enough to say we won't hurt anyone physically (the fifth commandment). Jesus tells us we are not to hurt anyone emotionally either. We must curb our anger. We shouldn't insult others, and we certainly don't call them names. Finally, if we have hurt someone, we offer a sincere apology and try to make amends.

This is definitely a lesson we teach our children by example. All parents lose their tempers occasionally. Regrettably, when I was raising my children, it was more than occasionally. Fortunately, I learned the importance of saying I was sorry once things had calmed down; and to say it with more than words. I would try to take their hand or sit close to them making sure to look them in the eyes. I would tell them I was wrong, not in the dispute perhaps, but in the way I'd handled it.

As time went on, I learned that by making myself admit I was wrong (something not easy for me to do) I became more aware of what triggered my temper. I learned to walk out of the room before exploding. And because I was modeling the behavior, it was easier for me to make sure my children did the same. Teaching children to admit they are wrong and say they are sorry to a sibling certainly bring us, and them, a little closer to the kingdom.

FAMILY RESPONSE

Ask each person to talk about the things that make them angry. Talk about how they feel when someone tells them they are sorry.

PERSONAL RESPONSE

If losing your temper is a problem, try to figure out the root cause of your anger. There are usually other issues behind a quick temper. Write a prayer for your anger issues, or for those who do.

You are Cordially Invited...



The Gospel for this weekend is a very powerful continuation of what we know as the Sermon on the Mount. In this Gospel, Jesus marries the past with the present and future. Remember that after centuries of oppression, repression and sometimes slavery, the Jewish faithful interpreted the words of the Old Testament prophets to mean that a

mighty warrior was coming to save them. On the mountain, Jesus transforms those ideas, along with cultural beliefs and practices into something much bigger.

Recall that Jesus takes the disciples away from the crowds to redirect them away from the needs of humanity to the mission he has been sent to fulfill - that being the salvation of humanity. Thomas O'Meara in his book, God in the World: A Guide to Karl Rahner's Theology sums it up well, "Jesus the Christ is not the strict teacher of precise ecclesiastical laws and dogmas, but a primal force in humanity; he does not bring to a small community a few moments of salvation, but rather elevates humanity, religion, by grace." He continues, "Jesus, as Son of God, unfolds the mystery of being a human..."

Through Moses and the Ten Commandments, God revealed the "least" or ground level of what it meant to be human. In this first of Jesus' teachings, "[he] begins with the concrete...", that is the Ten Commandments. He tells the disciples that he has not come "to abolish but to fulfill." God's revelation through Moses was but the beginning. God, through his Son, Jesus, affirms these, but then "leads the hearers from external religion to an interior orientation." The Kingdom of God is not about rules and regulations. The Kingdom of God is about mercy and love and justice. Jesus defines those in terms of one's interior orientation or motivation, not by a defined outcome.

And so, one by one, Jesus redefines the Ten Commandments through the lens of the Kingdom of God. As Jesus states, the original is still true, but God, through Jesus, reveals additional layers which address the interior intent of the person, not just the final outcome.

When we do an Examination of Conscience at the end of the day or before the Sacrament of Reconciliation, do we use the "letter of the law" as our frame of reference for defining sin or do we include the interior state of our heart as well? We are called to love others, not because God tells us to do so, but because in allowing the Word of God to expand our hearts, we see God in others and elevate them to be called our brothers and sisters.

And so, I invite you to attend Mass this weekend (and then the next and the next...) If you know someone who has been absent or who is seeking God to come into their life, invite them to join you! Let's come together as a community of brothers and sisters, eager to let God reveal His love, grace and mercy to us made alive in the liturgy! Praying with you always.


