Consider installing LED lights at home. While LEDs cost more up front, they last far longer — up to 23 years. During that time, total operational cost for an LED is about \$38, compared with \$48 for CFLs and \$200 for incandescent bulbs. A big part of the savings is reduced electrical usage for the same brightness.

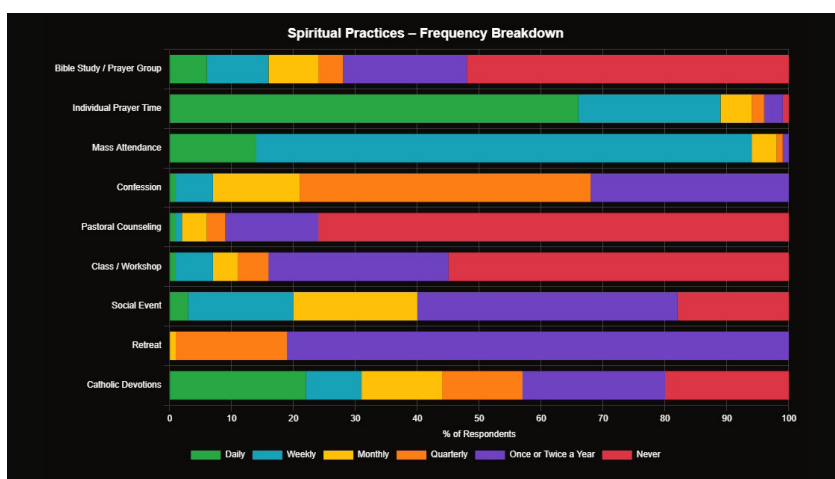
Everyday Metanoia



Welcome to the celebration of Pentecost. Paul's first letter to the Corinthians provides a great lens to view the initial reporting of the Discipleship Maker Index survey results that we pushed out last week. Paul instructs the Corinthians, "Brothers and sisters: No one can say, 'Jesus is Lord,' except by the Holy Spirit. There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit; there are different forms of service but the same Lord; there are different workings but the same God who produces all of them in everyone. To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit. As a body is one though it has many parts, and all the parts of the body, though many, are one body, so also Christ. For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body, whether Jews or Greeks, slaves or free persons, and we were all given to drink of one Spirit." Our parents accept Jesus as Lord and Savior on our behalf through our baptism as an infant or small child. But we all claimed this for ourselves when we received the Sacrament of Confirmation as a young adult or older. The survey results are affording us the opportunity to look with fresh eyes at what our call to missionary discipleship requires of us here at All Saints in Cedar Rapids, Iowa in the year 2025. How are we, the All Saints community and leadership teams, helping our parishioners to respond to the vocation of discipleship that we received at Baptism?

The Most Reverend William E. Lori, in the article *Shining with the Light of Christ* states, "Our lives as Christians are built on the bedrock of our faith in Jesus Christ. At the heart of our faith is not a mere idea, however noble or inspired, but rather an encounter with Jesus Christ, our Savior. An encounter with Christ is that moment when, in the power of the Holy Spirit, we truly open our hearts to our Savior, understand the depth and beauty of his love for us, and find ourselves forever changed and transformed by him. Once we have done so, we view the Scriptures and the Church's teaching, the liturgy, our life of prayer, and our moral life in a new way. Far from being burdensome, these things become beautiful and precious, and they move to the center of our lives. We are able to live differently and to strive eagerly for holiness - that is, an ever-deepening participation in God's Triune glory and self-giving love...Yet I want to exhort you that a godly way of life is not really our doing. Rather, it is Christ at work in us through the Holy Spirit, strengthening us in our weaknesses, offering us forgiveness, patiently helping us to overcome every vice and to embrace, in love, every virtue."

The responses from the DMI survey speak loud and clear: the majority of those who responded want to grow and improve their spiritual growth and their journey to holiness. Prayer is the number one way that our parishioners are in a relationship with God. That is wonderful! The results, also, show that we need to be innovative and more in tune with our parishioners to meet and grow their spiritual needs. What are some events that we could offer that would motivate you to participate fully in the life of parish? What could we develop that would help to name and grow the godly moments in your life? Is there something from the past at All Saints that you would like to talk about so that the gift of forgiveness could help you to heal and be open to



the Holy Spirit prompting you to new life? It is going to take more than a handful of people to unleash the true power of the Holy Spirit at All Saints - everyone of us is important and has a role to play and gifts to offer. Pope Francis has said, "a parish needs to be in contact with the homes and the lives of its people, otherwise it risks becoming a useless structure out of touch with people or a self-absorbed group made up of a chosen few." The Disciples Receive the Holy Spirit

After Jesus ascended into heaven, the disciples and Mary were gathered together, praying and talking about all that had happened. Suddenly, a strong wind filled the house and there appeared to be tongues of fire that rested on each of them. Mary and the disciples then left the house and went out proclaiming the Good News and people from all nationalities could understand them, "All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit..." (v. 4).

We are a Pentecost people. Like the first disciples, we are gifted with the Holy Spirit so that we can share our faith with others. This is not always easy. Many of us were raised to believe that religion is a private matter. It can be difficult for us to talk about God or our faith. And yet, faith sharing, especially in families, is crucial.

We live in a culture that in many ways no longer supports Judeo-Christian values. More than ever, young people need to hear and see the people most important to them talking about and living the gospel message. If faith is going to be real in their lives, they need to see that faith is a reality in the lives of those closest to them.

Pentecost is the day the disciples were empowered by the Holy Spirit to leave the safe closure of the Upper Room, and share their faith with a city of strangers. Why not take the risk this week and share your faith with those closest to you?

Read or retell the story of Pentecost to your family. Talk about how you would have felt if you were in the Upper Room, and invite other family members to do the same. Discuss the Holy Spirit in your life. How have you experienced the gifts of courage and understanding? When have you felt the Spirit's fruits of joy and peace?
