## A Weekly Tip on Caring for Our Common Home



Single-use plastics (or disposable plastics) are plastic items that are typically used once, then thrown away or recycled. Single-use plastics consist of plastic bags, soda and water bottles, plastic straws and coffee stirrers, in addition to most restaurant food containers and other packaging. The energy it takes to produce single-use plastics comes mostly from fossil fuels, which are our largest source of heat-trapping greenhouse gas emissions. By reducing our dependence on single-use plastics, we can greatly reduce the impact these products have on our environment.

# Everyday Metanoia



Welcome to the 18th Sunday in Ordinary Time. Last week we connected Abraham's boldness in prayer with the Lord to becoming informed parishioners and the very real need for full and active participation in our liturgies, formation activities and the upcoming meetings to learn more about the Journey in Faith pastoral planning initiative in the Archdiocese of Dubuque. This week we will continue to explore our responsibility to God, to our parish and our community through the lens of St. Paul's letter to the Colossians and the Gospel reading from St. Luke.

Like the rich man in Jesus' parable, parishes throughout the Archdiocese of Dubuque have been building individual silos, storing material and lay resources for our own needs, purposes and goals. Some silos are overflowing and bursting, while others have had to dig into harvests from the past in order to sustain the current needs. We have all formed our tight-knit communities, who have prayed with us through fortunes and misfortunes, grown with us together as disciples, and strengthened our love of God through the Word and the Eucharist in our parish places of worship. The population trending from rural to urban and the lack of enough priestly ordinations to shepherd each individual parish, have greatly impacted many of our Catholic faith communities and churches over the past few years. Even in the urban settings, the decline in participation at the weekend liturgy, the dwindling number of lay leaders, and the shrinking financial resources have had a noticeable and growing impact. Like God at the end of the parable, the Archdiocese is calling upon us to think bigger than ourselves. This is reflected in the values that are guiding the Journey in Faith initiative. As stated on the site: the values that will guide all of us will be:

- Prayer – Deepening our relationship with God
- Worship – Vibrant sacramental life and love for God
- Charity – Serving others like Christ
- Lifelong Learning – Continuing our faith formation

On the Journey in Faith page, Archbishop Zinkula states, "I truly believe the Holy Spirit is calling us forward - to trust each other, to transform our Church and to do it together. If we walk this path with courage, with faith and with love - listening to one another and to God - we can renew our Church and build something lasting for generations to come." Notice that the word, "Church" is capitalized. The Archbishop is not referring to our individual churches (parishes), but rather to the universal Church - the one we form with our brothers and sisters all over the world. St. Paul, in his letter to the Colossians, is directing them to focus on the big picture, also. "Brothers and sisters:...seek what is above, where Christ is seated at the right hand of God. Think of what is above, not of what is on earth." Significantly, Paul is even more specific as he ends the passage: "Here there is not Greek and Jew, circumcision and uncircumcision, barbarian, Scythian, slave, free; but Christ is all and in all." This is just as relevant today as it was for the Colossians: here [in the Archdiocese of Dubuque] there is no longer our individual parishes, but rather Christ is all and in all. Paul's letter to the Colossians echoes the Journey in Faith initiative for collaboration and a renewed sense of what it means to be a community that evangelizes, celebrates inspiring liturgies, engages parishioners in formation, nurtures the God-given gifts of our brothers and sisters in Christ, aligns resources to mission and fosters the health and well-being of our priests. Please visit the Journey in Faith page of the Archdiocesan website every week - new information is being added frequently. "The Catholic Church in the Archdiocese of Dubuque stands at an important crossroads — a moment of both reflection and renewal. As we launch the Journey in Faith initiative, we are entering a season of discernment rooted in synodal listening, earnest prayer, and deep trust in the guidance of the Holy Spirit."

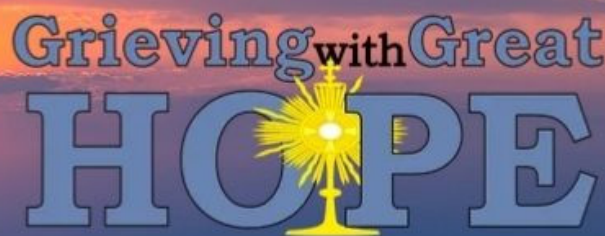

# Family Ministry

August 3, 2025 • 18th Sunday in Ordinary Time • Luke 12:13-21

## A Parable About Greed

*Jesus tells the crowd a parable about a rich man whose harvest was so abundant that he does not have room enough to store it in his barns. Rather than share his bounty, he decides to tear down his old buildings and build larger ones. "Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; for one's life does not consist in the abundance of possessions" (v. 15).*

In this parable, Jesus isn't condemning the rich; he is telling us that if we have money, we need to use it wisely. When we have taken what we need, Jesus cautions us not to forget those who are in need. Jesus doesn't believe in stockpiling or building up a surplus. He has a much more global view of things.

Jesus is asking us to determine for ourselves just how much is enough. How many barns do we have to fill before we have enough? How many bank accounts? How many electronic devices, clothes or cars do we need? How big a house is big enough? Jesus is telling us it is spiritually prudent to share our abundance with those less fortunate.

We are asked to trust in God's care rather than a surplus of grain or stocks or money. We are told that the world has enough resources to provide for all her inhabitants. Imagine a world where those resources were shared and everyone had enough, a world without greed. Imagine what it would be like if people were satisfied with what they have and did not covet other people's land or car or lifestyle.

This is the world God planned. This is the world of God's reign. This is the world we are all asked to work toward.
