Budget Update 5/31/2023



Thank you for your continuing financial generosity.

We reached 89% of the Easter collection goal of \$70,000.00. We are at a current total of \$62,417.09. We have surpassed our overall Stewardship financial goal of 1,404,250.00, for a current total of \$1,529,337.11. Thank you for your generous financial gifts. We budgeted to have an overall financial growth of \$10,815.76, we actually have financially grown by \$405,684.68 with one month to go. This has allowed us to add and upgrade some lighting, replace some failed windows, and offer our staff an increase in compensation to keep pace with inflation. We are very grateful.

June is traditionally one of our most challenging months for finances, last year we lost \$172,899.49 in the month of June. It helps to keep the Stewardship Budget income strong.

You Are Cordially Invited...



Welcome to the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ. The discussion pertaining to the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist has been going on for a long time. As Catholics, our belief in the real presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist is what sets us apart from many other faith traditions. But what does “real presence” mean? During the course of my research, I found words of wisdom from a few sources which greatly aided my understanding of this mystery.

Thomas Aquinas (1225-1274) in his best known work *Summa Theologica* states: “In the Holy Eucharist, Christ is present whole and entire (body, blood, soul, and Godhead or divinity) under the appearances or accidentals of bread and wine. The words of consecration (which constitute the form of the sacrament of Holy Eucharist) bring the living Christ, God and man, truly present. The words, ‘This is my body,’ bring Christ’s body truly present. This is Christ’s living body; therefore, it has its blood, its soul, and the Godhead which assumed this body. The words, ‘This is my blood,’ bring Christ’s blood truly present. This is Christ’s living blood; therefore it is in its body, with the soul, and the divinity or Godhead which assumed this blood. Thus, the whole Christ is present under the appearances of bread, and the whole Christ is present under the appearances of wine, and the whole Christ is present under both appearances together.” Thomas continues to clarify the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist: “Christ’s body is not in this sacrament as a body is in a place. For a body in a place is there according to its external dimensions, and these make the body commensurate with the dimensions of the place it occupies. But Christ’s body is not present in the Eucharist according to external dimensions. His body is present quantitatively, not in the manner of the external accidentals of measurement and dimension, but according to the manner of substance, which is complete in any quantity, large or small, that exists.”

The Second Vatican Council in *Lumen Gentium* (1964) proclaimed the Eucharistic sacrifice is “the source and summit of Christian life.” When Pope John Paul II wrote his Encyclical Letter on the Eucharist in 2003 he further defined this saying our belief that Christ was, is and will be is uniquely in the Eucharist. “In this gift Jesus Christ entrusted to his Church the perennial making present of the paschal mystery. With it he brought about a mysterious “oneness in time” between that Triduum and the passage of the centuries...The Church has received the Eucharist from Christ her Lord not as one gift – however precious – among so many others, but as the gift par excellence, for it is the gift of himself, of his person in his sacred humanity, as well as the gift of his saving work.”

Avery Dulles in a lecture given in 2005 talked about the challenge of today’s Gospel: “At the very outset it must be said that the Church believes the real presence as a matter of faith, simply because it is taught by Christ, as attested by Scripture and tradition. Jesus said clearly, ‘This is my body ... this is my blood’, and in controversy with the Jews He insisted that He was not just using metaphors. ‘My flesh is food indeed, and my blood is drink indeed. He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood abides in me, and I in him’. (Jn 6:55-56) Many of the disciples found this a hard saying and parted from His company, but Jesus did not moderate His statements to win them back.” Dulles goes on to quote the Council of Trent as saying that Christ is contained in the Eucharist “truly, really and substantially.”

Let’s pray over and ponder these three adverbs this week as we continue to form ourselves as disciples of Christ. And so, I invite you to Mass this weekend (and then the next and the next...) If you know someone who has been absent or who is seeking God to come into their life, invite them to join you! God has given and continues to give us so much. Love God-Serve Others-Form Disciples.

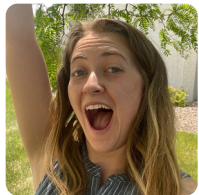

June 11, 2023 • Body & Blood of Christ • John 6:51–58

The Living Bread

Jesus has just fed thousands of people with a few loaves and fishes. He tells the people waiting for him the next day not to follow him because he was able to provide bread. He tells them not to work for bread that will perish but for the food that will last eternally.

The Eucharist, the Mass, is a memorial of Christ's great sacrifice celebrated at a meal. How can we help our children understand the great blessings of the Mass unless they are familiar with what a celebratory meal is like?

I remember a joke I heard years ago. "How does a suburban mom from Centerville call her kids for dinner?" Answer: "Everybody in the car!" Its truth resonates in so many of our families. I heard a statistic a few years ago that the average family sits down together for only two meals per week with everyone present.

The statistic is not surprising when we consider what busy and complicated lives we live. Extended work hours, long commutes, and a barrage of activities for children make time a precious commodity. And yet spending time together is one of the factors used to judge a strong, healthy family. Another quality is commitment.

One way of showing our commitment to family is by taking the time to have at least one special family meal a week. Make it a celebration. Remember, it is not the food that makes it special (pizza is fine); it is having everyone sitting around the table together.

Try to make a ritual out of such occasions. Light a candle in the center and hold hands for a blessing. Make sure the cell phones are silenced and the television and social media are turned off. Make it a rule that no one leaves the table until everyone is finished. Allow only positive, affirming conversation: no preaching, no scolding. A good conversation starter might be to ask everyone to share what was the best thing that happened to him or her that day (or week).

Time spent around the dinner table is special. Think about all the time Jesus spent in table fellowship with his disciples. He is no less present at our table. All of family mealtime is sacred, as much a blessing as the prayer it began with.
