### **New SCRIP Policy & Holiday Hours**

As we move deeper into the holiday giving season, the Parish Office staff would like to provide some insight into how the Scrip program will be moving forward in the coming

days and weeks. We are blessed to have a new volunteer Scrip Coordinator, Lori Jiacinto. She is available for drop-in orders on Monday and Friday mornings here in the Parish Office. During these time periods, she'll be processing orders placed online or with the paper forms that are available by the front and back doors of the church. We have been informed that new regulations about handling Scrip orders must be implemented at the time of this release. Scrip sales can only be handled and processed by our approved volunteer staff. Currently, our one and only approved volunteer staff member is Lori. **Parish staff can no longer fill and process Scrip orders, per these new regulations.** We are happy, however to accept your paper order forms/payment and will pass them on to Lori. Also, keep an eye on the Parish calendar to find out which weekends Scrip sales will be available after Saturday/ Sunday Mass.

The RaiseRight phone app and RaiseRight.com website are always available for all of your chain store and restaurant needs. These orders may be paid for on the app and an e-gift card is available on your phone or computer within a minute or two. Lastly, Lori could use a hand or two. At times like these, the Scrip program can be quite the undertaking. She would be more than happy to get you trained up and added to the schedule.

# **Christian Experience Weekend**

The Christian Experience Weekend, or CEW, is a renewal weekend for adults, designed to enable them to more deeply "experience" themselves and their relationship to God and



the Christian community. Personal involvement of each participant is essential, as the content of the weekend progresses from the awareness of self-worth, to relationship with God and others, and then to Christian mission. The weekend involves large and small group processes, and individual reflection. The core of the CEW is in the process which occurs as the weekend unfolds.

In Cedar Rapids, there is a separate weekend each year for women and men. Both retreats are held at La Salle Middle School. The women's weekend will be February 10 - 12, 2023. The men's weekend will be February 24 - 26, 2023. The weekend begins on Friday evening and ends on Sunday afternoon.

# January 8, 2023 • Epiphany of the Lord Matthew 2: 1-12 Little Epiphanies

The story of the Magi is a familiar one. Wise men from the East follow a star, believing it will lead them to the newborn King of the Jews. They make their way to Bethlehem, the place prophets have said the Messiah would be born. Once there, they find the infant Jesus and humble themselves before him. They offer gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh.

The wise men headed for Jerusalem, the capital city, on their quest for the newborn King. Imagine their surprise when they are sent to the small town of Bethlehem, to a tiny little house where they find a poor woman holding her child. I'm sure they must have been a pause before they experienced their epiphany. Then they finally had their "aha" moment and understood. This child was indeed destined for greatness, but he would not follow the usual path to kingship.

The word *epiphany* means a sudden flash of in-sight. If we pay attention, life can be filled with these sudden flashes. I remember one particular flash that happened to me several months after I was married. It too involved the search for a king, well perhaps only a Prince Charming. When I married Roger I was pretty naive. I bestowed on him all sorts of impossible qualities. Once the wedding dress was packed away and we were comfortably settled into our apartment, I began to face reality. There were no insights yet, only dirty socks, grumpy mornings and a man who looked rather thin without his armor and white horse. What happened to my prince?

The answer came not in one grand insightful moment like the arrival of the wise men. My epiphanies were smaller, and spread over time. I remember Roger's worried face as he stroked my hair when our first son was born. I can see him rushing into action when our son James fell off his skateboard and lost his peripheral vision, and when his brother Phillip fell twelve feet from a neighbor's tree. I remember the look on his face when he saw our first grandchild.

After forty-three years of marriage and a thou-sand small epiphanies, I can only thank God for the gallant young prince I married who has followed his own path to greatness.

# You are Cordially Invited...



Today we celebrate the Epiphany of the Lord. It comes from the Greek word *epiphainen*, a verb that means "to shine upon" or "to make known." In the Gospel reading, Jesus was revealed to the magi, who traveled far and brought expensive gifts to honor him. From the time of the prophets, a ruler was promised to the people; a ruler so amazing that the

status of the Jewish nation would be raised mightily. "Nations shall walk by your light and kings by your shining radiance." That is quite a promise to hold onto for many centuries. Do we understand that level of hope? In today's world of constant information and sometimes misinformation, it is so easy to become weary and lose hope. As Israel and Jerusalem were conquered over and over again, it was the prophets who kept this hope alive and in front of the people until God broke into our human world as a tiny babe.

In the early part of Jesus' public ministry he focuses on the Jewish people. As his ministry unfolded, God's healing grace was "made known" to those outside of the Jewish community. Paul calls attention to this and the manner in which "the mystery was made know to [him]." Paul continues, "It was not made known to people in other generations, as it has now been revealed...that the Gentiles are co heirs, members of the same body, and copartners in the promise in Christ Jesus..." We [members of a church] sometimes think we are members of an exclusive club and that Christ is only available to us. Paul reminds us that God is much bigger than our human mind can comprehend. God broke into our human world to reveal the fullness of humanity through his Son, Jesus Christ. In the book, The Incarnation, there is a paragraph that really spoke to me this Christmas as I pondered this revelation of God's grace through an unlikely ruler of the baby infant, Jesus Christ. In the book, the theologian Schillebeeckx is quoted, "[Faith/hope] is not just a matter of will and effort and clear thinking. Sometimes grace simply surprises us, meets us in our human experience in a compelling and unanticipated way. Maybe it is a moment of meaning and happiness, a flash of transforming joy, a 'music of the soul' that reaches out to the God who has already reached down to us. And we may at some odd moment discover that, in our own heart of hearts, we believe a great deal more than we thought we did - an affirmation that could grant a glimpse of Christmas hope to many anxious and doubting hearts."

And so, I invite you to attend Mass this weekend (and then the next and the next...) If you know someone who has been absent, invite them to join you! Come and know the fullness of hope!






