

The weekend involves large and small group processes, and individual reflection. The core of the CEW is in the process which occurs as the weekend unfolds.

In Cedar Rapids, there is a separate weekend each year for women and men. Both retreats are held at La Salle Middle School. The women's weekend will be February 10 - 12, 2023. The men's weekend will be February 24 - 26, 2023. The weekend begins on Friday evening and ends on Sunday afternoon.

Novena for Haiti



January 29, 2023 • Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time Matthew 5: 1-12 Blessed Are We

When Jesus sees the crowds who are following him, he goes up a mountain. He wants to make sure everyone can see and hear him as he tells them how they can find happiness.

Moses went up a mountain to receive the Ten Commandments, and in Matthew's Gospel, Jesus went up a mountain to give us the Beatitudes. The Ten Commandments are a set of laws to help us live in harmony with God's love. The Beatitudes are broader and more subtle. They offer a vision and suggest a self-giving attitude that goes beyond the Commandments.

The Beatitudes talk about the poor and those who mourn, those who are hungry for justice, those who are merciful and peacemakers, those who are pure in heart and those who are persecuted. Jesus tells us that all of these people will be happy. They will be blessed. How can this be?

Perhaps Jesus is just reminding us that life is difficult. Each of us will face our own hardships. We need to remember that nothing—not poverty or deep loss or suffering, not the worst injustice—can triumph over us. Jesus offers his own strength and endurance, his assurance that we will not be alone. We are blessed. We are gifted not only with faith but hope.

The Beatitudes ask us to be meek, not the doormat sort of meek, but the biblical idea of meek—tolerant and unassuming. We are to be poor in spirit. Money and possessions should no own us. We are to be peacemakers and hunger and thirst after justice. The Beatitudes offer a positive way to respond to difficult life experiences. They encourage us to live in a self-possessed, positive way. Finding the kingdom of God is not just about keeping the Ten Commandments; it's keeping the commandments with the right attitudes—the Beatitudes.

Talk to your family about what difficulties they are facing this week. Encourage each other to be tolerant. Pray together to find ways your family can be peacemakers.

You are Cordially Invited...



Both the in Gospel according to St. Matthew and in Paul's 1st letter to the Corinthians, we are reminded that God often does the opposite of the way man would live and choose. God chooses the low and the humble. God preaches kindness, mercy and peace.

Picture yourself as one of the disciples up in the mountain with Jesus. Now just prior to this, Jesus had been very busy in Galilee. He had been teaching in the synagogues, proclaiming God's kingdom, and curing every illness and disease among the people. As his fame grew, so did the size of the crowds. Jesus was tired, but I believe that he also sensed that the disciples were getting a false picture of him and what his ministry was about. In language that we understand, the disciples were beginning to feel that they were "hot stuff." Jesus may have retreated to the mountains, not just for some rest, but to get the disciples away from the adoration and fawning of the crowd so that he could remind the disciples what the true mission was and how they were supposed to be. Notice that I say "be" and not "act." Thomas Merton in his book New Seeds of Contemplation writes, "Every one of us is shadowed by an illusory person; the false self." It colors how we act and present ourself to the world. But more often than not, this is not who you truly long to be. There is conflict between the false self that we project and the true self that we were created by God to be. Merton continues, "Thus I use up my whole life in the desire for pleasures and the thirst for experiences, for power, honor, knowledge and love, to clothe this false self and construct its nothingness into something objectively real. And I wind experiences around myself and cover myself with pleasures and glory like bandages in order to make myself perceptible to myself and to the world, as if I were an invisible body that could only become visible when something visible covered its surface."

In proclaiming what we know as the beatitudes, Jesus strips all of those bandages from the disciples' eyes. And every time we read or hear them, it strips those same bandages from us. The nakedness of pure simplicity and goodness is what God calls us to, not the bandages of fame, money and power in which we wrap ourselves. Sometimes when I first sit down in the pew and get on my knees, I feel this wonderful sense of relief and of calm. For it is on my knees before God that I can be my true self, ask for forgiveness and strength and let myself be embraced in His loving arms. It is only with God and in God that we can restore our true selves. And so, I invite you to attend Mass this weekend (and then the next and the next...) If you know someone who has been absent or who is seeking God to come into their life, invite them to join you! Together, let us take a step closer to unwinding the bandages and for letting the light and goodness of our true selves be a little more visible.
