Everyday Metanoia



Today's Gospel reading of John's message continues the theme of God's love and how we are commanded to love one another. One word in this Gospel passage caught my attention: joy. Let's explore this together in prayer.

Joy. It is not a word that I hear in conversations much. The focus seems to be on happiness. Is there a difference? I believe that there is. To me, joy is an inner sense of well-being that is only known through a relationship with God; happiness is an exterior feeling that is dictated by circumstances. In 2013 Pope Francis wrote an apostolic exhortation entitled, "Evangelii Gaudium" which translates to the Joy of the Gospel. One of his opening paragraphs gets straight to the heart (pardon the pun!) of the matter: "The great danger in today's world, pervaded as it is by consumerism, is the desolation and anguish born of a complacent yet covetous heart, the feverish pursuit of frivolous pleasures, and a blunted conscience. Whenever our interior life becomes caught up in its own interests and concerns, there is no longer room for others, no place for the poor. God's voice is no longer heard, the quiet joy of his love is no longer felt, and the desire to do good fades. This is a very real danger for believers too. Many fall prey to it, and end up resentful, angry and listless. That is no way to live a dignified and fulfilled life; it is not God's will for us, nor is it the life in the Spirit which has its source in the heart of the risen Christ." Hopefully to preclude a trip down the rabbit hole of 'so it's bad to have money and things?', let's turn to the guidance of the Kevin O'Brien, SJ and his book *The Ignatian Adventure*: "Although not everyone is called to live a life of actual poverty, we are called to live simply and in freedom with respect to the riches we have - whether they are in the form of material possessions, talents, reputation or influence. All are called to labor with Christ to help the poor and powerless in some way. All are called to give countercultural witness to the rampant competition and materialism around us." When we have material possessions or extraordinary talents we are called to use them in love of others.

Another point of difference between happiness and joy that Pope Francis makes further in his exhortation is that happiness is fleeting. We want something, we get it and we are briefly satisfied. But shortly after, we find something else that we want and are ready to abandon that which we received in our non-stop quest for whatever is next. Joy, on the other hand, forms a lasting foundation that is not changed by circumstantial possessions, relationships or events. Joy is like many flowers, in that it forms roots in the heart and soul, and as we listen to God's Word and live a life in relationship with him that we share with others through word and deed, it then spreads and grows. "Goodness always tends to spread. Every authentic experience of truth and goodness seeks by its very nature to grow within us, and any person who has experienced a profound liberation becomes more sensitive to the needs of others. As it expands, goodness takes root and develops. If we wish to lead a dignified and fulfilling life, we have to reach out to others and seek their good...Though it is true that this mission demands great generosity on our part, it would be wrong to see it as a heroic individual undertaking, for it is first and foremost the Lord's work, surpassing anything which we can see and understand."

I am blessed to have the opportunity to share my prayer time and weekly reflection with others. I am grateful for this gift. I echo a sentiment from Pope Francis in that I am "reaping the rich fruit of these labors." At the end of the previous paragraph, I became aware that every word that I had just typed was meant for me. I am human and a sinner and sometimes God has to grab my attention in a big way, like He did today. I have been a grump lately. Oh, I could give a hundred reasons why, but through the Gospel today, I remember that in Christ we have been given a new life of friendship with God. We are not slaves, we have been given the awesome gift and responsibility of free will. And we are never alone for the Holy Spirit is always present. I had forgotten that the external circumstances of life come and go - like happiness. But the relationship with we have with God is at the very heart of our identity; the source of our never-ending joy. I am frequently humbled by God's patience with me, but in love I thank Him and seek forgiveness as I reclaim the gift of joy so that I may share the love of God with others.

Pope Francis sums this thought up beautifully, "My mission of being in the heart of the people is not just a part of my life or a badge I can take off; it is not an "extra" or just another moment in life. Instead, it is something I cannot uproot from my being without destroying my very self. I am a mission on this earth; that is the reason why I am here in this world." And so in love, I close with this hopeful invitation - see you at Mass!

The Greatest of These is Love

Once again Jesus tells his disciples how essential love is to being his followers. And again he tells them that they need to accept his love if they are to love others. Jesus tells them that the reward if they remain in his love is a joy that is complete.

Love is an important theme throughout John's writings. In the first four verses of this reading Jesus uses the word love seven times. In the first verse he tells us, "As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love." The love Jesus is talking about is the key to understanding his ministry.

It is different from the love we read about in romance novels. It goes beyond that quick surge of chemistry that draws two people together. The love Jesus talks about is more than a feeling. It's even deeper than the love of a bride or groom on their wedding day.

God's love is a bond. It is a bond so deep and so strong that three Persons become one in the Trinity. God's love is a bond so broad and so encompassing that it takes in all of creation including (thanks to Jesus) all of us. This love requires only one thing: Love God with all that you are, and love your neighbor as yourself.

We don't have to feel loving toward everyone to stay in God's love, but we do have to accept the loving bond that connects us all together. As parents we have to share that loving connectedness with our children. All people are equal in God's eyes, and we need to help them accept and respect everyone regardless of age, color, economic status or even personal goodness. This is the love Jesus invites us to remain in, and with this love comes the peace and complete joy of living in harmony with God's heart.

FAMILY RESPONSE

Discuss the ways people are different from each other. Remind your child/children that God loves everyone the same. Ask someone to say a prayer asking God to help you accept and respect everyone you meet this week.

PERSONAL RESPONSE

Prejudices are often the result of our upbringing. Are there any prejudices that you feel toward any group or class of people? If so, what can you do about it? If not, why is this so? What do you want to remember from last week? What are you looking forward to next week? What are your concerns?
