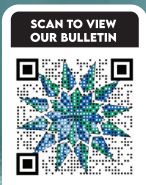

Everyday Metanoia



Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. As we progress through the readings, we begin with Moses talking to the people about how God responded to the Israelites' hunger as they wandered in the desert. Moses points out, "Remember how for forty years now the LORD, your God, has directed all your journeying in the desert, so as to test you by affliction and find out whether or not it was your intention to keep his commandments. He therefore let you be afflicted with hunger, and then fed you with manna, a food unknown to you and your fathers, in order to show you that not by bread alone does one live, but by every word that comes forth from the mouth of the LORD." I want to encourage us to read all of Exodus 16 in connection with our Old Testament reading from Deuteronomy. It ties together so many wonderful connections with our Catholic theology and foreshadows the institution of the Eucharist.

Manna was a gift from God. It was unlike anything they had ever seen before. If we put ourselves into the scene, we can understand their confusion as Moses tried to instruct and guide the people in the word of the LORD. Jump ahead to Jesus talking to the Jewish crowds about the Eucharist, "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world...Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him. Just as the living Father sent me and I have life because of the Father, so also the one who feeds on me will have life because of me. This is the bread that came down from heaven. Unlike your ancestors who ate and still died, whoever eats this bread will live forever." Our Gospel reading from John ends before we get to the pivotal moment of the disciples and the crowds reaction. Finishing John 6 allows us to understand that this was a scandalized and radicalized thought for the crowds, the disciples and the apostles. So much so that "as a result of this, many of his disciples returned to their former way of life and no longer accompanied him." The Catechism of the Catholic Church #1336 speaks to this and also challenges the faithful: "The first announcement of the Eucharist divided the disciples, just as the announcement of the Passion scandalized them: 'This is a hard saying; who can listen to it?' The Eucharist and the Cross are stumbling blocks. It is the same mystery and it never ceases to be an occasion of division. 'Will you also go away?': The Lord's question echoes through the ages, as a loving invitation to discover that only he has 'the words of eternal life' and that to receive in faith the gift of his Eucharist is to receive the Lord himself."

Just like our ancestors, many continue to struggle with this and some continue to walk away. Our Catholic faith, belief and understanding of the Eucharist is the source and summit of our faith life. It is the dividing line between Catholicism and other faith traditions. It is a crucial one to our faith. It is so important that Eucharistic Congresses have been held in the past so that clergy, religious and laity can gather to learn, to pray, to worship and to bear witness to the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. The last National Eucharistic Congress was held in July 2024 in Indianapolis, Indiana. Many great speakers were able to witness to this. The number of people who attended was overwhelming and a testament to our human desire to know, love and worship our LORD.

Walking With Moms In Need



"If a woman with an unexpected or challenging pregnancy turned to you, would you know what help is available? Could a mom struggling to care for her young kids turn to your neighborhood Catholic church and find local assistance?"

This year, All Saints Parish has joined the Walking with Moms in Need outreach program in order to help young families experiencing difficulties.

When someone calls our "hotline" number, they speak to a team member in the Archdiocese, who then contacts a WWMIN volunteer in the parish closest to the person asking for help. The volunteers reach out to the woman in order to understand her needs and refer her to the appropriate resources or agencies.

We provide information as well as a sympathetic and listening heart when needed. Sometimes that is all a person needs to know, that they are not alone in their seemingly desperate situation, that there is help and hope for the future. We also check back to follow up and provide support until the need is resolved.

Even if you are unable to participate at this time, please pray the Walking With Moms Prayer for the women and families we hope to raise up.

The Living Bread

Jesus has just fed thousands of people with a few loaves and fishes. He tells the people waiting for him the next day not to follow him because he was able to provide bread. He tells them not to work for bread that will perish but for the food that will last eternally.

The Eucharist, the Mass, is a memorial of Christ's great sacrifice celebrated at a meal. How can we help our children understand the great blessings of the Mass unless they are familiar with what a celebratory meal is like?

I remember a joke I heard years ago. "How does a suburban mom from Centerville call her kids for dinner?" Answer: "Everybody in the car!" Its truth resonates in so many of our families. I heard a statistic a few years ago that the average family sits down together for only two meals per week with everyone present.

The statistic is not surprising when we consider what busy and complicated lives we live. Extended work hours, long commutes, and a barrage of activities for children make time a precious commodity. And yet spending time together is one of the factors used to judge a strong, healthy family. Another quality is commitment.

One way of showing our commitment to family is by taking the time to have at least one special family meal a week. Make it a celebration. Remember, it is not the food that makes it special (pizza is fine); it is having everyone sitting around the table together.

Try to make a ritual out of such occasions. Light a candle in the center and hold hands for a blessing. Make sure the cell phones are silenced and the television and social media are turned off. Make it a rule that no one leaves the table until everyone is finished. Allow only positive, affirming conversation: no preaching, no scolding. A good conversation starter might be to ask everyone to share what was the best thing that happened to him or her that day (or week).

Time spent around the dinner table is special. Think about all the time Jesus spent in table fellowship with his disciples. He is no less present at our table. All of family mealtime is sacred, as much a blessing as the prayer it began with.
