

New SCRIP Policy & Holiday Hours

As we move deeper into the holiday giving season, the Parish Office staff would like to provide some insight into how the Scrip program will be moving forward in the coming



days and weeks. We are blessed to have a new volunteer Scrip Coordinator, Lori Jiacinto. She is available for drop-in orders on Monday and Friday mornings here in the Parish Office. During these time periods, she'll be processing orders placed online or with the paper forms that are available by the front and back doors of the church. We have been informed that new regulations about handling Scrip orders must be implemented at the time of this release. Scrip sales can only be handled and processed by our approved volunteer staff. Currently, our one and only approved volunteer staff member is Lori. **Parish staff can no longer fill and process Scrip orders, per these new regulations.** We are happy, however to accept your paper order forms/payment and will pass them on to Lori. Also, keep an eye on the Parish calendar to find out which weekends Scrip sales will be available after Saturday/ Sunday Mass.

Scrip sales will not be available during the school holiday break. This runs from Wednesday, December 21st through Wednesday, January 4th. Orders can be placed online during this time period but will not be filled until Friday, January 6th. Any orders filled before Wednesday, December 21st can be picked up any time during regular office hours.

The RaiseRight phone app and RaiseRight.com website are always available for all of your chain store and restaurant needs. These orders may be paid for on the app and an e-gift card is available on your phone or computer within a minute or two.

Lastly, Lori could use a hand or two. At times like these, the Scrip program can be quite the undertaking. If you have a passion for school and church and want to give back, please feel free to reach out to Lori at scrip@allsaintscr.com or call the Parish Office and leave a message. She would be more than happy to get you trained up and added to the schedule.

History of the Rosary

Question:

What is the history of the rosary? Where did this prayer come from? Answer:

Although a longstanding tradition attributed the rosary to Saint Dominic and the Dominican Order, the practice of using beads to count prayers predates the Dominicans by a few hundred years. In fact, it seems that what we now think of as the rosary (which means "garland of roses") was first developed by illiterate peasants and religious brothers and sisters as a way of offering 150 "Our Fathers" to replace the praying of the 150 psalms in the Divine Office.

The practice of reciting 150 Hail Marys (which was later subdivided into 15 decades of 10 Hail Marys) arose during the late Middle Ages. Devotion to the rosary began to flourish in the nineteenth century, especially as new devotions to Mary began to spread throughout Europe and the New World. An annual liturgical celebration of Our Lady of the Rosary was introduced into the Church calendar in 1573 and it has been observed on the date of October 7 since 1913.

In the apostolic letter On the Most Holy Rosary, Pope Saint John Paul II not only added five new mysteries to the traditional fifteen, but he also reminded Catholics that the rosary is, at its core, an opportunity to go deeper into the life of Jesus: "The rosary, though clearly Marian in character, is at heart a Christocentric prayer ... It has all the depth of the Gospel message in its entirety, of which it can be said to be a compendium. It is an echo of Mary's prayer, her perennial Magnificat ... With the rosary, the Christian people sit at the school of Mary and are led to contemplate the beauty of the face of Christ and to experience the depths of his love" (no. 1). ©LPi

Family Ministry

January 1, 2023 • Mary, Mother of God• Luke 2: 16-21 Treasuring and Pondering

Just as people come to visit parents and their new baby in our culture, so it happened in Jesus' time and culture. However, Luke tells us it was strangers who first came to meet the baby Jesus. The shepherds came with an unexpected and wondrous tale of the angels' joyful news about his birth.

Consider what an extraordinary nine-month period Mary experienced. First the angel Gabriel showed up out of the blue with the news that she had been chosen to carry God's son. After she assented, she had to face Joseph with the news of her pregnancy and then endure the gossip and probable hostility of her community. Then she had to make an unexpected, perilous, late-term journey to Bethlehem and give birth amidst animals. How much she had to ponder during those months!

In today's reading Mary is given more to ponder. Shepherds, poor folks who were looked down upon for their occupation, showed up unannounced gushing about the baby and who he was. What they heard from the angel and repeated to Mary and Joseph echoed what Mary had heard from the angel Gabriel—that her baby was destined to be the Messiah, the one chosen to save his people. Mary, we are told, "treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart." Of course, she couldn't fully understand with her rational mind what it all meant and how Jesus would grow into his identity, but we get the sense that she marveled in awe that she got to play a part in the mystery. On this feast, may we honor Mary by letting go of our desire to under-stand and know ahead of time how our children will develop. Instead, let us embrace the unknowing and treasure in our hearts the unfolding of our children's lives

Happy New Year! In many places of the world, the New Year signifies a new beginning. Not only of a new calendar year, but for many, an opportunity to begin a journey toward a new personal goal. We commonly call these New Year's Resolutions. The challenge, for many of us, is that we don't do the necessary preparations needed to successfully complete the goal. Most of us can't just suddenly become a

different person with different habits - it takes work before, during and after to achieve the desired results.

As we reflected on the Christmas readings from last week, we saw that God carefully laid the foundation for Jesus to break into our world and be the salvation for humankind. One of the key elements of God's preparation is evident in all three readings for this Sunday; that being, God's mercy. Throughout the Old Testament, we witness God's mercy over and over. Despite our human sinfulness, God showed his mercy until "...the fullness of time had come [and] God sent his Son."

During Jesus' lifetime on earth, God continued his work of saving grace. Jesus proclaimed God's Word and brought it to life through prayer and healing. This was done "to ransom those under the law, so that we might receive adoption as sons [and daughters]." And when his earthly ministry was complete, God sacrificed his Son, so that the fullness of the relationship between God and humankind was restored.

Jesus returned to the people for a short while after his Resurrection to continue to strengthen the renewed bond between God and humankind. Even after Jesus was assumed into heaven, "God sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, crying out, 'Abba, Father!'" The Holy Spirit is still present today, but like Mary, we need to say, "I am the handmaiden of the Lord. May it be done unto me according to your word." God is always present, but he does not force us into a relationship with him. I invite all of us to reflect on the depth of that kind of love. Can we learn to love like that this year? Can we come to Mass more often than not, in order to strengthen our efforts and to receive God's mercy when we fall short?

And so, I invite you to attend Mass this weekend (and then the next and the next...) If you know someone who has been absent, invite them to join you! Come, know God's merciful love in a real and concrete way! Praying with you always.



Iowa Heartlanders Faith Night




