

### May 21, 2023 • Seventh Sunday of Easter John 17:20–26

### Actions Speak Louder Than Words

This is part of Jesus' farewell prayer for his disciples. In his final hours, Jesus raises his eyes to heaven and prays to his Father. He reminds the Father that he has revealed all he was sent to reveal to those who were sent to him. He prays for us, his followers, and offers glory to God in heaven.

At Mass, one of my favorite prayers is the "Gloria." I love to sing this prayer. It is so majestic. Sometimes when I come to Sunday mass in a so-so mood, I join in the singing of the "Gloria" and I feel my spirits lift. Today's Gospel, however, tells us that giving glory to God involves more than our voices or words, and has nothing to do with our moods.

According to this reading, when we want to give glory to God, our actions will speak louder than our words. Read again Jesus' prayer to his Father. Like Jesus, we glorify God when we are doing the work God gave us to do.

The work list is different for each of us, designed according to our own unique talents and limitations. Some of us give glory to God by being a part of the choir or a lector. We give glory to God by working in a soup kitchen or teaching religious education at the parish. We glorify God by becoming police officers, teachers, factory workers, doctors, lawyers, or missionaries.

For parents, the toughest work God has given us is to raise our children to be spiritually, emotionally and physically healthy adults. We give glory to God by sharing our paychecks and the best of our time and energy with our families. We give glory to God with every peanut butter and jelly sandwich we make, with every dish we wash. We give glory to God when we use our gifts and talents to share who we are with those God has entrusted to our care.



### Metro Area Catholic Schools Governance Task Force Meeting Summary from May 2, 2023

**Essential Question the Task Force is charged to answer.** Is it in the long term best interest of parishes and Catholic education in the metro area for Catholic schools to remain independent?

The Metro Area Catholic Schools Governance Task Force met on Wednesday, May 2, 2023 from 6:30pm–8:30pm in the Novak Conference Room at Xavier High School. This was their tenth meeting.

The task force approved the minutes from the March 29, 2023 meeting.

Beth Globokar (Task Force member and Chair of the Middle School Exploratory Study Committee) updated the task force on the work to date of the Middle School Exploratory Study Committee.

At the March 29 meeting, task force members completed an individual non-binding anonymous survey regarding their opinion as to how they would answer the essential question at this point in time as well as what other comments and questions remain. A brief report as to findings had been sent to the task force previously. An updated FAQ document was shared.

The task force broke into small groups to discuss the proposed system components, any questions that remain, each individual's inclination for a decision, and finally, discussing the possible voting options that consisted of a) status quo, b) partial system, and c) full systemization.

Each small group reported its findings. As a result of those reports, the task force conducted a roll call vote to determine the recommendation to present to the community to answer the essential question.

The next steps for the task force will be to:

- review and approve its final report to the pastors, administrators, Xavier Foundation, parish leadership and the community
- present its findings to the pastors, administrators and then the Xavier Foundation and parish leadership

The goal is to make these presentations, release the community report in June. The report will also outline subsequent next steps by all decision groups. Opportunity for feedback will be included in the process.

Metro Area Governance Task Force Xavier High School, Novak Room March 29, 2023 6:30 p.m. – 8:30 p.m. MINUTES

Is it in the long-term best interest of parishes and Catholic education in the metro area for Catholic schools to remain independent?

Following the prayer of Blessed Carlo Acutis, there were no changes to be made from the March 1, 2023, notes.

Middle School Exploratory Committee - Beth gave a brief overview of the meetings or the "elemiddle" study. The question they will answer regarding a recommendation is, "Is it in the long-term best interest for the metro Catholic middle schools to remain independent or become consolidated?" Beth said they have toured both LaSalle and St Joseph's building. The next meeting will be held at Regis. Ben asked when this group will be done and Beth indicated as long as it takes; however, it was suggested that this group will not exceed a one or two years. A recommendation from this committee may not be met before the Metro Task Force gives its recommendation. Therefore, the Middle School Study Committee is not contingent upon the Metro Task Force's recommendation.

**Proposed Model System Budget Projections** - Jeff then moved onto the model system budget that includes a possible Central Office. He presented the various assumptions used to build the budget. Those assumptions are conservative so as to be realistic. The proposed model system budget does include adding a system office while not adding any increased financial burden to parishes or families and maintaining at the very least a balanced budget. The group then reviewed and discussed the budget and financial projections through 2029-30.

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) - Jeff asked if there were any questions regarding the FAQ's addressing questions from the previous meeting. Fr. Mayer asked whether the school buildings would be owned by the system. Jeff felt that is something the administration and new school board would decide. Fr. O'Connor mentioned the school at St Joseph's was utilized for the religious education program. How does that figure in? Jeff felt that if a decision was made to move ownership to the system those buildings would absolutely be used by local

parish RE programs with a rental not to exceed a \$1 per year for insurance purposes. That would be part of any recommendation the Task Force would make.

Ben asked for more clarification on how the clergy affect the governance. Jeff reviewed how there are two governing bodies controlled both by Canon Law and the State of Iowa. Actions with respect to governing bodies must be in compliance with those policies, procedures and law. If there should be a stalemate regarding the corporate structure the corporate board (Archbishop, Vicar General, Pastor/Pastoral Coordinator, 2 lay directors) would make the decision.

Fr. O'Connor stated that he very much appreciated having the FAQs answered in such a thorough manner. These will present a good background when a recommendation is made. Betsy questioned the priest's role in the schools should a system be recommended.

**Small Group Discussions** - Jeff then separated the members into small groups and they talked over the proposed central office structure. The groups came back with very similar questions regarding this proposal, with the majority covering job descriptions for key personnel. Much of the focus was on clearly delineating the Catholic dimension to ensure that any move to a system strengthens the foundation of the Catholic mission of the schools. Matt emphasized that Catholicity be paramount and he felt it should be led by the priests. He thought they should be involved in curriculum planning and that the whole deanery be a part of it. He said our identity must be a strong Catholic system. The task force members agreed. The input will be used to revise the staffing responsibilities and levels for future task force consideration.

The meeting began promptly at 6:30PM. Beth Globokar, middle school exploratory study committee facilitator, opened the meeting with the prayer for St. John Newmann.

In the packet provided at today's meeting is the March 27, 2023 summary that will be sent to all those in the Cedar Rapids metro community; pastors, administrators, Cedar Rapids metro task force committee, parishioners, families, and staff. Also included are the minutes from the last meeting which was held on Monday March 27, 2023. Beth asked for any changes or additions to the minutes, there were no changes. Minutes are approved for distribution to the constituents above.

Today's meeting is being held at Regis Middle School.

#### Transportation

To begin the meeting, Amy Conlon provided a presentation of the transportation data that was shared at an earlier meeting. Similar transportation information was part of the Cedar Rapids metro task force study components; however, a few additional middle school specific items were added to this presentation for the purpose of this group's task.

The transportation review was broken out into three categories:

- All current 6-8 Xavier Catholic School students
- Students with a Marion address
- All current K-12 Xavier Catholic School students

#### All current 6-8 Xavier Catholic School students

Included in this data set is a map that includes a marker for each sixth through eighth grade student enrolled at St. Joseph, LaSalle, or Regis; each school marker is a different color for easier identification. The next map includes a cluster approach to group students by areas; however, they still indicate the school breakdown by delineating the schools by a different color. Lastly, The third map continues to utilize the the cluster approach but groups the city and surrounding areas into the following quadrants:

- East of 380, North of Hwy 100
- East of 380, South of Hwy 100
- West of 380, South of Covington Rd (Seminole Valley area)
- West of 380, North of Hwy 100 (including Palo/Toddville)
- Xavier area (including the Seminole Valley area, around Hwy 100, west of 380)

#### Students with a Marion address

One of the initial questions asked of this group was as it relates to the school enrollment for the families/students with a Marion address. A couple of maps were provided highlighting the 6-8 students and K-12 students living in Marion, with their currently enrolled school identified by color. Additionally, the following table was provided to share the school enrollment and percent of the total for all 274 K-12 students living in Marion.

#### All current K-12 Xavier Catholic School students

Included first in this data set is a table identifying the number of K-12 students who reside in the NE quadrant (East of 380 and North of Hwy 100). You can see the results of this work below:

Included in this set of information are two maps for each school; the first map plots each address for all students K-12 enrolled in their school and the second map utilizes the cluster approach to get an understanding of family groupings, while also applying the quadrant model to understand the number of students within each area. The quadrants used were the same as above and included below:

- East of 380, North of Hwy 100
- East of 380, South of Hwy 100
- West of 380, South of Covington Rd (Seminole Valley area)
- West of 380, North of Hwy 100 (including Palo/Toddville)
- Xavier area (including the Seminole Valley area, around Hwy 100, west of 380)

#### Regis Middle School Tour

Josh Gredys provided a tour of the entire Regis Middle School space. During the tour, Josh shared an overview of the space, showcased enhancements that have been made over the course of the last few years, while also pointing out the structural concerns and areas in need of attention that exist throughout the space. The group was also able to refer to the previously provided Shive-Hattery Facilities Review from 2017, which notes millions of dollars worth of work be completed on the facility over the next ten years. The building has housed as many as 460 middle schoolers, and currently holds 285 with projections for next year of 315. Upon completion of the tour, committee members were asked to jot down any notes as it relates to the facilities, what things they liked, or thoughts as it relates to suggestions.

Beth then asked the committee members if there were any questions as it relates to the data that has been presented thus far, including the information shared in prior meetings. Are there any questions, insights, areas that you would like to address? Hearing none, the meeting proceeded.

Beth shared that it is important to realize the important work of this group. We all know the rumors have begun, just as Josh mentioned the rumors as it relates to the current Regis space. As you hear things, it is important that you listen and dispel any rumors; should you hear anything that needs to be addressed, please feel free to pass this along to Amy or Beth. As a reminder to this group and all, there is no preset agenda, the Archdiocese is not driving any type of decision, rather this large group has been assembled to discern the question and ultimately provide a recommendation based on the information gathered.

#### SWOT Analysis of Consolidation

For the next few meetings, an in-depth SWOT analysis will be done for both consolidation and for the current structure. For tonight's meeting, the focus will be on Pros/Cons of Consolidation and due to time constraints, the group was asked to focus on just a few topics.

To do this, there were giant sticky notes placed on the whiteboards in the front and side of the room. There is a single sticky note for each of the following topics: academics, staffing/administrative structure, Catholicity, other, and questions. The committee members brought completed t-charts to the meeting based on pros and cons of middle school consolidation from their viewpoint. To go through this, Beth started with one side of the room and had each individual share a pro or con from their sheet (for any of the aforementioned categories), from there, this comment was transferred to the corresponding sticky note on the board for all to see and further comment. This method was followed until time ran out. This process will continue until all comments are recorded and included on the appropriate sticky note. After which, this same process will be followed as the group analyzes the current structure of the three middle schools.

A couple notes about the next meeting; this group is going to be on-site at the Toyota Financial Building on Monday May 1st. The sticky notes will accompany this meeting and the work of pros and cons of consolidation will be continued during our time after the tour.

Beth led the group in prayer to conclude the meeting and adjourned the meeting at 8:10PM.

#### Middle School Exploratory Study Committee Meeting Monday, May 1, 2023 6:30 pm – 8:00 pm Toyota Financial Services Building

Is it in the long term best interest for the metro Catholic middle schools to remain independent or become consolidated?

Greetings,

The Middle School Exploratory Study Committee met on Monday, May 1, 2023 at the Toyota Financial Services building. This was their fifth meeting. Below you will find a summary of the key aspects discussed during this time together.

- ❖ A tour of the Toyota Financial Services space was provided by Jerry, the current maintenance director and caretaker of the space, assisted by Mike Esker and Joe Tursi who shared their real estate and school design/architectural knowledge with the group. An overview of the space was provided while showcasing enhancements that have been made over the course of the last few years, in addition to comments about possibilities as it relates to the transformation of an office building space to a school. Overall, the group generally agreed that it would be possible to convert a space like this into a well designed and suitable school building at a more affordable price than to build from scratch.
- A SWOT (Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities and Threats) analysis exercise was continued to analyze pros and cons of middle school consolidation. The remainder of the meeting was spent listing and discussing the pros and cons of consolidation based on what has been learned thus far through Xavier Catholic Schools structures, as well as other Catholic School systems regionally and nationally. This process will continue at the next meeting and beyond, as needed, followed by pros and cons of the current structure.
