

You Are Cordially Invited...



Welcome to the Sixth Sunday of Easter. Recall from last week that we are called to be living stones; building blocks for everything that we are and that we do, individually and communally. When we change it is noticeable to those around us and more than likely it will generate questions. That is what today's reading from 1 Peter is about - how to prepare for and how to respond to those questions. The theological term for this is apologetics. It comes from the Greek word apologia which means "a defense." Will Wright from the website CatholicLink states, "Apologetics is not about being

defensive or apologizing, it is about breathing hope into the world through solid reasoning and Faith. It seeks to remove objects, shed light on difficult matters, and help plant the seeds to win hearts and minds for Jesus. It is about answering the question: 'why am I Catholic?' or 'why should I become Catholic?' Apologetics is at the service of Christ who is the Truth and it is aimed at the conversion of hearts to Him."

What is the first step in all of this? "Beloved, Sanctify Christ as Lord in your hearts." Where is a great place to do this? Well, anywhere, but you can't beat attending the weekend liturgy faithfully. Not just attending though. From Lumen Gentium, we are called to full, active participation in the liturgy. In order to do that, it might be beneficial for us to learn, study and pray. These actions can help us form answers to 'why am I Catholic?' or 'why should I become Catholic?' The saying "actions speak louder than words" is especially true in Catholic apologetics. 1 Peter reminds us to teach and defend with "gentleness and reverence." Why would anyone want to be Catholic or become Catholic if we do not follow the teachings of Christ ourselves? Christ never forced or coerced anyone to follow Him, rather he invited and taught through words, signs, wonders, and above all, love. What a great reason to have hope and to continually show the strength of God through our love to others. "And whoever loves me will be loved by my Father, and I will love him and reveal myself to him." So a starting answer for ourselves and for others as to 'why am I Catholic?' or 'why should I become Catholic?' might be so that we can transform relationships from stranger to brother or a sister. One relationship at a time, a life lived as a disciple of Christ turns rocks into living stones and builds the Kingdom of God on earth. What a great hope! What a great reason to profess and live our Catholic faith!

And so, I invite you to Mass (and then the next and the next...) If you know someone who has been absent or who is seeking God to come into their life, invite them to join you! It may seem idealistic, but in loving ourselves and others as God loves us, we can build the hope in ourselves, in our parish, and in our community and become the transforming change of which the world is in desperate need.

An Advocate for Life

Jesus continues his last discourse with his disciples. He tells them (and us) if they love him and observe his commandments, the Father will give them another advocate, the Spirit of truth. Jesus tells them he will be leaving them soon but they will not be left orphaned.

The catechism tells us that God is truth. In fact, God is the only absolute truth. All other truth is relative. Truth is limited and conditioned by all sorts of things, including physicality, relativity, time, and culture. Three people can witness an accident and truthfully testify to seemingly contradictory statements. Their truth can be dictated by the where, when, and how of their relationship to the incident. It can be colored by personal viewpoints (prejudice, associations with other life experiences) or by personal limitations (eyesight, height). Only God is absolute truth, because only God is limitless.

We know that even church truths change. We all remember that Galileo was considered a heretic because he proposed that the sun did not revolve around the earth. If the church is open to admitting limitations in its belief system, we should be as well. As new ideas of faith or church or even God challenge us, we need to constantly pray to remain in the truth, reminding ourselves that the one and only absolute is God.

Life's journey is about learning and growing, constantly filtering the truth as we see it through the witness of the church and our own ever-expanding experiences. In John 18:37, Jesus tells us that he came into the world "to testify to the truth. Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice." It is in allowing Christ to live in us and bowing to our own limitations that the Spirit of truth can reign in our hearts.






Computer Science


As part of a statewide initiative to be fully implemented by 2024, we now provide Computer Science class to all our students. This includes a variety of activities both using technology and going "unplugged".



Xavier Class of 2023




