#### **Communal Anointing of the Sick** During Mass March 11 & 12

During his ministry on earth, Jesus had a particular concern for sick people; he healed them not just with a word of power, but also with a human and compassionate touch.

The Anointing of the Sick, like all sacraments, is one way that the church continues the ministry of Jesus. Through it, Christ continues to touch, heal, and comfort. The Letter of James attests that this practice has always been part of ministry: "Is



anyone among you sick? He should summon the presbyters of the church, and they should pray over him and anoint [him] with oil in the name of the church" (5:14).

While the sacrament is often administered individually, the church encourages celebrating it within Mass. Many parishes celebrate it on one or more Sundays each year. The sacrament may be received by a baptized person who "begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age," according to the Catechism of the Catholic Church (1514)—seriously ill, but not necessarily near death—so it may not be apparent that someone receiving the sacrament is ill. The communal celebration reminds us that suffering is part of our human condition and may move us to look on each other with the compassion of Christ the healer. Celebrating this sacrament during Mass also helps us unite our sufferings with Christ's as we recall his body broken and his blood poured out for us.


#### Ash Wednesday Mass



### **Family Ministry**

#### February 19, 2023 • Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time Matthew 5: 38-48 Be Perfect as Your Heavenly Father is Perfect

We find this reading from Matthew about a third of the way into Jesus' Sermon on the Mount. Jesus begins his teaching with the Beatitudes at the beginning of chapter five and for the next three chapters reveals his "code of conduct." This gospel offers some quite difficult challenges. We are told not to seek revenge; to turn the other cheek, and to walk the extra mile. Then comes the most difficult challenge of all. We are told to love our enemies and be perfect as our heavenly father is perfect.

When Jesus tells us to love our enemies that doesn't mean we are expected to have warm, fuzzy feelings toward them. In fact, we don't even have to like them, seek them out, or sit down to dinner with them. We are expected, however, to love them as God loves them. This means respecting them, wishing them no evil, and even praying for them.

This teaching offers us a chance to remind our children that it is not wrong to be angry at some-one. Anger is a feeling and, like all feelings, it is not sinful or wrong. It is what we do with those feeling that is important. It is our actions, angry words, and hurtful thoughts that get us into trouble. Teach your children to count to ten and say a prayer be-fore walking away.

Jesus' second command, to "be perfect," sounds like an impossible challenge. How can we do this? The answer is hidden in the meaning of the word "perfect." The word comes from the Greek *telei-os*, meaning complete or whole. Simply put, Jesus wants us to become the wonderfully unique people we were created to be-and it doesn't take long to realize we'll need lots of help.

It is a lifetime of work to figure out and develop our talents. In the same lifetime, we need to learn which virtues come easily and which need more effort. On the journey of becoming our best selves, it doesn't take long to discover that without God's help, it is easy to get lost.

Only God is perfect. Only God is complete. However, if we are open to God's love, call on God's strength, and do our best to listen and live Jesus' Sermon on the Mount, one day we will get there. We will find our perfection; the person we were created to be, complete within the arms of the Divine.

#### You are Cordially Invited...



The readings for the Sunday liturgy are amazing. Each builds upon the last and together are a wonderful entry into the Season of Lent. In the Old Testament reading of Leviticus, God instructs Moses to remind the people that they are called to be holy. Why? Because God is holy and we are created in his image. When we look in a mirror, what

do we focus on or see? We see our exterior being, complete with all it's human flaws and imperfections But, look closer. You are an image of God. You are loved. What if everyday during this Lent, we look into the mirror and see not the exterior, but the interior heart of our being that God sees? What if we identify a few flaws and imperfections that we see in our heart and work everyday to make it just a little more holy than the last?

Paul, in his first letter to the Corinthians, reminds us of the same. "Brothers and sister: Do you not know that you are the temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwells in you? If anyone destroys God's temple, God will destroy that person, for the temple of God, which you are, is holy." Paul is telling us how much God loves us; to what lengths He will go to protect us. This Lent let us take extra time to sit in God's presence, whether it be praying at home, at Mass, or including Adoration or Stations of the Cross into your routine. And in His presence let us quietly feel the depth of God's love for us. Love is healing. Love transforms. In the book, Forgiveness - A <u>Guide for Prayer</u> by Jacqueline Syrup Bergan and Marie Schwan, CSJ, they remind us that "however transforming and life-giving human love may be, it is transcended by God's love for us."

In the Gospel reading, Jesus plays the trump card for our Lenten journey...and for our life. "You have heard that it was said, You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy. But I say to you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, that you may be children of your heavenly Father..." Bergen and Schwan beautifully

illustrate this thought: "In our human loving we are like blind people, tracing with tentative fingers the unseen features of the face of God. Within our fragile efforts to be consistent and faithful in our loving of each other, we catch a glimpse of the uniquely enduring quality of God's faithful love, a love made human for us in Jesus."



And so, I invite you to attend one of our Ash Wednesday liturgies as we begin the Lenten journey. Follow this by coming to Mass the weekend following (and then the next and the next...) If you know someone who has been absent or who is seeking God to come into their life, invite them to join you! Jesus' journey to the cross was one of love and sacrifice. "The love that shaped his death is the love that heals us, restores us and transforms us." This Lent, let us come together to be healed, to be restored and to be transformed. Praying with you always.


