

We have been informed that new regulations about handling Scrip orders must be implemented at the time of this release. Scrip sales can only be handled and processed by our approved volunteer staff. Currently, our one and only approved volunteer staff member is Lori. Parish staff can no longer fill and process Scrip orders, per these new regulations. We are happy, however to accept your paper order forms/payment and will pass them on to Lori. Also, keep an eye on the Parish calendar to find out which weekends Scrip sales will be available after Saturday/ Sunday Mass.



## Christian Experience Weekend

The Christian Experience Weekend, or CEW, is a renewal weekend for adults, designed to enable them to more deeply "experience" themselves and their relationship to God and



the Christian community. Personal involvement of each participant is essential, as the content of the weekend progresses from the awareness of self-worth, to relationship with God and others, and then to Christian mission. The weekend involves large and small group processes, and individual reflection. The core of the CEW is in the process which occurs as the weekend unfolds.

In Cedar Rapids, there is a separate weekend each year for women and men. Both retreats are held at La Salle Middle School. The women's weekend will be February 10 - 12, 2023. The men's weekend will be February 24 - 26, 2023. The weekend begins on Friday evening and ends on Sunday afternoon.

## Novena for Haiti

The Haiti Committee invites everyone to participate in a **Novena for Haiti** and especially for the Notre Dame de Lourdes community. A Novena is a nine day period of private or public prayer to obtain special graces, to implore special favors, or make special petitions. (Novena is derived from the Latin *novem*,

meaning nine.) As the definition suggests, the Novena has always had more of a sense of urgency and neediness.

Due to the living conditions in Haiti, the Haiti Committee is unable to take the normal January Mission Trip. Instead, we will pray a Novena for Haiti each day starting January 23<sup>rd</sup> through January 31<sup>st</sup>. These dates coincide with a similar time that the Mission Trip would normally be taken. Parishioners are invited to participate in the Novena in one of several ways.

First, the Novena will be led by a member of the Haiti Committee on Facebook Live on the All Saints Parish Facebook page each day at 9:00 am.

Secondly, if you are unable to pray along on Facebook Live you may pray on your own at that time.

Lastly, if you are unable at all to pray at 9:00 am, then praying the Novena at a time convenient to you is strongly encouraged!

## **Family Ministry**

## January 15, 2023 • Second Sunday of Ordinary Time John 1: 29-34 Living Sacrifice

Our last reading was Matthew's account of Jesus' baptism. This week we read about the same event from John's Gospel. The evangelist John wrote his Gospel decades after the other three evangelists, and so reflects a more developed theology.

John the Baptist tells us that Jesus is not just the Son of God, but the Lamb of God. John is recalling the paschal lamb of the first Passover. Like Moses at the first Passover, Jesus brings his people from slavery to freedom. However, in both cases it took great faithfulness and much sacrifice to reach that freedom. For the Israelites, it was 40 hard years in the desert. For Jesus, it was the sacrifice of his life on Calvary.

Parents know all about sacrifice—giving up the freedom to come and go as we please, to enjoy quiet weekends, or to sleep eight hours a night. We learn to live without new cars or two-week vacations. Sacrifice is just a way of life for parents. It is also the way of life for Christians.

Our acts of sacrifice also need to extend to people beyond our household family. We are asked to give from our bounty and to share our livelihood with those who are in need: they are family, too. Teach your children to sacrifice. We do our youngsters a disservice if we do not help them to give of themselves, and to give generously. When they receive a new toy, help them go through their old toys and choose something they can give away. When it's time to get new school clothes, let them help you pack away last year's clothes and talk about who you might pass them on to. You might even consider buying new outfit(s) for other children in need.

Begin each day as a family by offering God all of the day's big and little sacrifices. Ask in return for the freedom to love as Jesus loves with his patient, generous heart.

## You are Cordially Invited...



It is always very interesting to sit with the readings and wait to see where God is planting mustard seeds. This week it is the Old Testament reading from Isaiah that has captured both my heart and my imagination. The last week of Advent, the app Hallow invited its listeners into imaginative prayer - that is - putting yourself into the scene as it is proclaimed. It can be a powerful form of prayer.

Imagine yourself sitting with God and the two of you are talking. God reminds you that he created you to be unique in the world; both to do his will, but also as the way that he shows and expresses hope and glory in our world today through you. He tenderly gazes at you. He has known you forever, since he loved you into being as you were created in your mother's womb. He has done so in order that his Word will be proclaimed through you, so that the lost sheep are brought back into the fold. Your heart is made full and completed at his words. Your response is one of great joy: "I am made glorious in the sight of the LORD, and my God is now my strength!" And then it's almost as if God tilts his head as he ponders further what more He might invite you to consider. For remember that we are created in His image; that God is always there, we have but to answer as does the psalmist today, "Here am I, Lord; I come to do your will." And at that response, God invites us to much more than being a light to our own inner circle of life. He invites us to be, "a light to the nations, that [God's] salvation may reach to the ends of the earth."

And so, I invite you to attend Mass this weekend (and then the next and the next...) If you know someone who has been absent or who is seeking God to come into their life, invite them to join you! Here am I, Lord; I come to do your will! Praying with you always.

If you've ever really, really needed another person's help, you know that "showing up" means more than saying: "Let me know what you need." It means saying: "I'm already here. Tell me what to do."

So often, I pay lip service to the idea of submission. "What do you want, God?" I ask, and I secretly hope that what He wants isn't one of those things that I'm not willing to give.

What if I really strove to "show up" for God? What if I was ready to give what He asks of me, whatever it is?

Six eyeballs staring at me like I had two heads! If I couch my request in terms of volunteerism, I have suggested that they don't have any real ownership in this matter. Perhaps they do sometimes think that their mother and I are simply hired hands to take care of them, but rest assured, I have not received a paycheck for services rendered lately.

When you and I give a donation of blood, we volunteer our time and blood to the Red Cross. The Red Cross does not employ most of us, nor do we own a part of the Red Cross. We can only volunteer ourselves for the cause.







