Updated News - Fr. Eric



Our new Sacramental Priest, Fr. Eric Saah, will arrive in the United States late in the evening on Tuesday, July 1. Representatives from the Pastoral Center will pick him up and begin the process for him to receive a Social Security card. After that he will receive a driving refresher with the goal being to obtain an Iowa driver's license before the end of July. Given that government offices will be closed on the 4th of July, we will be providing the Archdiocese with a few extra days to finish their work on his behalf. What does that mean for All Saints?

- We will **cancel** daily Masses on **July 9, 10, and 11**. Fr. Jack will preside at the 8:00 AM Mass on **Tuesday, July 8**.
- We will post daily Mass schedules for nearby parishes on the entry doors for that week.
- We will have Adoration on Thursday, July 10 beginning at 8:00 AM.
- We will have the Respect Life Rosary on Friday, July 11 beginning at 8:00 AM.
- Fr. Eric will be here and will preside at the weekend Masses on Saturday, July 12 and Sunday, July 13. We will have cookies and lemonade after both Masses so that the parish can greet Fr. Eric and welcome him to All Saints.
- The week of July 14 may have some changes, too. It will depend on how much is able to be accomplished by July 11.

Everyday Metanoia/Dan Was Here!



Welcome to the 14th Sunday in Ordinary Time. Last week Fr. Jack read a letter to the parish from Archbishop Zinkula inviting all of us to embark on a new path - a Journey in Faith. Like the appointed seventy-two disciples that Jesus sent out ahead of him to teach, preach and heal, our Archbishop is calling us to become "an engaged archdiocesan community of joyful missionary disciples, centered in our Eucharistic relationship with Jesus Christ and united through our legacy of faith."

Like our Gospel reading for today, there is an urgency to proclaim the message anew in our Archdiocese. Statistics show a decline in Mass attendance, baptisms, and participation in the Sacraments all over the

United States. When Jesus sent out the first seventy-two, their mission was to share the joy of discovering a life lived with and for Jesus. If during Amazon prime days, we discover something that would benefit many of our friends, we "share" that message or link in any way that we can. The question that many of us need to wrestle with is why we don't feel that same way about sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ and a relationship with our Triune God; Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The Gospel tells us how life transforming the mission of the seventy-two was, not just for those they encountered, but for the evangelizers, themselves. Jesus, the Apostles and the disciples were establishing a structure for the mission. Centuries later, the Archbishop is inviting us as a part of the Journey in Faith to "examine the current organizational structures of parishes and schools to evaluate how they can best meet the needs of the faithful and address challenges facing the Church today." Our current time and culture calls for a new way of sharing our story and the story of our Lord and Savior. Jesus didn't minister by himself - he created and empowered communities. In our global world, we have lost a lot of the purpose of the community...and not just in our faith life. As children of God, we are created to live and minister in community for support and correction. This decline in community means that "we are limited in the time, energy and resources we are able to allocate" to others.

In reality, our parish is one step ahead on this road as we embrace a leadership model of a Parish Life Coordinator supported by a Sacramental Priest. This is calling us to evaluate and restructure our parish office team in order to best minister to you, our parishioners, but also to welcome the new and to be a community that knows, lives and celebrates a relationship with God-Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The Journey in Faith has an ambitious timeline which will necessitate many meetings for me and a few for our parish. To meet these needs, I have and will continue to delegate many tasks and activities.

Hey! Tracy! Are you still here?!

Pardon me. Dan here again. Every now and then I have to remind Tracy that she doesn't have to stay late. She certainly likes to burn that midnight oil. I know that in my personal life, I'm very often looking at messages from friends and family asking for a little 'Dan Wisdom'. It's been so much lately that I've felt a little overwhelmed. I never, however, say to anyone, "I can't help you right now." I almost always find a way to help. Lately I've been reminded by several people close to me that one can't pour from a glass that's nearly empty. As Tracy starts her walk along this new path God has chosen for her, it will be important for me to remind her to keep her focus. To help keep her glass full, Jeremy, Bob, Stacy, Ethan, and I will be taking over some of the more office-type duties that many of you (and us here in the office) have been known to lean on her for. A few examples of those duties include, processing offerings, scheduling events, communication with the school and the XCS, etc. We all know too well how long that list of duties has been over the years.

To make this transition as easy as possible for Tracy, I'm asking you all to do us a huge favor. The next time you have business to conduct here in the parish office, give us a call or write an email and inquire about who has potentially taken on that responsibility, if you don't already know. Don't get me wrong, Tracy will still be handling many duties but as far as everyday office tasks go, many of those have already been taken away from her by the parish office gang. If you call and I don't have your answer right away, I'll take your name and contact information, and I'll find the best person to handle your request. Some requests may take longer than others to process at this time so please allow us some grace as we all travel along our somewhat new paths as well.

Jesus Sends His Disciples

Jesus appoints seventy-two disciples and sends them, along with the apostles, into the various towns and villages. He tells them to carry no money or sack, but to rely on the hospitality of the people in the town. If they are welcomed in peace, they are to stay. If not, Jesus tells them to leave. "...[T]he Lord appointed seventy others and sent them on ahead of him in pairs..." (v. 1).

The disciples were going out to preach on their own. Jesus knew the difficulties they would encounter, and so he sent them out in pairs. This is a really important point. It is so much easier to get things done, to manage difficult situations or to even celebrate our accomplishments with the help of others. We all need support and encouragement. One of the first things Jesus did when he began his public ministry was to gather a group of people whom we call *apostles* and *disciples*. Even Jesus needed a community to walk with.

This is why belonging to a church is so important: Not just to have a group of people with whom to worship, but also to have a community to nurture and support you and your family. The church community is asked to serve as a model for us and our children; sometimes even offering an alternate lifestyle to that of the culture in which we live. We need to surround our children with people who share the same values.

Church is a family, and like every other family, the church is not perfect. Every church makes mistakes, sometimes really big ones. As we do in our family, we try to forgive and move on. Every church community will have its characters, its misfits and its sinners. We are not expected to like every member, but if we make an effort to get involved in church activities, we often meet people who can become surrogate family and lifelong friends.
