Why Should I Attend?





in Faith If you are unable to attend a September regional meeting, you are urged to review all of the information on the Trust Transform. What is the role of Journey in Faith Parish Team Members and who are they?

Journey in Faith Team Members are parishioners selected by the pastor/PLC to help facilitate the feedback process at the parish. Their role is to impartially record and submit the feedback of the parishioners at their parish meetings to the Journey in Faith Core Team. They are advocates for parishioners to be engaged in the process. Local Journey in Faith Team Members are not decision makers in this process. All decisions will ultimately be made by Archbishop Zinkula.

Metro Catholic Outreach played a major part in this new summer program, getting summer food to school children in need. Families who depend on school meals for a major portion of their nutrition were able to shop in our pop-up pantry three times this summer. MCO was one of several locations throughout our area.

The last Thursdays of June, July, and August were our nights to shine. Many volunteers helped deliver and unload food, set up the temporary pantry, greeted families as they arrived, helped complete paperwork, shopped with the parents, and even carried out the groceries to their cars.

Our site alone served 180 families -553 kids this summer! The clients were all so appreciative, excited, and grateful to receive this bonus food. It was such a pleasure to assist these students and their families, but it was the couple of dozen volunteers who made this all happen!

Everyday Metanoia



Welcome to the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. "With their patience worn out by the journey, the people complained against God and Moses, 'Why have you brought us up from Egypt to die in this desert, where there is no food or water? We are disgusted with this wretched food!" The first few verses from our first reading from Numbers is a lament that I hope not to hear from All Saints parishioners, especially those who do not participate in the information and feedback sessions which are a part of our Journey in Faith efforts. Quite frankly, this work is exhausting, and even overwhelming at times. Who would have thought that within a few short months of All Saints accepting the challenge and the grace of being a parish under a different

leadership model, that we would be immersed in plans to group individual churches into larger pastorates? But that is not where our patience is being tried, is it? It is in the potential loss of our individual identity as a viable parish complete with a full-time pastor and weekend Masses that is the source of our heads spinning, our shoulders sagging and our feet trudging. When we allow the poison of the ego to infest our souls and focus solely on ourselves, this is when patience wanes and the complaints rise.

God has been with All Saints on its wonderful life from Masses offered in parishioner homes to the initial building of a school with a gathering space for liturgies. Many pastors have led All Saints through periods of growth and periods of stillness, through times of building and times of maintenance, though opportunities where the Holy Spirit was active and alive in the life of the parish and the parishioners and times where we grieved the loss of members through death, moves and falling away. What is starkly evident from Scripture and our Catholic Tradition is that God is faithful and constant; we are the ones who are unfaithful, inconsistent and centered upon ourselves. In the history of All Saints Parish - God is always here; we are the ones who are absent, in greater numbers as each year passes.

The work of the Journey in Faith Team, the participation of all in the informational and feedback sessions and indeed, our prayers all are oriented to doing our very best to keep weekend Masses at All Saints and to be recognized as the viable parish that we are and can continue to be. But if that is not the outcome, then what? Yes, I, too, will be saddened initially by the loss of what has been my "home" for the better part of my life. We all grieve and mourn when one part of our life closes: childhood; high school; college life; various work opportunities, marriage; parenthood; and the loss of our own human parents. As each stage of life is transitioned to the next, there is that moment when we know loss. God, why did you move me to this city for a job? My friends, my support system, all of what I knew and was comfortable with - none of it is here! God, why did our parish lose its weekend Mass? I don't know anyone at this church, none of the songs are familiar and I miss my pew! Sounds a lot like our reading from Numbers today.

Losing weekend Masses is one alternative that I hope and pray does not come to fruition. But if it does, then what? Do we just become a lot of complaining people, satisfied with nothing and ready to sever our connections, not just with All Saints, by turning to another faith tradition; but with God entirely? "In punishment the LORD sent among the people saraph serpents, which bit the people so that many of them died." God is always present, ready to take our hand, but we have to make the effort to reach out and grasp his, also; God does not force our will. The ego in thinking only of ourselves is the saraph serpent in our lives. If we allow it to bite us, to control our hearts, then, we, too, will die. Before any of us begin to walk down this path, or even if we have taken a few steps in this direction, let's focus on the image and foreshadowing from the remainder of our first reading: "Then the people came to Moses and said, 'We have sinned in complaining against the LORD and you. Pray the LORD to take the serpents from us.' So Moses prayed for the people, and the LORD said to Moses, 'Make a saraph and mount it on a pole, and if any who have been bitten look at it, they will live." The serpent has been our universal symbol of sin and evil since the time of Adam and Eve. This sin, the sin of the ego, thinking that we know better than God, bites us continually during our human existence on earth. But God already had a plan; a plan where "sin" died upon a cross in order to secure salvation for us. Jesus became sin for all and his death on the cross saved us all.

Come to Mass at All Saints every weekend, whether that has been the past reality or not. Come. Come and look at the cross. There is a reason that as Catholics, we don't just lift up the cross. We lift high Jesus on the cross. As Catholics we exalt and shout for joy not by reflecting on an empty cross, but in knowing that God loves us so much, no matter what, that he sacrificed his only begotten Son for us! "Moses accordingly made a bronze serpent and mounted it on a pole, and whenever anyone who had been bitten by a serpent looked at the bronze serpent, he lived." No matter the outcome of the informational and feedback sessions, our focus and sight should be on faithfully serving God. Be a part of our Journey in Faith. Let's sweat, toil and pray as Chosen People of God. Come Holy Spirit!

Metro Catholic Outreach Calling All Volunteers



Can you give a couple of hours once or twice per month to help those with food insecurity right here in our city?

Our volunteer shifts only last about two hours, morning or afternoon, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, or Thursdays.

Our pantry volunteers organize incoming donations, check expiration dates, stock shelves, bag up snacks, toiletries, produce, and pack the food boxes.

Our distribution volunteers add the fresh items to the food boxes on the dock, greet our clients as they arrive to pick up their groceries, and help load the cars.

Our volunteers in the office answer the door and phones, schedule clients for their food pick-ups, assemble and distribute the homeless bags, organize clothing donations and other supplies.

September 14, 2025 • Exaltation of the Cross • John 3:13-17

Living in the Light

John's Gospel talks a lot about light and darkness. In the very first paragraph of his Gospel, John tells us that Jesus is the light of the world. John makes it very clear that we must live in the light, live in Jesus, if we are to have eternal life.

In this reading we hear the famous quote from John 3:16 that we see so often cited by Christian fans at football games: Jesus came, "so that everyone who believes in him may not perish, but may have eternal life." It is important to note that the eternal life Jesus offers us is not just a heavenly kingdom after we die—eternal life means much more.

The life we were born with is limited and finite. We know that every breath we take brings us closer to our physical deaths. The years and gravity take their toll on us, but what Jesus offers us is life outside of time and gravity. It is beyond the wounds and handicaps of our physical world, but it is also very much here and now.

Jesus offers us his life—life with, and in the Triune God in whom we believe. We come to this divine life by fully embracing our human life, just as Jesus did. We accept the limitedness of our humanity with all the pain and joy that entails. We do not suppress our human nature but engage in it fully, always drawn to the light that is Jesus.

We are asked to live each day in the truth of our eternal life so that "...it may be clearly seen that [our] deeds have been done in God" (John 3:21). There is no dichotomy—no spiritual above physical life. Teach your children to value the finite world, especially themselves, body, mind and spirit—one package—loved by God with all its blemishes.

FAMILY RESPONSE


Take turns telling what you like about each other. Talk about each person's physical as well as spiritual qualities.

PERSONAL RESPONSE

It is so important to always tell our children the truth. Their trust in us, and sometimes their trust in others later in life, is dependent on it. How good are you at always telling the truth? What do you want to remember from last week? What are you looking forward to next week? What are your concerns?


