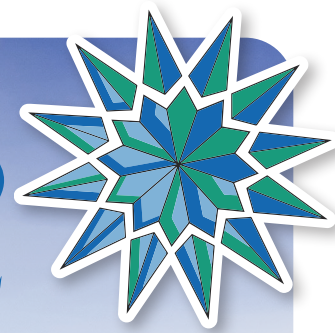

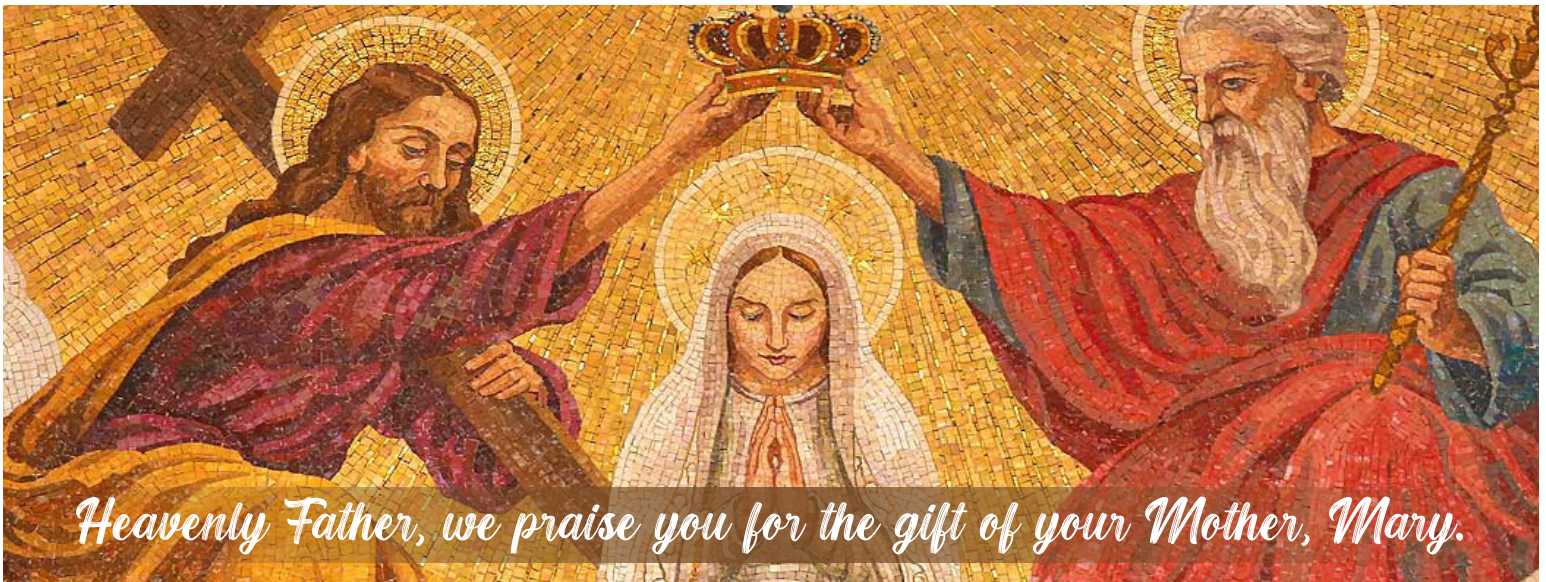

You Are Cordially Invited...



Welcome to the Fifth Sunday of Easter. Earlier this year, the Archdiocese asked the Pastoral Councils of all parishes to complete a vitality study. The study at All Saints will be completed by the end of May. The purpose of the study is to conduct a self-evaluation leading to the creation of measurable goals for the next 3-5 years. As we have honestly evaluated our efforts and look to the future, we have the opportunity to also measure ourselves by the yardstick of our Mission Statement: Love God-Serve Others-Form Disciples.

Stated in 1 Peter and given special emphasis in the “Dogmatic Constitution of the Church - Lumen Gentium” we are given a vocation at our baptism. We are “a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people of his own.” Why? “...so that [we] may announce the praises of him who called [us] out of darkness into his wonderful light.” Simply put we are called to Love God.

Well, check that box. We love God - are we done? Can we just go and live our life if we dutifully attend Mass every once in a while? Or why do we even need that? Can't we just live our life being a “good” person? Not so fast and no. Continuing in “Lumen Gentium” we make the connection to the other two parts of our Mission Statement - Serve Others and Form Disciples, “The laity, however, are given this special vocation: to make the church present and fruitful in those places and circumstances where it is only through them that it can become the salt of the earth. Thus, all lay people, through the gifts which they have received, are at once witnesses and the living instruments of the mission of the church itself...” Through the sacrament of baptism, we become the living stones for the building of the Kingdom of God on Earth. That is a huge responsibility! Light bulb moment! This is why we must make attending the weekend liturgy (and weekday, if possible) a priority. It is at the weekend liturgy that we are fed and strengthened through the Word and the Eucharist (Form Disciples) so that we may be sent forth into the world to be Christ for others in only those places and circumstances that we are present - Serve Others. “The faithful must, then, acknowledge the inner nature and the value of the whole of creation and its orientation to the praise of God. They help one another, even through their secular activity, to achieve greater holiness of life, so that the world may be filled with the spirit of Christ and may the more effectively attain its destiny in justice, in love, in peace.”

And so, I invite you to Mass (and then the next and the next...) If you know someone who has been absent or who is seeking God to come into their life, invite them to join you! *Love God - Serve Others - Form Disciples*. As we continue to evaluate our current efforts and plan for the future in our work with the Parish Vitality Study, maybe it's a good time to evaluate our own efforts and plan for the future. We are God's living stones - let's start building!

Lynn Holverson Named Next Principal of Xavier High School



We are excited to announce the hire of Lynn Holverson as Xavier High School's next principal! Mrs. Holverson currently serves as principal of All Saints Catholic Elementary School in Cedar Rapids. She will succeed Angela Olson as Xavier's fourth principal. Ms. Olson will be moving on next school year to serve as Head of School at Iowa City Regina.

Mrs. Holverson has worked in education for 17 years, 13 of which have been within Catholic schools. She earned her Master of Science in Education from Western Illinois University in 2003 and a Master of Science in Educational Leadership with a Catholic School Leader Certification from Creighton University in 2021.

Before coming to Xavier, Holverson served as a teacher and administrator at All Saints Elementary School. She was a teacher at All Saints Elementary from 2010 through 2021, when she was named the school's principal. During her time as principal at All Saints, Holverson was instrumental in developing a stronger Catholic identity within the school. She also helped organize and lead All Saints' strategic planning committee in addition to serving on other Catholic school community planning committees.

"To say our interview committee was thoroughly impressed with Lynn would be an understatement," states Xavier High School president, Chris McCarville. "What stood out immediately is not only Lynn's love for the Catholic Church, but her desire to help the Church grow within our students, faculty and staff at Xavier High School. Furthermore, not only am I confident in Lynn's ability to maintain Xavier's strong academic reputation, she clearly expressed her desire to see this grow through expanded course offerings and opportunities for students. I can't tell you how excited I am to work with Lynn as our school's fourth principal. With Xavier approaching a milestone of 25 years since opening, I believe even better days are still to come for our school. May the Holy Spirit especially be upon Lynn and guide her as she begins this new role."

Lynn and her husband, Todd, have been married 26 years and together they have two children, both of whom are Xavier High School alumni and attended Xavier Catholic Schools from elementary through high school: Ethan (X16) and Lauren (X22). The Holversons have been members of All Saints Catholic Parish for more than 16 years.

"It is truly an honor to be named principal of Xavier High School," states Mrs. Holverson. "I am excited to work with the Xavier students, parents, teachers, staff, and community to continue seeking out new and exciting opportunities for growth, while first and foremost keeping the focus on building our Catholic faith."

Mrs. Holverson will assume her duties at Xavier effective on July 1, 2023, which also coincides with Xavier celebrating its 25th anniversary this coming fall.

"We are embarking upon an exciting milestone in Xavier's history – in my role as principal I look forward to helping continue the rich history of Xavier that began 25 years ago and walk that journey with all of you as we move into the next 25 years," remarks Mrs. Holverson. "As I prepare for this transition, I am eager to see many familiar faces and meet new ones during the upcoming school year and beyond."

As principal, Holverson will report to Xavier High School president, Chris McCarville. Opportunities for Xavier families to meet Principal Holverson will be held closer to the start of the 2023-2024 school year and will be communicated accordingly once event details are finalized.

John 14:1-12

Jesus Is the Way

John's Gospel is very different from the other three Gospels. For example, at the Last Supper John tells us nothing about the blessed bread and wine. Instead, he talks about the washing of the feet, an incident not reported by the other Gospel writers. John also gives us the prayers and long discourse said by Jesus at the Last Supper.

This is one of my favorite Scripture passages from John's Gospel. It is a powerful summation of all that Jesus is. Each word holds so much meaning and significance. Consider the statement, "Jesus is the Way."

Jesus is the Way to find out who God is. Jesus was God in person. When he spoke and acted, it was God speaking and acting. If you want to find out about God, find out about Jesus.

Jesus is the Way to the kingdom. The kingdom is not just something in the future. It has been with us since the beginning of time, most decisively in the person of Jesus. The kingdom is also now, wherever we see someone acting in Jesus' healing love, offering reconciliation, or working for peace and justice.

Jesus is the Way to all that is true and all that gives life. Make Jesus a reality for your children. Let them hear you talk about him as if he were a member of your family. Let them know that he is their champion and that his love for them will never end. But also make sure they understand that they share Jesus' mission and they are called to champion others. They are asked to share Jesus' love in very practical ways with everyone they encounter, especially those most in need. Help them understand that they are called to be the way for others—the way to find the kingdom, the way for others to find out who God is.

Jesus is the Way maker. Let our children know that with Jesus' help, no matter the obstacles, nothing can stop them from finding his love and sharing that love with others.

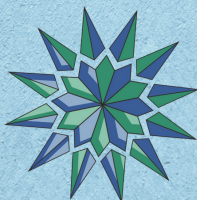

STO Memo #5 Updated

April 28, 2023

Round #1 Deadline has Passed

Thank you for your work with the 2,308 applicants who submitted their applications by the April 15th deadline. We make incredible progress in the final days before the deadline, so THANK YOU for your persistence in making it happen! Over 1700 of those applications are verified as I write this, so thank you again, and please keep up the good work. The finish line is in sight.

What is the "Drop Dead" Verification Date to Get in on Round #1?

Applications had to be submitted by April 15th by 11:59pm but for round #1 we build in three weeks for submitted applications to get processed to "VER". Thus, if an application is verified by the end of business on **Wednesday, May 3rd** it will be included in round #1.

As of today, there are currently 588 applications that were submitted but are at "Incomplete" status. We can tell 283 of them are currently being processed. The remaining 305 incomplete applications are generally those that submitted an application by the deadline but are missing a tax document, or did not finish the application. Please encourage these applicants to follow through with the submission of their applications and supporting documents. Hopefully, by now they have included all materials so that they can be moved to "VER" by May 3rd.

What do I tell someone who missed the April 15th Round 1 deadline?

Please encourage families who missed the Round 1 deadline to still complete a FACTS application. Although a majority of our funds are distributed during Round 1, there will be a Round 2 which has a deadline of **July 14th**. Also if your school uses FACTS to help process local assistance, remind families of the importance of following through, even if they missed the April 15th deadline. The July 14th deadline is later than in years past. We moved the STO Round 2 deadline back a couple of weeks until after the ESA deadline (June 30th) in case we have situations where the ESA deadline is missed by STO qualifying applicants.

STO Memo (cont.)

Action Needed: Changing tuition rates for divorced/never married parents

In order to meet our award deadline, and for you to potentially avoid uncomfortable conversations with divorced/never married parents **please adjust your tuition rates by 8 am Friday, May 5th.** Here are instructions on how to make those changes [Changing Tuition for Divorced/Never married parents](#)

- *Why is this important?* STO awards are calculated on the tuition rates uploaded in FACTS. If a parent applies for STO and is not responsible for 100% of the tuition bill, their tuition rate needs to be manually changed in FACTS before the final award is calculated. Changing tuition rates for divorced/never married parents is a very important step in the STO process. Schools need to manually adjust tuition for divorced parents or those with special custody arrangements. This will lead to accurate awarding and reduce errors.
- **Once you complete this step you need to complete this survey link by May 5th** (even if you did not have any accounts which required a tuition adjustment): <https://forms.gle/Sv5kq7EfB4JtrmUn6>

When will schools be notified of the STO awards?

After May 5th the STO and FACTS will work on setting the percentage parameters for tuition awards. If all goes as planned, schools will be able to view family awards on the FACTS website no later than **May 19th**. We will send a special message to schools so that you know when the awards have been posted. You will then be expected to notify parents of their awards by **May 26th**. A sample letter and materials will be forthcoming.
