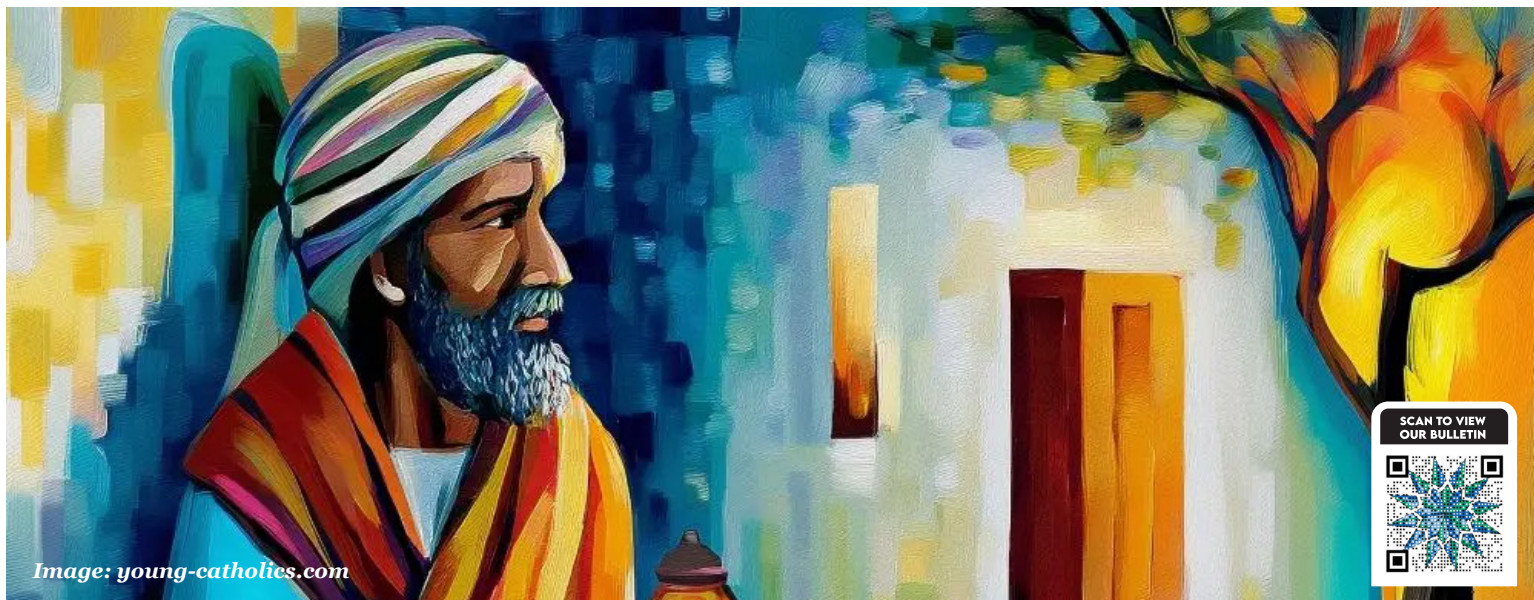

Everyday Metanoia



Welcome to the 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time. The past few weeks we have been connecting our Sunday readings with the Journey in Faith initiative. One could say that it is “uncanny” the way in which our readings have so easily shed light on the current undertaking in the Archdiocese of Dubuque. I will challenge all of us instead to see the power of the Holy Spirit bringing Scripture as God’s living Word to life; speaking to us in our current time and place with both purpose and encouragement.

The Book of Wisdom was written for “the Jewish people living in Alexandria, Egypt, in the first century B.C., who had long forgotten the difficult transition their ancestors had experienced in moving from Judea” (Catholic Youth Bible). In Wisdom the author uses the memory of the Exodus to highlight the special protective nature of God: “The night of the Passover was known beforehand to our fathers, that, with sure knowledge of the oaths in which they put their faith, they might have courage.” As we walk the Journey in Faith, we must recall the oaths of our own ancestors. Like them, we do not profess an oath to our individual tribes (parishes), but rather our oaths are in God our Father. The Nicene Creed begins, “I believe in one God, the Father almighty...” and the Apostles Creed begins, “I believe in God, the Father almighty...” Our forefathers in faith went through organizational structure changes during the course of our history and through Journey in Faith, we might “look different” than we do currently, but our foundation remains the same: God, the Father; God, the Son; and God, the Holy Spirit. In our own time we will bear witness to God’s protective nature that will provide structuring to “best meet the needs of the faithful and address the challenges facing the Church today.”

The letter/sermon to the Hebrews calls our attention to the gift of faith and the fruit of hope that walks with it. “Brothers and sisters: Faith is the realization of what is hoped for and evidence of things not seen.” In the passage from today, the author illustrates faith in God through the faithfulness of Abraham. Mary Healy in her commentary on Hebrews notes, “Hebrews was written to a community of Christians who were struggling. They had had times of fervor in the past but had become discouraged in the midst of a hostile culture with the threat of persecution. Some had stopped regularly attending the liturgy, and some were even tempted to abandon the faith...this situation is not unlike that of the Church in the Western world today. In such times, the message of Hebrews is both bracing and encouraging. Hold fast to faith in Christ!” When we look at the statistics on the Journey in Faith site, one could conclude that what we will undergo is all about “the numbers.” While this data will play a role, it is the hope that this information will not overshadow the process, but will complement it. If we were to go off data alone, one could conclude, why bother, what’s the point? Beneath the inspired words of the author, faith is illuminated from a blind leap to an informed way of knowing that comes from God consistently revealing Himself throughout our history. Healy continues, “Hebrews also shows us how faith - or, more precisely acting on faith - gives evidence of what is unseen. Those who live by faith give persuasive evidence to others that invisible things, such as Jesus reigning in glory...and an unshakable kingdom are truly real.” When we participate fully in the Journey in Faith initiative, we, too, point to the invisible reality that God is alive in our midst. In creating a space for full, active participation in liturgies that are alive and anchored in the power of the Eucharist, we will not only strengthen our communities, but we will grow.

In the Gospel of Luke, Jesus reminds the disciples that faith and the promise of God’s Kingdom is where our “treasure is.” How do we know this? Through faith, but also by the realization that what we carry in our hearts is how we prioritize our lives, make decisions and live. Priorities encouraged by our increasingly secular society has resulted in declining Mass attendance throughout our Archdiocese; indeed, throughout most of the Western world. Keeping on the same path will result in smaller and smaller faith communities. Journey in Faith is our new pastoral planning process to renew discipleship and strengthen parish life. It is a response to real challenges - but grounded in hope and trust in the Holy Spirit. Growing our hearts through ever-deepening encounters with Christ will keep hope alive even in the most challenging of times. Every voice is important and matters on this journey. Upcoming informational sessions will be at All Saints on September 16th and 17th from 6 - 9 PM. Additional meetings will be scheduled in October and led by our Journey in Faith Team to gather feedback and ideas. **Please get these dates on your calendar now - make them a priority!** Come listen and pray. We need every member present to discern how to build a vibrant Church for future generations. Let us Journey in Faith.

Jesus Talks About Our True Treasure

Jesus tells his followers to be careful where they place their hearts, and how they prioritize their values. If they are given much, much will be expected of them. He goes on to warn them to be ready at all times to answer for their behavior. "For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also" (v. 34).

If asked where my treasure lies, without a doubt I would say my family. Probably my biggest regret is not having spent enough time with each of my children. Now that they are grown and busy with their own lives, I regret those lost moments.

I learned the phrase *tempus fugit* in high school Latin class but never really understood its meaning until I reached middle age. Now I know how quickly "time flies." Toddlers become teenagers and, before you know it, you are celebrating a grandson's First Communion.

Time is a precious commodity, not anything to be squandered on "to do" lists. At its best, it is a gift that's meant to be generously shared with those we love. I remember the busyness of family life. It takes so much time to cook and clean, shop and do laundry, take care of the yard, attend Little League games, and on and on. There are only twenty-four hours in a day, eight of those spent at work or school, and of course we have to sleep.

It is so easy to let the days slip by with no time to play. But scientists tell us that play is an essential part of a healthy life, even for adults. Playing together as a family teaches us how to interact and develop relationships of trust and mutuality. We can learn to communicate in comfortable, informal settings. Play can even help us let go of aggressive tendencies. And it is a great way to relieve stress.

Try reclaiming Sunday as family day. After church, spend a few hours playing together. Fly a kite, toss a Frisbee or just sit home and play some board games. Sunday may seem the only day to get the laundry or shopping done, but try to rethink your weekly schedule. Spending Sunday with your family is a great way of keeping the Sabbath holy and honoring the Lord.

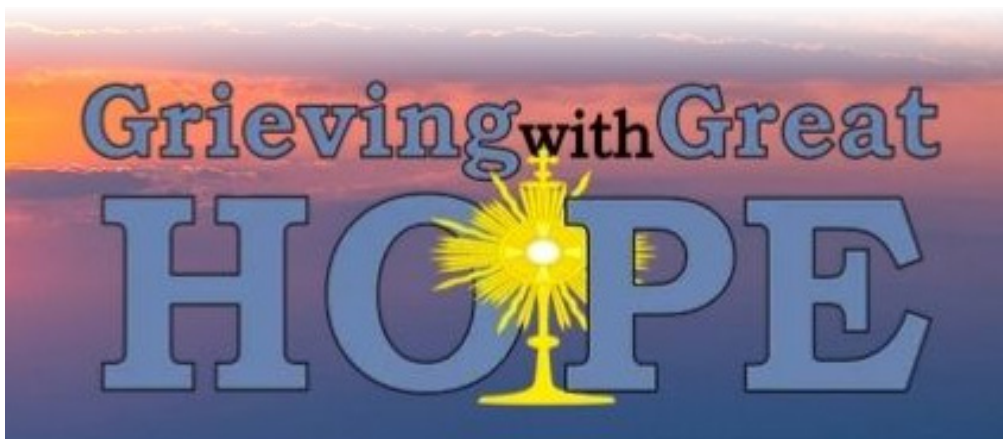
