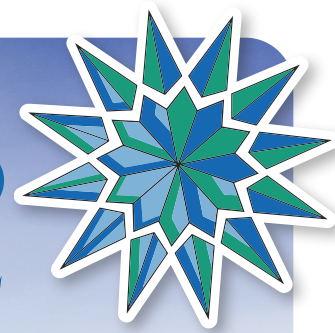
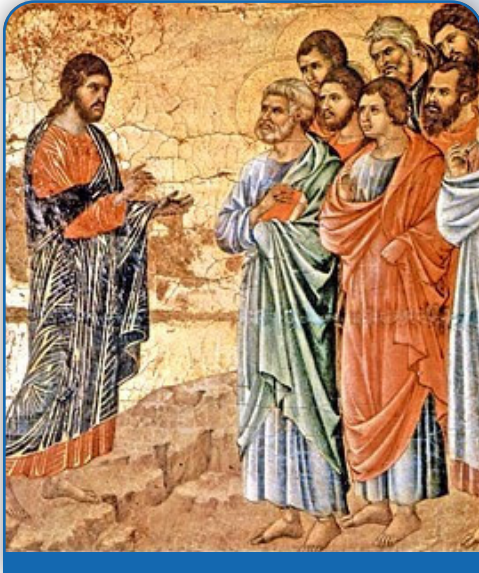

Everyday Metanoia



Welcome to the 12th Sunday in Ordinary Time. Today's readings all focus on persecution in the world and the saving power of God's grace. Matthew 9:35 - 10:42 is titled *The Mission of the Twelve* in the commentary on the Gospel of Matthew by Curtis Mitch and Edward Sri. We started this discourse last week when Jesus gathered the twelve and gave them authority to drive out unclean spirits and to cure disease and illness as they journeyed to other Jewish cities. When we share with others, we share the entirety. So if we share half of a chocolate chip cookie, we can't pick out the chocolate and just share the doughy part. As such, Jesus in sharing his authority, has to warn the disciples of the persecution that will come their way when they exercise the authority he has given. Jesus is sharing a wonderful gift but that gift would not be viewed or received as wonderful by all. It's tempting to try to simplify this with the value labels of good and bad, but we miss the message if we do this. Persecution isn't necessarily "bad" in the eyes of Jesus; rather it is part of the responsibility that goes hand-in-hand with authority. Pope Francis in one of his homilies elaborated on this, "Jesus' dispatch [of the disciples] on mission does not guarantee their success, just as it does not protect them from failure and suffering. They have to take into account both the possibility of rejection and that of persecution. This is somewhat frightening but it is the truth. The disciple is called to conform his life to Christ who was persecuted by men, knew rejection, abandonment and death on the cross. There is no Christian mission marked by tranquility! Difficulties and tribulations are part of the work of evangelization and we are called to find in them the opportunity to test the authenticity of our faith and of our relationship with Jesus. We must consider these difficulties as the opportunity to be even more missionary and to grow in that trust toward God, our Father who does not abandon his children during the storm. Amid the difficulties of Christian witness in the world, we are not forgotten but always assisted by the attentive concern of the Father."

How are we assured of this? In this short Gospel passage, Jesus says "Fear no one" and follows it up with "do not be afraid" two times. Easy to say, but in real life, we cannot do this without God's grace. Take the world around us today. The news, the shows we watch and the social media we read all function on the premise that fear can be used to elicit specific behavior patterns; which can be focused and controlled to heavily influence specific results in the business, economic and political arena. The Gospel of Jesus calls us to challenge this pervasive message and method in our society. Do not be afraid...to stand up for those who have no voice; to challenge the systems that deny human dignity; to live a life counter-cultural to that which is around us; to shine light on oppression; to shout through words and actions the love, forgiveness and power of Jesus which should be the guiding principle in all communities. In his concluding remarks at a recent meeting with Spanish cultural and business leaders, Pope Leo issued this invitation and challenge, "...be new threads for weaving new networks that bring harmony to all areas of life, to weave a renewed society where time is imbued with eternity, culture safeguards memory and fosters dialogue, education promotes the search for truth with a critical spirit, art awakens wonder and generates noble emotions, business recognizes the dignity of the person, and work remains a source of hope,"

In a world that is currently governed by fear, how do we practically meet that fear and rise above it to receive God's grace and to trust in the perfect timing of it? Remember being in school and test time rolled around? How did we conquer our fear of failure? We studied and we came to know a peace and calm through our knowledge and understanding of the material. How well do we know the Bible, the Catechism, the words and lives of the Saints and writings of the Church Fathers? This is just a partial list of areas that we can and should "study." This does not mean that we will not be persecuted in our lifetime, but it does mean that when we do encounter it, we can confidently face it, knowing that we have the words of everlasting life in our back-pocket, our minds, our lips and our hearts. Feeling abandoned? We can be such prickly, stiff-necked, independent people. When is the last time we surrendered control and let God do the heavy lifting? When is the last time that we allowed God to love us; fully and completely, flaws and all? When is the last time that we let go of the desire for an immediate "fix", took our pain, our sins and our sorrow to Jesus in the Sacrament of Reconciliation?

Pope Francis summarized it quite frankly and quite simply: "...if we allow fear to silence us how will the Good News of Jesus Christ ever be heard in the world? If we don't speak, who will? If we don't act, who will? It is not really a matter of talking at people and quoting at length from the Bible. As St Francis of Assisi said, 'Preach the Gospel at all times. When necessary use words.'" Be love this week my brothers and sisters. Be not afraid!

The Gift of Faith

Before the apostles leave to begin ministering in the world, Jesus warns them that there will be people who will hate them and try to hurt them. He tells them to fear no one, and reminds them that God is aware even of a fallen sparrow.

I want my children to share my faith. Not because they will be damned if they don't, but because faith can get them through pretty much anything. When you are certain that God is not just with you but in you and believe you are taking the Spirit in with every breath, you can't help but feel invincible in a healthy, non-destructive sort of way.

I'm not saying you can leap from rooftops or stop a bullet in midair, but with faith in an ever-loving God, it is easier to feel like you can face any obstacle or enemy and know you are going to be okay. Consider the early martyrs who walked into amphitheaters singing hymns, ready for death, or modern martyrs who worked with the poor in developing countries and were shot to death for their efforts.

Understand I am not saying they didn't feel fear when they saw the lions or faced the gunmen. I am saying they could breathe in the Spirit of strength and courage and know that ultimately they would be fine. Death is not the end. They were invincible, and would live forever in God.

Witness this kind of faith to your children. Try this little exercise with them when they are hurt or afraid. Hold their hands and teach them to take in slow, deep breaths. Ask them to picture themselves breathing in God's strong, all-powerful Spirit, breathing in God's strength and courage. Ask them to consider their situation and decide what the worst thing that can happen is. Remind them that no matter how things turn out, God will always be with them; God is always in them.

In this world of escalating fear and uncertainty, you will be teaching them a life skill that will help them cope with whatever the future may bring.

FAMILY RESPONSE

You don't have to be facing a particular hurt or fear to practice praying with every breath. Ask everyone to hold hands, close their eyes, and picture a thick silver fog in front of them. Tell them the fog is the Holy Spirit—the Spirit of strength and courage. Slowly breathe the Spirit in and out. Remind them that Jesus said he would be with us forever. End with an Our Father.

PERSONAL RESPONSE

Try the breathing prayer yourself. Think of something you are worried or concerned about. Write down how you felt before, during, and after the prayer. What do you want to remember from last week? What are you looking forward to next week? What are your concerns?
