New SCRIP Policy

We are blessed to have a new volunteer Scrip Coordinator, Lori Jiacinto. She is available for drop-in orders on Monday and Friday mornings here in the Parish Office. During these time



periods, she'll be processing orders placed online or with the paper forms that are available by the front and back doors of the church.

We have been informed that new regulations about handling Scrip orders must be implemented at the time of this release. Scrip sales can only be handled and processed by our approved volunteer staff. Currently, our one and only approved volunteer staff member is Lori. **Parish staff can no longer fill and process Scrip orders, per these new regulations.** We are happy, however to accept your paper order forms/payment and will pass them on to Lori. Also, keep an eye on the Parish calendar to find out which weekends Scrip sales will be available after Saturday/ Sunday Mass.

The RaiseRight phone app and RaiseRight.com website are always available for all of your chain store and restaurant needs. These orders may be paid for on the app and an e-gift card is available on your phone or computer within a minute or two. Lastly, Lori could use a hand or two. At times like these, the Scrip program can be quite the undertaking. 2022 was a year of financial uncertainty for many. All Saints Church is not exempt from this. We wanted to express our extreme gratitude for your very generous Christmas financial gifts. We exceeded our goal of \$125,000, receiving \$139,000. Your generosity at Christmas is crucial in maintaining our cashflow to pay for our direct and overhead costs. For the 2022/23 fiscal year (7/1/2022-6/30/2023) we budgeted a total of \$1.4 million for Stewardship, and we've raised \$715,000 (as of 12/31/2022). Your generosity is the deciding factor in how we can maintain our building and grow our ministries. Thank you for all that you do and provide for All Saints. We are a stronger community with your participation.

Novena for Haiti

The Haiti Committee invites everyone to participate in a **Novena for Haiti** and especially for the Notre Dame de Lourdes community. A Novena is a nine day period of private or public prayer to obtain special graces, to implore special favors, or make special petitions. (Novena is derived from the Latin *novem*,

meaning nine.) As the definition suggests, the Novena has always had more of a sense of urgency and neediness.

Due to the living conditions in Haiti, the Haiti Committee is unable to take the normal January Mission Trip. Instead, we will pray a Novena for Haiti each day starting January 23rd through January 31st. These dates coincide with a similar time that the Mission Trip would normally be taken. LEARNING WITH A HIGHER PURPOSE

Family Ministry

January 22, 2023 • Third Sunday in Ordinary Time Matthew 4: 12-23 Repent

After John the Baptist is beheaded, Jesus retreats to Galilee, closer to home. Remember, John was Jesus' cousin; they probably grew up together. When John was murdered, it must have affected Jesus deeply. Finally, he leaves Nazareth and moves closer to the Sea of Galilee, to a town called Capernaum. He begins his public preaching and gathers his apostles.

Jesus begins his public ministry by announcing the coming of the kingdom. He tells us it's time to repent. Remember, the kingdom of God is not just the heaven we hope to get to after we die. The kingdom of God is also with us here, right now. The kingdom is any place or time where God's love is present and active.

Jesus was able to claim the kingdom was at hand because he brought the kingdom. Any place or time Jesus was present, there was the kingdom. As Christians, we are asked to be Christ today and bring the kingdom to our own time and place. That means we take Jesus' words to heart. We look at ways we can change for the better. We need to adjust how we act or how we react.

Think about what needs to change in your everyday family life for the kingdom to reign in your home. Begin with the surface things. Is the pace too fast? Is the noise level too high? Is there a constant attitude of "I'll get you back!"? We know that no amount of coaxing or nagging will change someone else if he or she isn't ready to change. And so as the grown-up in the household, change will have to begin with you.

Remember, with God's help, we can change how we act and respond. With God's help, we can become our best selves. And with God's help, the changes in you will bring out the best in others.

You are Cordially Invited...



Have you ever wondered about who Jesus called to be his group of disciples and why he chose them? I have. Today's Gospel allows us to insert ourselves into the story in an imaginative way.

Picture yourself, a fisherman, going about your usual business for the day and Jesus comes up to you saying, " Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men." My first reaction would be to look all around me. To

whom was Jesus speaking? It couldn't be me! I am one of the lowest professions at the time, uneducated and therefore do not have the skill of languages to speak to others. I am a simple person and have no authority with others. But Jesus is looking squarely at me. It is me he is asking to follow him and spread the Word. God forms all of us for a purpose. In love, God does not force his will upon us, though; rather he seeks to draw us closer to our true purpose through a series of invitations and revelations. In the chapter "Being and Doing" of Thomas Merton's book No Man is an Island, we read, "Why do we spend our lives striving to be something we would never want to be, if we only knew what we wanted? Why do we waste our time doing things which, if we only stopped to think about it are just the opposite of what we were made for?"

If we marry today's Gospel with this thought from Thomas Merton, we can believe that every apostle was invited by Jesus to the life for which they were made. I believe this is why they were able to leave everything they knew and follow Jesus. This doesn't mean they had an easy life in fulfillment of saying yes to God's calling, but none of us are promised that. James Martin, SJ in his book Becoming Who You Are states, "Jesus was fully human and fully divine...[we] tend to neglect his real humanity - which means not knowing the future, slowly figuring out one's calling and living by faith." And when we live by faith, say yes to God's invitations and actively discern His revelations, then we grow more confident in our own skin and grow closer to becoming our true authentic selves. There is an inner peace that comes with this that grounds us even in the worst of storms.

And so, I invite you to attend Mass this weekend (and then the next and the next...) If you know someone who has been absent or who is seeking God to come into their life, invite them to join you! Together, let us say yes to God's invitation to work with Him to Form Disciples, Love Him and Serve Others.




