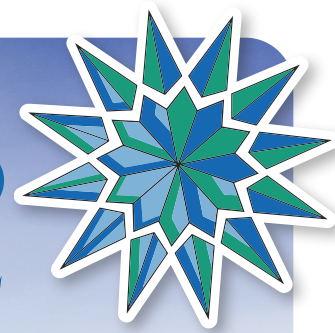

# Everyday Metanoia



My friends in Christ,

Wow - this has been a tumultuous week. Many emotions have colored the days and nights. I am honored that many of you shared those along with your memories of All Saints.

I had to laugh when I read the Gospel for today and laid our current events over the story from Luke, "That very day, the first day of the week, two of Jesus' disciples were going to a village seven miles from Jerusalem called Emmaus, and they were conversing about all the things that had occurred. And it happened that while they were conversing and debating, Jesus himself drew near and walked with them, but their eyes were prevented from recognizing him. He asked them, 'What are you discussing as you walk along?' They stopped, looking downcast. One of them, named Cleopas, said to him in reply, 'Are you the only visitor to Jerusalem who does not know of the things that have taken place there in these days?'"

The irony abounds. First of all, this is the very Gospel passage that was used during our Journey in Faith informational meetings. For this to be the Gospel after the announcement of Pastorates last week feels like we've come full circle. Secondly, like the two disciples of Jesus, this is all consuming for us. As we talk with family, friends and members of the community, there will be some who will have quizzical looks and ask what we are talking about. I'm sure our response could mirror that of Cleopas - what do you mean, you don't know what I'm talking about? Where have you been - camping in the back woods all Fall and Winter?

And just like the two disciples, we will want to inform our listener(s) so that they, too, can be a part of the unfolding story. Not all was clear right after the Resurrection and we, too, may have the feeling that even though we have been a character in the Journey in Faith story, we most likely aren't sure who we are, where we will go and what is all going to happen now that the Pastorates have been announced. There is a lot of information on the Journey in Faith website, but because of its quantity, we may not always get or understand the entirety of it. For that reason, just like Jesus interpreted the Scriptures from Moses to the prophets to the two disciples, All Saints will be sending out bite-sized nuggets of information to the parish daily. Some will come via the bulletin, others from our Constant Contact e-newsletter and a few on Facebook.

And while all of this information may not ease your pain nor cause you to exclaim, "Were our hearts not burning with us?", it is our hope and desire to be transparent, open and honest as we continue the journey. If you have questions or concerns, I am but a phone call, email or hug away.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

This weekend, as we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday, we hear in the Gospel how the risen Jesus comes to His disciples, speaks peace into their fear, and breathes His Spirit upon them. Even in their uncertainty, even behind locked doors, the Lord meets them with mercy—and sends them forth on mission. It is in that same spirit of trust in God's mercy that I write to you today.

Over the past year, our archdiocese has been engaged in the *Journey in Faith* process—a time of prayer, listening, and discernment about how we are called to live the mission of the Church in the years ahead. Thousands of you participated generously, sharing your hopes, concerns, and deep love for your parishes. I am profoundly grateful.

After much prayer and consultation, I have made decisions that will guide the next phase of this journey. The Archdiocese of Dubuque will be organized into 24 pastorates—groups of parishes working together more closely, sharing leadership, ministries, and resources so that we can strengthen our mission and better serve our communities.

Your parish, All Saints, will be in the Cedar Rapids Area East Pastorate.

The parishes of this pastorate will include

- Your parish
- St. John the Baptist Parish, Mount Vernon
- St. Pius X Parish, Cedar Rapids
- St. Ludmila Parish, Cedar Rapids

# Journey in Faith: Parish Announcement (cont.)

Your pastorate will be served by three priests. I have assigned Fr. Kenneth Glaser as pastor. Frs. Polycarp Hagan and Hung Le will serve as parochial vicars. One of your parochial vicars has additional assignments outside of the pastorate.

Weekend Masses will be held at:

- St. John the Baptist Parish, Mount Vernon- one Mass
- St. Pius X Parish, Cedar Rapids- three Masses
- St. Ludmila Parish, Cedar Rapids- two Masses

Tracy Huk, as outgoing PLC and Frs. Awotwe-Mensah and Seda, as outgoing pastors and Fr. Glaser as incoming pastor will work collaboratively to create an interim Mass schedule that will be used July 15 through January 15. As soon as those Mass times have been set, they will be shared with your community.

Churches not used as weekend Mass sites can be used for weekday worship, faith formation, adoration, service to the community, weddings, funerals, and more. Whenever possible, the goal is to ensure these spaces continue to serve the mission of the Church in meaningful ways.

I recognize that this news may bring questions or concerns. Our parish communities are places of deep meaning, filled with memories of faith, family, and sacrifice. Change is not easy. Yet on this Divine Mercy Sunday, we are reminded that God meets us precisely in these moments—with compassion, with understanding, and with grace sufficient for what lies ahead.

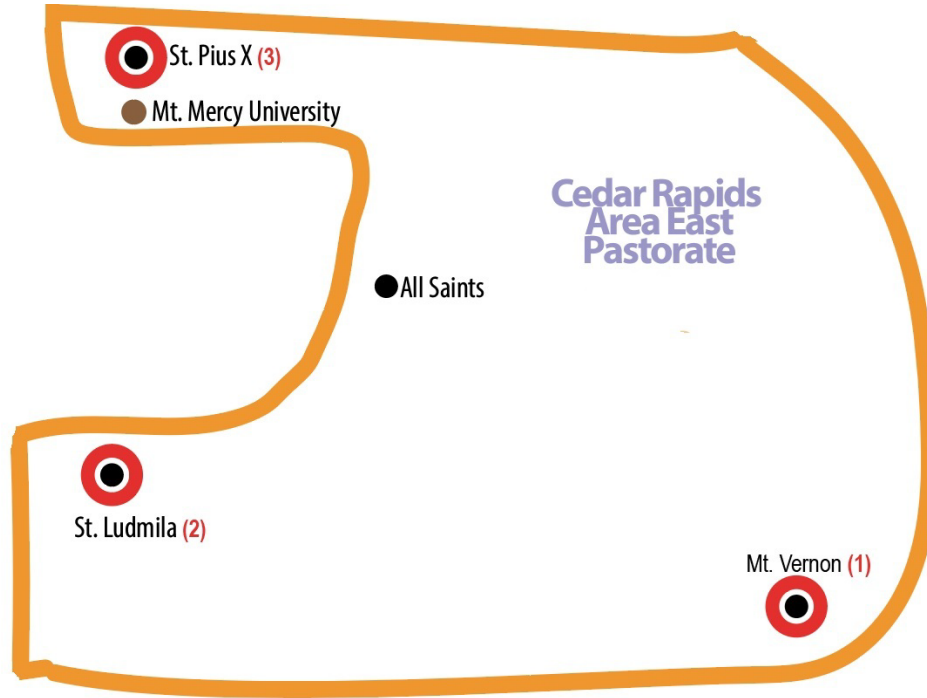

# Family Ministry

April 19, 2026 • 3rd Sunday of Easter • Luke 24:13–35

## Jesus in Our Midst

*The story of disciples who encounter Jesus on their walk to Emmaus is found only in Luke, but it offers us an important insight into what the Eucharist is about. The story takes place three days after Jesus was crucified. Two of his followers are returning home, feeling dejected. Jesus joins them, but they don't recognize him until he sits down with them at table and breaks bread with them.*

The walk to Emmaus is one of my favorite Gospel stories. Two ordinary folks, disciples of Jesus, are walking home. They are sad and discouraged. Everything has gone wrong: All they had hoped for was gone. Jesus joins them, but they don't recognize him. They begin to share what had happened back in Jerusalem and Jesus reminds them of the Scripture readings that foresaw such happenings. During the walk, they do not recognize Jesus. It is at table, in the breaking of the bread, that their eyes are opened.

I think one of the reasons I like this story is that it is such a clear reminder that Christ is in our midst. It is easy to talk about the Jesus we find in Scripture, or the glorified Christ who sits at the right hand of the Father. It is often easier to believe in the miracle worker and King of Kings than to see Christ in the face of a stranger or beggar. It is sometimes even more difficult to see Jesus in the people we walk with every day—the people in our own homes.

Here's my updated replay of the walk to Emmaus. A woman (or man) comes home from work tired and discouraged. After a half hour of breathing space (we all need time to disengage), she sits down and shares her day with her husband or offspring. The listener becomes the storyteller as he shares his day. Each person is gently affirmed. Finally, they all sit down together at table, and as they tear into a pizza they smile at each other as they recognize the look of Christ in the face across from them.

## FAMILY RESPONSE

Ask each family member to name one quality of Jesus they see in each of the other family members.

## PERSONAL RESPONSE

Experts tell us we all need at least 20–30 minutes of quiet time to let go of tensions when we come home from work or school. Do you think this is a good idea for your household? How can you arrange it? What do you want to remember from last week? What are you looking forward to next week? What are your concerns?

## The Gospel at Home

### This Week's Gospel: Luke 24:13-35

This Sunday's Gospel tells the classic story of the presence of the Risen Jesus in the lives of his followers. Two discouraged disciples walk home to Emmaus after Jesus' Death in Jerusalem. A stranger falls in step and helps them see that the Messiah was not to be a triumphant king, but a suffering servant. At supper they recognize the stranger as Jesus in the breaking of the bread. At Mass we listen to the Scripture and we recognize the Risen Christ in the community and in the breaking of the Eucharistic bread.

### Exploring the Gospel Message

**Seeds (Preschool):** The story of the Risen Jesus meeting two followers on the road is full of details your child will remember. Help your child understand that every time you go to Mass you recognize Jesus in the breaking of the bread.

**Promise (Grades K-1):** This week's lesson helped your child understand how Jesus is with us today at Mass—in the Eucharist, in the priest, in the people who come together to celebrate the breaking of the bread, and in the Word of God. Share with your child how important Sunday Mass is to you. Ask your child to show and tell about the happy heart medallion he or she made in class.

**Good News (Grades 2-3):** Your child learned the importance of making loving choices. Ask your child to tell the family the story of Paul and how he changed. In your own words, tell the Gospel story of Jesus and the two disciples at Emmaus and talk about how you all recognize Jesus in the breaking of the bread at Mass every Sunday. Talk about what is meant by the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist.

**Venture (Grades 4-6):** The class focused on the story of Jesus and his disciples on the road to Emmaus, and discussed how we can recognize Jesus in our midst. Allow your child to have an opportunity to tell you about his or her own Emmaus Walk, and to share what was learned about the different characters met along the journey. Ask your young person to tell you about how our faith practices and traditions are similar to the disciples' in the Gospel.

**Visions (Grades 7-9):** When the two disciples in the Gospel story walk with Jesus to Emmaus, they began to understand why Jesus had to suffer. They also recognized Jesus in the breaking of the bread. Make a list of questions each of you would want to ask Jesus if you had the chance to take a long walk with him. Share the questions with one another. Talk, too, about ways you can make Mass a more important part of your life. Your family may want to go to weekday Mass during the Easter season. Talk, too, about Saint Paul's missionary travels from the week's lesson, including the map provided to see where the locations are.

**Awaken (Teens/Adults):** Discover a new level of spiritual growth for parents with *Awaken*, the new adult level of the *Pflaum Gospel Weeklies*, developed to deepen your faith journey alongside your children. Scan the QR code to learn more.



### Pray Together

Each day this week, pray the Lord's Prayer, the Hail Mary, and the Glory Be together. These three prayers weave together many of the great mysteries of the Easter feast.
