

You Are Cordially Invited...



Welcome to the Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time. I recently repurchased a book that I have given away several times. Can You Drink the Cup? by Henri J.M. Nouwen keeps finding its way into my spiritual life when I seem to need it most. It is not a comforting book; it's message is forthright and challenging. And yet, it is the message of Ordinary Time; "a time in which the mystery of Christ is called to penetrate ever more deeply into history" and into our own lives. Last week we talked about becoming laborers; sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ to bring His message of love and salvation to a world full of fear and persecution. Even though I have not read the book in a few years, as I read the passages from Jeremiah and Matthew I

immediately knew the resource that would echo the relationship between fear/persecution and the hope/love that only God can bring.

Recalling his enthusiastic, but naive entry into the priesthood, Henri Nouwen calls us to be aware of the world and the cost of being a disciple for Christ. "I came out of [seminary] full of love for Jesus, and a full desire to bring the Gospel to the world, but without being fully aware that not everybody was waiting for me." Jesus speaks to the Twelve in today's Gospel, encouraging them to "speak in the light" and "proclaim on the housetops." Sagely he cautions them to not fear mortal death, but to "be afraid of the one who can destroy both soul and body." Evil is real and often comes in very pretty and appealing packaging. Not unlike practice makes perfect, evil has become more cunning as history has evolved. As we live to Love God-Serve Others-Form Disciples, it is time to ponder this question: can we drink the cup as Jesus did? Fr. Henri recalls the moment when he first did this: "Suddenly the words, 'Can you drink the cup?' pierced my heart like the sharp spear of a hunter. I knew at that moment - as a flash of insight - that taking this question seriously would radically change [my] life. It is the question that has the power to crack open a hardened heart and to lay bare the tendons of the spiritual life." It is so easy to mouth the right words while our actions give lie to every syllable.

As Henri Nouwen discerned this question, he found that a response comes from breaking the action of drinking from the cup into three parts: holding the cup; lifting the cup, and drinking the cup. Ordinary Time is about holding the cup. "Just living a life is not enough. We must know what we are living. A life that is not reflected upon is not worth living...Reflection is essential for growth, development and change. It is the unique power of the human person." On one hand, our world has become fearful and uncomfortable with silence. When was the last time that we sat quietly with God and let Him speak to us? When was the last time that we silently pondered our gifts and how we might return those two-fold or three-fold to the Lord? Everything we have is from God and there is nothing about us that is hidden from God. "Holding the cup of life means looking critically at what we are living. This requires great courage, because when we start looking we might be terrified by what we see." And on the other hand, our world has become too comfortable with silence. Every once in a great while I will scroll on Facebook. I am usually terrified by what I see and read (LOL!) But just the other day, I read a post that struck me as true: "The world is not going badly solely due to the wickedness of the bad, but also because of the apathy of the good."

What gave Jesus the courage to drink the cup: to both ponder and live life and yet, speak and live life boldly for God? Henri Nouwen proposes that "Beyond all the abandonment experienced in body and mind, Jesus still had a spiritual bond with the one he called Abba...Jesus did not throw the cup away in despair. No, he kept it in his hands, willing to drink it to the dregs. This was not a show of willpower, staunch determination, or great heroism. This was a deep spiritual yes to Abba, the lover of his wounded heart." Who else knows every hair (or lack thereof!) on our head? Who else counts us as most worthy such that He sacrificed His Son for us to win back salvation for us? The answer is Abba, the lover of our own wounded hearts.

And so, I invite you to Mass (and then the next and the next...) If you know someone who has been absent or who is seeking God to come into their life, invite them to join you! This week sit with a cup in your hand-what is it filled with at this point in your life? What would you like it to be filled with? Relationships are a two-way street. Listen to God, talk to God and with every 'amen' we say at Mass, feel the spiritual bond between Abba and us become stronger. *Love God-Serve Others-Form Disciples.*

The Gift of Faith

Before the apostles leave to begin ministering in the world, Jesus warns them that there will be people who will hate them and try to hurt them. He tells them to fear no one, and reminds them that God is aware even of a fallen sparrow.

I want my children to share my faith. Not because they will be damned if they don't, but because faith can get them through pretty much anything. When you are certain that God is not just with you but in you and believe you are taking the Spirit in with every breath, you can't help but feel invincible in a healthy, non-destructive sort of way.

I'm not saying you can leap from rooftops or stop a bullet in midair, but with faith in an ever-loving God, it is easier to feel like you can face any obstacle or enemy and know you are going to be okay. Consider the early martyrs who walked into amphitheaters singing hymns, ready for death, or modern martyrs who worked with the poor in developing countries and were shot to death for their efforts.

Understand I am not saying they didn't feel fear when they saw the lions or faced the gunmen. I am saying they could breathe in the Spirit of strength and courage and know that ultimately they would be fine. Death is not the end. They were invincible, and would live forever in God.

Witness this kind of faith to your children. Try this little exercise with them when they are hurt or afraid. Hold their hands and teach them to take in slow, deep breaths. Ask them to picture themselves breathing in God's strong, all-powerful Spirit, breathing in God's strength and courage. Ask them to consider their situation and decide what the worst thing that can happen is. Remind them that no matter how things turn out, God will always be with them; God is always in them.

In this world of escalating fear and uncertainty, you will be teaching them a life skill that will help them cope with whatever the future may bring.

FAMILY RESPONSE


You don't have to be facing a particular hurt or fear to practice praying with every breath. Ask everyone to hold hands, close their eyes, and picture a thick silver fog in front of them. Tell them the fog is the Holy Spirit—the Spirit of strength and courage. Slowly breathe the Spirit in and out. Remind them that Jesus said he would be with us forever. End with an Our Father.

PERSONAL RESPONSE

Try the breathing prayer yourself. Think of something you are worried or concerned about. Write down how you felt before, during, and after the prayer. What do you want to remember from last week? What are you looking forward to next week? What are your concerns?
